THOUGHTS FOR MEMORIAL DAY

THE MEANING OF THE FLAG DRAPED COFFIN

Do you know that at military funerals, the 21 gun salute stands for the sum of the numbers in the year 1776?

Have you ever noticed that the honor guard pays meticulous attention to correctly folding the United States of America Flag *13 times?* You probably thought it was to symbolize the original 13 colonies, but we learn something new every day! The 1st fold is a symbol of life. The 2nd fold is a symbol of the belief in eternal life.

The 3rd fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veterans departing the ranks who gave a portion of their lives for the defense of the country to attain peace throughout the world.





CANDIDATE FORUM INFORMATION Tina Gibson

Candidate Forums and Non-Partisan Elections

Here are a few bylaw reminders for your club for non-partisan elections.

Please review the TFRW Bylaws regarding invitations to candidates to speak at your meetings; Club Presidents, Campaign Activities Chairs and RW clubs.

Clubs cannot endorse a non-Republican candidate or candidate whose political affiliation is not announced in a non-partisan race

Clubs cannot invite non Republican candidates to a candidate forum hosted by the club during an official club meeting.

Clubs must adjourn a general meeting and then start a candidate forum at another time.

TFRW Bylaws

Article IV Section 9: Removal of Local Clubs Publicly endorsing or working for a known candidate of another party in a partisan or nonpartisan race where one or more Republicans are in the race, or endorsing a candidate in a contested Republican Primary, runoff or special election by the club, its President or Campaign Activities Chairman. Exception: other than at a regular club meeting, a club is allowed to be involved in a voter education program or forum that concerns a non-partisan election and the candidate's party affiliation is not announced. If the President or Campaign Activities Chairman violates this policy, it shall fall to the local club to remove her from office. Failure to do so will result in the removal of the club from the Federation.
