Dear Friends in Christ,

This week, our nation celebrates Thanksgiving, a holiday that has its origins in the seventeenth century. It was early autumn in the year 1621 when New England colonists celebrated their first Thanksgiving. The Pilgrims, motivated by a desire for religious freedom, had settled in Plymouth, Massachusetts the previous year. Their first winter in the New World was asked by immense hardship: they did not have enough food, and half of the colonist in the settlement dies from disease. Yet, despite their struggles, they had reason to celebrate: the fall of 1621 yielded a bountiful harvest (cf. Bailey and Kennedy, The American Pageant, p.22).

The first Thanksgiving in New England can be described as an ecumenical event. It was arranged by Governor William Bradford as a way of thanking the Iroquois Native Americans for showing them how to grow corn and to hunt for game (cf. Bailey and Kennedy, The American Pageant, p.23). Unfortunately, as history would show, this good relationship between the Native Americans and the European Americans does not last. But heir initial friendship is a paradigm for mutual cooperation and respect in the human family.

For Masses offered in the United States on Thanksgiving Day, the Gospel selected for Mass is often taken from Chapter 17 of Luke's Gospel, in which Jesus commends the one Samaritan who returns to give thanks to God for being healed of leprosy. One wonders why the other nine did not return to give thanks for their recovery. The Gospel does not tell us their motives. The account does provide powerful examination of conscience though: "Are we thankful for the many blessings that God has given us?"

Like the Pilgrims on that first Thanksgiving in 1621, our nation's celebration this year takes place in the shadow of hardship and tragedy, as the COVID-19 pandemic still casts a pall over the world. But even in this environment, we still have reason to celebrate and give thanks: the living God has blest us with life and faith and love, and we cling to the hope that, one day, His love and peace will reign in the hearts of all.

May God bless you and your loved ones this Thanksgiving!
