
Campus Bell Schedule

Return to Face-to-Face Instruction

- ► We are encouraged by the improved conditions surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic, including the relatively low transmission rate within our community and information provided by the CDC.
- ► We are focusing our efforts on providing an excellent educational experience for students that support their social, emotional, and academic growth.

Face-to-Face Instruction

- Students will attend school in person, five days a week. Classroom teachers will provide in-person learning and will no longer support both face to face and virtual students simultaneously.
- Students will return to campuses for in-person learning to include hands-on activities, small group intervention, station rotations and teacher one-on-one support.
- In addition, we anticipate all extracurricular activities to resume for students.
- We will evaluate students and provide an intervention plan to address learning loss that may have occurred during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Campus counselors will support all students with social and emotional learning.
- Character program "Heart Legacies" to develop positive character traits in all our students.

2021-22 Safety and Wellness Protocols

- Cleaning, Sanitizing and Disinfecting of the campus consistently and routine
- Personal Hygiene -handwashing, hand sanitizing and respiratory etiquette will continue
- ► Face Masks -Optional (i.e. GA36 and TEA School Health Operations Requirements)
- Physical Distancing based on capacity and risk
- ▶ PPE (face shields, masks, desk shields, etc.) available upon request
- ► ESWIPE, Contact Tracing, Isolation/Quarantine, and Rapid Testing



PPE Available for 2021-2022 School Year

- Hand Sanitizer
- Disinfecting Solution, Spray Bottles & Paper Towels
- Disinfecting Wipes Use Gloves or Wash Hands
- Disposable, Personal Masks, Face Shields, Desk Dividers (upon request)
- N95 Masks (Extenuating Circumstances)
- FACE MASKS / PPE ARE OPTIONAL
- ▶ Identify everyone's level of comfort (mask, face shield, desk divider, ...)
- Temperature checks are optional



P.E Wellness Protocols

- ▶ 3 feet physical distance if capacity allows
- Outside P.E classes when weather permits
- Sanitizing station upon entering gym
- ► Sanitize equipment before each P.E class
- Wear mask (optional)
- Bring your own water bottle

Lunch Wellness Protocols

- Students will sanitize hands upon entering the cafeteria.
- Students will seat in cohorts by class.
- ► Area shield will be available.
- ► Tables will be sanitized between grade level lunches.

- Wellness Indicator * (select all that apply)
- Positive for COVID-19
- Positive household member (within last 2-14 days)
- Feeling Ill Suspected COVID-19 symptoms

- Call in an illness absence in Frontline Absence Management System
- You will be contacted within 24 hours with the next step in the process
- · You cannot return to work on-site until clearance is provided




2021-2022 Nurse's Office Procedures

- Isolation Room will be available
- Testing for COVID will be available through Goodside Health Student Telehealth & campus BINAX, as needed

Transportation

- Transportation will be provided for all students that qualify. Bus transportation is provided for students in special education as determined by the ARD committee and eligible general education students who live two or more miles from their school or in areas specifically designated as a Hazardous Route.
- Before picking up students, buses will be sanitized daily before leaving the bus station.
- To improve air circulation, the front and back windows will be opened.
- Hand sanitizer will be available for students to use before boarding and exiting the bus.
- After dropping off students at their designated arrival location, the bus seats/rails will be sanitized.
- Every Friday, the electrostatic sprayer will be used to disinfect the interior of each bus.



Transportation

Ridership will remain at typical district capacity.
Students will be physically distanced as space permits.
If space is limited, two students will be assigned per seat.

To support contact tracing, students will be assigned seats, and a seating chart will be maintained by the bus driver.


Students are always required to remain seated and keep their hands and arms to themselves.

Students should not touch each other or share any items.

Face masks are optional while traveling in a district vehicle. Bus drivers will have extra disposable masks to provide students that request one.

Safety and health measures may be adjusted due to CDC and Local Health Authority updates.

Volunteers



- At principals' discretion, volunteers are permitted on campus as needed for school projects, meetings, and events.
- Volunteers should stay in designated areas and follow all campus protocols.
- The Hall Pass wellness questionnaire will be utilized at time of arrival. Volunteers should not go to a campus if not feeling well.
- All volunteers must complete an online application that includes a background check
