#### **KINDERGARTEN**



Yesterday 82 kindergarten students began their learning journey at Greenway Park Public School. The children were extremely settled from the first day and have already established positive routines

and friendships. As soon as Ms Mainwaring feels that the children are ready, they will join our morning line and the rest of school in the playground. In the meantime, we encourage older siblings and friends to stay away from the kindergarten area and allow the children to continue forming friendships with their peers.

## **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

Just a reminder that all students are expected to wear full school uniform to school each day, this includes the wearing of school shoes and a school hat. I would love to see an increase in students wearing full school uniform, however, I can only do this with the full support and backing of our community. Parents are being requested to stand strong and ensure students leave each morning in the correct uniform and not bow to student pressure about expensive runners or wearing colourful attire that does not meet our uniform policy.

#### STUDENT AND FAMILY INFORMATION

The office has requested that parents inform the front office of any changes to contact details which may have occurred over the holiday period. This includes home and mobile numbers. If there have been any changes with family situations including custody arrangements we request that you notify the school as soon as possible. It is imperativel the school is able to contact a carer in an emergency at all times.

## **SCHOOL CAR PARK**

Parents are reminded that the staff car park is not an area to drop off students in the morning or collect students in the afternoon. Our car park has limited space considering the large number of staff we have here at Greenway Park Public School. We are requesting that parents do not drive into the school in the morning or the afternoon. The safety of our students is our number one priority. Parents driving in and out of the car park pose a significant risk to both students and parents using the pedestrian access.

#### **FORMATION OF CLASSES**

Today we were able to form our 2020 permanent classes. Students were very excited as they moved off to meet their new teacher and classmates. As previously mentioned, our teachers have taken maximum time and care when making decisions about student placements. As much information as possible is taken into account to help ensure that students are in the best place for them and their individual needs.

#### **SWIMMING CARNIVAL**



## MEET THE TEACHER EVENING - Tuesday 18th February





## **EARN AND LEARN**

This week we received goods that were obtained from the Woolworths Earn and Learn program. All of the equipment purchased will be accessed by the students in 3-6. The K-2 area will have new equipment and the basketball court has new protective mats.

## **ATTENDANCE**

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Following an absence from school, you must ensure that within 7 days, you provide school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. After 2 days of no attendance you will receive a phone call from the teacher. If your cild is away for more than two days you are required to inform the school.

Attendance is regularly monitored. If your child's attendance falls below 85% then the school is obliged to make contact and discuss ways of assisting regular attendance. Failure to improve means that the Home School Liaison office intervenes and meetings are held

We like to work in partnership with families. If getting your children to school is problematic, let us assist you, just let us know. Students need to be at school if they are well.



### **SCHOOL TIMES**



While teachers are often at school before and after school hours, Students should not be within the school grounds before 8.30am and after 3.00pm (unless participating in an organised event or activity). Often there are many students left at school unsupervised before 8.30 or not picked up until after 3.15pm. We request that parents make contact with the school to inform us if they are running late. Any child that has not been picked up by 3.15 is taken to the office to contact parents or carers.
