On the Cover - Gary & Kayla Main's Sunfire Yellow Roadster
"The Presidential Limo" by Gary Main



About the time this newsletter hits the streets, the well traveled Sunfire Yellow '67 roadster on the cover will once again have been elevated to the coveted status of "Presidential Limo". Thus begins another chapter in its interesting (some would say "strange") history since Gary & Kayla Main acquired it about the time it was having its 10th birthday. Like all Corvettes of the time, it was born in St. Louis. It spent its adolescence

somewhere around Oklahoma City, and then somehow migrated to Ankeny, Iowa, where Kayla found it on display at Karl Chevrolet. Gary was off in Wisconsin playing Army at the time. The moment he got back home, still in uniform, he was marched right down to Karl Chevrolet with the title to his beloved '57 BelAir in hand and the deal was done. It had been a long dry spell but, finally, they were once again Corvette owners, their first one having been a '64 roadster that they had sold several years prior to make the down payment on their first house; lots of people have a similar chapter in their own Corvette story.

For the next few years, rain or shine, it became Gary's daily driver. When his job at GM took him to Seattle near the end of '79, he flat-towed the Vette across the country behind his '38 GMC/Meteor Hearse. One can only imagine the CB radio conversations amongst the 18-wheelers as they encountered that strange combination motoring across the snow covered flatlands of Wyoming and over the icy mountain passes in Montana. But, that's another story for another time.

Sometime in late '82 it was taken apart for a frame-up restoration. For the next year or so parts of it were strung all over the house. In the closets, under the beds, behind the furniture...everywhere. Some of them were even kept in the garage!

It was a show car when it emerged from the restoration a year or so later. On the surface, that sounds pretty neat, but in reality it just wasn't nearly as much fun for the next several years as it had once been. This car longed to be on the road but it seldom got out for fear of getting that first rock chip or door ding. Spending its new life all bundled up in the garage under cover was not what Zora had intended.

When that first rock chip or door ding finally did occur, there was probably initial shock, but that memory has long since faded. In the years following it (slowly, at first) again became a "driver" and has enjoyed that mantle ever since. In the well over 80,000 miles since its re-emergence from the garage cocoon, it has been all over the states of the Pacific Northwest. It's been auto-crossed, it has done the School Daze driving school at Pacific Raceways, it has been in more road rallies and cross-country trips and local tours than the owners can count.

Its crowning moment (so far) came during the summer of 2004 when it made the trek from Seattle to Alaska. It went as far west as one can drive in these United States, to the "end of the road" in Homer, AK, then turned around and went north, all the way to the Arctic Circle. Yes, driven across the Arctic Circle! How many other Corvettes can make that claim? Most likely, none.



From there, it headed south for 3,000 miles, back to Seattle via the Yukon Territory and the Alcan Highway. Road rash? Sure, it got a little, but surprisingly little. What it got it wears like a badge of honor. Besides, that's what touch-up paint is for.

Plans for the future? You bet! Chief among them is to make the Alaska trip at least one more time...maybe more...before either this '67 or its owner assumes ambient temperature. Were it possible, both would leave today!

Seattle in September 2006 - Status Report

Our CMCS event is coming together nicely. We still need lots of volunteers to help with the event. Some of the volunteer activities could be one of the stations on the Poker Run passing out playing cards, or selling raffle tickets during the event. There are a lot more volunteers needed, I was only trying to give an example of what the volunteers might do. Please stop and see Judy or me at any of the meetings or e-mail us if you can help. You can also talk to any of the major committee chairs about volunteering directly with them.

One of the ways we pay for the event is with the raffles during the event. During the event we sell raffle tickets. For the major raffle prizes, which will be spread around the room, the participant can put one, or more, raffle tickets in each of the boxes in front of the prize. The winning ticket gets the prize. We also will have lesser raffle prizes that will be grouped together to go to

winning tickets drawn at random. Don & Marcia Hardesty are our raffle chairs this year. We are soliciting the following type of prizes:

Goody Bag Prizes: These tend to be the less expensive give away prizes such as pens, car wash items, key chains etc. Anything of value is always fun to get in a goody bag.

General raffle prizes: If you have a contact with someone you buy from, sell to or just know, ask them for a raffle prize. This could be a free oil change at your favorite dealer. Maybe a car wash bucket full of car care products. Use your imagination, for prizes. Certainly, even things like software can be a valued donation. For cash contributions, we recognize any entity that gives us \$150 as a donation. They will be shown on our bulletin board and all the promotional literature as major donors. If you were there in 2004 you might remember that the coveted raffle prize was a set of 4 Goodyear tires for your Corvette. Good Neighbor Tire & Auto Service, Inc. of Renton has again offered a set of tires. Don't think the prizes you solicit have to be of this cost. Anything, especially car related, is valued. We can always group together small tool kits with something else to make a raffle prize.

This year, we are also soliciting members to develop gift baskets that will be put around the room with the raffle ticket container at each one. The baskets have been very successful and highly sought after at other events. At the last Seattle in September planning meeting, one of the committee chairs showed a nice carrying bag full of hair care products. Some of the other baskets already planned include a Cajun basket (our theme is Mardi Gras this year), an Everything Seattle basket full of Seattle unique products and a Closet Basket, with cedar hangers and other closet items. Get together with a friend and develop your own Wine and Chocolate basket, Gardening basket or again use your imagination. I use the term basket, but it could be a bucket, wheel barrow, or any type of container to hold the prize contents. Whatever seems appropriate for the prize. I have seen people buy another \$50 worth of raffle tickets just to increase their odds of winning that basket they most covet, so this is a great fund raising activity for the event.

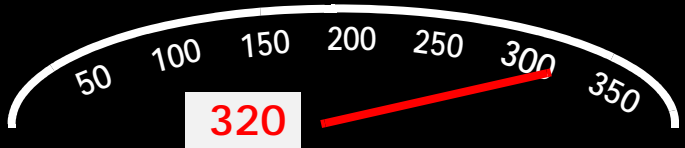

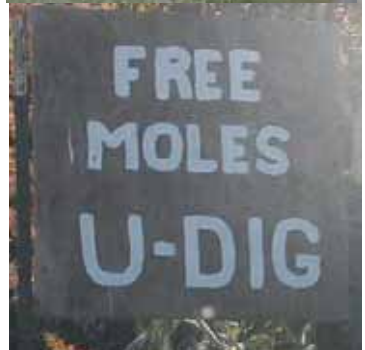

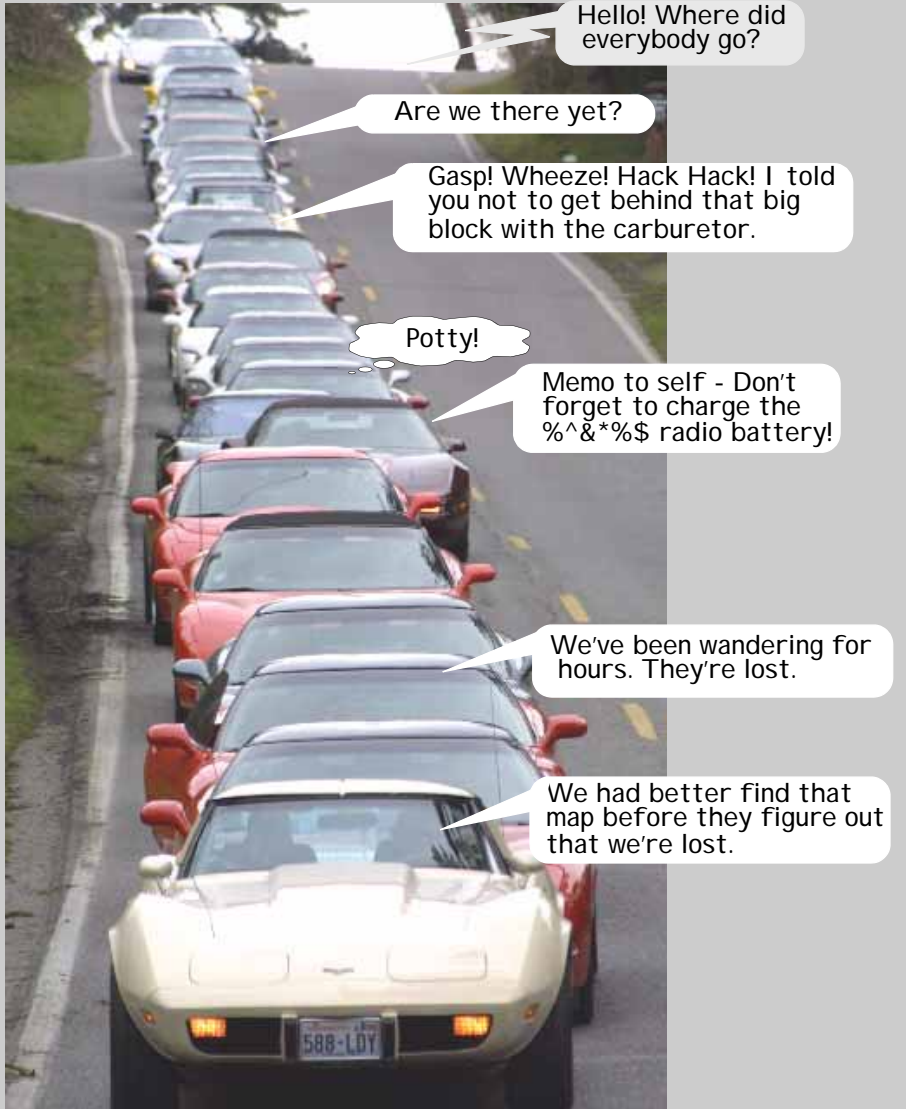

Insurance for PRI is set at \$116.00 + 25%. Mo proposed the 'point system' be dropped, seconded and passed. The "GM" Award will now go to
