

A. Fold apron in half, wrong sides together. Make a crease and press well.



B. Measure 4" from the top of the apron bib. Mark this point with a straight pin (Place pin horizontally.)



C. Keeping the center crease aligned, fold apron down from this pin point. Press well along fold (This will make a center point where the creased lines cross.)





- Since this is a free-standing project, you will want to use the same color thread in top as is in the bobbin. In this example, we are using orange and brown.

We recommend using a fibrous wash-away stabilizer for this project.



With Kimberbell's easy fringe technique, a fuzzy mane of thread encircles the little lion's head. The design comes in both 4x4 and 5x7 sizes with two different expressions. We know you'll love stitching both, and "that's no lion."

C. Change thread to desired color. Stitch the face tack-down stitch.



D. Trim fabric close to the stitch line.



Note: Use the same color thread for the tack-down stitch that you plan to use for the decorative outline stitches. A different color of thread will show through the stitches.



Note: If you are using a pre-cut piece of fabric, skip step C and D.







Lemonade Mug Rug

With fabric and vinyl applique, we've created a lemonade glass that's always half full. Stitch the quilted pennant background in a contrasting color for celebration or blend with the background fabric to emphasize the drink and slice of citrus garnishing the cup, like our cherry cola with lime. You'll find this mouthwatering design delish for an entire mixology of sodas.

Was it a "bicycle built for two" that inspired the proposal to Miss Daisy Bell in 1892? She must have said yes, because the tandem bike has been a symbol of romance for more than one hundred years since. Just like marriage, the technique takes cooperation and practice. Thank goodness machine embroidery isn't that much work! In our tandem design, little lovebirds look sweet perched on the bicycle seat and handles, and we adore the baskets of blossoms with fringe flowers too. Perfect for a picnic tote, you can personalize the design by adding your marriage or anniversary date.




A. Fold denim tote in half **lengthwise**, wrong sides together, aligning handles. Press well along the fold to make a crisp crease marking the center line.



B. Open tote and mark the vertical center with a water-soluble pen. Measure 9" down from the top of the tote. Mark a horizontal line. Label the cross-hairs as line A. **Note:** The second mark will be used for 5 x 7 Tandem Bike Part 1.



C. Fold denim tote in half **lengthwise**, **right sides** together, aligning handles. Press well along the fold to make a crisp crease marking the center line.



D. Open tote and mark the vertical center using a water-soluble pen.
Measure 5" down from the top of the tote.
Mark a horizontal line.
Label the cross-hairs as line B.







Redwork Pincushion

Redwork is the original word for outline embroidery hand sewn with Turkey red thread in the late 1800's, but the name is still used today to describe outline needlework in any color. Choose a snowflake or flower for this petite pincushion, then let your embroidery machine get the stitches just right. Instructions for a simple muslin insert are included. We recommend filling the insert with ground walnut shells to keep the pins and needles sharp.

You'll sew a pinwheel block and piece all the elements together on your sewing machine, then finish with a classic quilt binding for the perfect piped border.



- Measure 6¼" from the bottom of the tea towel
- Mark this point with a straight pin (Place pin horizontally.)



Note: This measurement will center the design in the lower half of tea towel front with just the right amount of spacing to add the 3" checked fabric border.

With three layers of icy sweetness, the pieced popsicle block features crosshatch quilting on the large and medium sizes with optional ribbon loops for hanging. The small size is just right for a pin cushion, coaster, or ornament.





Prepare the Following:

• With **right sides together**, take the background fabric, and iron it in half with the short sides touching
