#### **Helping People in Crisis**

As part of St James' outreach into our local and wider community we support a number of locally based UK charities or mission partners. Why? Because we are acutely aware that whilst on the surface our community appears to be thriving (you only have to look at the numbers of new build homes for sale), we have a number of vulnerable and needy people living locally who have specific, basic needs including food, shelter and clothing.

**Fosse Food Bank** Founded in 2013 by local churches working together towards stopping hunger in our local area, the Fosse Food Bank, part of the Trussel Trust, serves the communities of Wellesbourne, Kineton, Bishop's Itchington, Southam and surrounding villages with distribution centres in Kineton and Southam (The Graham Adams Centre).

According to the foodbank, in 2018 208 three-day emergency food supplies were given to folk across our community. The aim is to make sure that as far as possible no one in our local community has to go hungry, but we need your help to make this happen.

Our local food collection point is Tesco's and donations can also be left at St James Church at our Friday morning between 10.30am and midday, which in itself raises money for charities. **Leamington Night Shelter** Founded in 2009, the night shelter is hosted by Radford Road Church in Leamington Spa. The shelter is not just open for the homeless or rough sleepers but for all vulnerable and needy people and those who often feel ignored. From 9pm on Sunday and Wednesday nights a team of volunteers offer warm meals, company and comfortable surroundings to around 30 people of which around ten stay the night. Support is also given in other ways with food parcels, toiletries and socks being provided.

Company and companionship are missing in many lives and the shelter's volunteers provide a friendly, safe and relaxed environment for their clients to be in, with an accepting and non-judgemental attitude. Often clients just want to talk, and the volunteers try and listen as best they can. They try and help in other aspects of their lives where they can, but it is always at the clients' own pace'.

**Carriers of Hope** Since 2009, Carriers of Hope has been dedicated to helping asylum seekers, refugees and Eastern European migrants (primarily Roma people from Romania, living in the Coventry area, who were experiencing extreme poverty and lacking the most basic personal and household facilities.

To date, Carriers has worked with over 1,500 families from over 60 countries.

Relying on donations of domestic items that are in a reusable condition Carriers run a furniture project, collecting items no longer needed by the wider public and passing them onto needy families. Baby Bags are delivered to all expectant mums, Toy Bags are given for children who have no toys and Emergency Packs are provided to people moving into empty properties, containing something to cook on, sleep on, sit on and a range of pots, pans, cutlery, crockery, bedding, etc. Everything is given away.

**Do you eat bread?** If so, I'm now collecting empty bread bags to be recycled. Look out for the recycling logos. They are also on some bagel bags as well!

The following different types of plastic films are also accepted at carrier bag collection points. Breakfast cereal liners, shrink wrap and ring joiners from multipacks, Frozen food bags e.g. frozen veg, chips etc. Magazine and newspaper wrappers, bags for fruit and vegetables and bubble wrap! I'm going to have to find a bigger box so we can put it all in!

#### Straws: UK government to bring in new controls on plastic

In a bid to limit ocean pollution, the UK government will introduce new controls on single use plastic items next year. The measures cover plastic straws, plastic drinks stirrers and plastic cotton buds in England from April 2020. Only plastic drinks stirrers will be totally banned from sale - currently 316 million are used a year.
