### **Active Play Space**

We have just finalised the design for the new outdoor court area between the library and canteen. The layout includes basketball and netball court markings. The surface will be a vibrant blue sports coating. Excavation and concreting will commence in the next couple of weeks. The acrylic surface and installation of basketball towers and netball goals will occur in the new year. We will also upgrade the area with a new 'aquaBUBBLER' drinking fountain.

### **Mobile Phone Policy - Rationale**

The Victorian Government takes the safe and responsible use of digital technologies, student safety and wellbeing, and the development of social skills and positive behaviour, very seriously. On this basis, the Hon. James Merlino MP, Minister for Education, announced that a new mobile phone policy would take effect from Term 1 2020.

Whilst the Victorian Government acknowledges that we live in a technology-rich world where mobile phones are an important communication tool, research has found that mobile phones can be disruptive in classrooms and open to misuse at school. The unregulated presence of mobile phones in classrooms can undermine students' capacity to think, learn, remember, pay attention and regulate emotion.

At recess and lunchtime, opportunities for students to communicate with each other face-to-face or be involved in physical activity are also valued, rather than students being focused on a mobile phone, particularly when they are using it to engage with social media.

This policy will remove a major distraction from our classrooms, so that teachers can teach, and students can learn in a more focused, positive and supported environment.

We look forward to having our 2020 Year 7s on board on Orientation Day on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> December. Please note that this is a normal school day for other students. ### **Exams**

We congratulate our Year 11 and 12 VCE students, who have been completing their end of year examinations over the past fortnight; our Year 10s will be completing final assessments in the coming weeks. This can be a challenging time for students; for families, it can sometimes be difficult to know how to support students through this process. We encourage families to support students in preparing a timetable for revision times, providing quiet spaces where

students can study without interruption and support with managing stress. Students are also encouraged to speak with their teachers for support throughout this time.

### The UpGrade Program

Senior students will shortly be commencing the UpGrade program. Current Year 11 VCE students will commence their 2020 subjects on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> November for a fortnight. Year 10 students will commence their 2020 program (VCE and VCAL) on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> November for one week. Classes will continue as normal for Years 7-9. *It is an expectation that all students attend their full UpGrade program.* 

### 16 Days of Activism

Visitors to the school will notice the symbolic placement of orange and white cut-outs of 52 women near the admin office, symbolising the one woman on average who is killed by a current or former partner each week of each year. CTS is using this representation as part of our work in the field of respectful relationships, with students unpacking activities exploring empathy and positive connections in coming weeks.

### **End of Year Program**

Details will follow shortly for students in Years 7-9 about the End of Year program running in Week 11. Families are also invited to our Final Assembly, which will take place on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> December. We encourage families to save this date in their calendars.


