

Racing Heats Up Again Thursday at Gulfstream

HALLANDALE BEACH, FL — Gulfstream Park kicks off what promises to be an exciting and engaging season of thoroughbred racing Thursday with an eight-race program beginning at 1:15 p.m.

Presenting new stallion Finale April 6, 10 am · 5350 SE Hwy 41, Morriston 32668 Gulfstream's summer season will feature a \$3.775 stakes schedule, including the \$1.4 million Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association Florida Sire Stakes, graded-stakes, 2-year-old races and millions in Florida-bred incentives.

"We like the schedule and the variety of races we will be able to run this summer," Gulfstream General Manager Bill Badgett said. "We have a lot of horsemen the past several years who have decided to keep horses in South Florida because of our year-round schedule. We'll have our usual allotment of 2-year-old races but you will see horsemen ship in more frequently because of our stakes schedule. We're

looking forward to a great summer of racing and events."

Coming off a Championship Meet highlighted by the Pegasus World Cup Championship Invitational Series (Grade 1), Florida Derby (G1), Claiming Crown and Clasico Internacional del Caribe, Gulfstream's summer season will turn its attention to 2-year-olds beginning April 11 with the first race for juvenile fillies and April 12 with the first race for juvenile colts and geldings.

The first stakes races of the summer season will be Saturday, April 20 with the \$75,000 Roar for 3-year-olds and the \$75,000 Game Face for 3-year-old fillies. The \$100,000 Big Drama and \$100,000 Musical Romance in May will be two of the 10 \$100,000 FHBPA races throughout the season with six restricted to Florida-breds.

The Summit of Speed, featuring five stakes including the \$250,000 Princess Rooney (G2) for fillies and mares and the

\$250,00 Smile Sprint (G3) for 3-year-olds, will be run June 29. Along with the Princess Rooney and Smile Sprint, the Summit of Speed will include the \$75,000 Azalea, \$75,000 Carry Back and the \$75,000 Bob Umphrey Turf Sprint.

The popular \$1.4 million FTBOA Florida Sire Stakes begins Aug. 3 with the \$100,000 Desert Vixen and \$100,000 Dr. Fager, both contested at six furlongs. The \$200,000 Affirmed and \$200,000 Susan's Girl will be run Aug. 31 at seven furlongs. The \$400,000 In Reality and My Dear Girl, at a mile-and-one-sixteenth will conclude the series on Sept. 28.

The Sept. 28 finals of the Sire Stakes will also include five \$75,000 stakes races – the Mr. Steele, Armed Forces, Our Dear Peggy, Hollywood Beach and Monroe. The lucrative and popular Sire Stakes have produced Awesome Feather, Smile, Big Drama, Three Ring and Jackson Bend to name a few.

Gulfstream will race live Thursday through Sunday. The fullservice facility will be open seven days a week for simulcasting.

Fawkes Hopes Louder Than Bombs Makes Big Noise In Kentucky Utilities Transylvania

LEXINGTON, KY—On another so-cold-you-can-see-your-breath morning at Keeneland, David Fawkes was holding the shank on one of his runners at the east end of the Keeneland stakes barn.

"I haven't raced here in three years since [Florida-bred] Sheer Drama won the Madison (Grade 1)," Fawkes said Tuesday morning. "The morning after was like this and (jockey) Joe (Bravo) was her hot walker."

Fawkes has returned with two horses, headlined by Sandra New's Louder Than Bombs, who figures to be one of the favorites in Friday's 31st running of the \$150,000 Kentucky Utilities Transylvania (G3) going a mile-and-one-sixteenth on the grass.

"He is a high energy horse and full of life," said Fawkes of the Violence colt, who was purchased at the 2017 Keeneland September Yearling Sale for \$37,000. "We had a choice of the [Cutler Bay] stakes last Saturday at Gulfstream or here. He needs them to back up, and I thought there was a better chance of that here."

Third in the Palm Beach (G3) in his most recent start, Louder Than Bombs figures to stay in Kentucky after Friday's race.

"We have two targets," Fawkes said. "After this race, he will either stay here or go over to Churchill Downs for the American Turf (G2) on Derby Day [May 4]."

Rain is in the forecast for Friday, and Louder Than Bombs might encounter conditions he has not faced.

"I think he needs a little give in the ground and he has never had that," Fawkes said.

Game Winner, Maximum Security Favored in Pool 4 of Derby Future

LOUISVILLE, KY—Garv and Marv West's

champion 2-year-old Game Winner and undefeated Florida Derby (Grade 1) hero Maximum Security are 8-1 co-morning line favorites in Pool 4 of the Kentucky Derby Future Wager which opens on Friday.

The three-day pool will offer win and exacta betting on 23 individual horses and an option to bet all other 3-year-olds not offered within the wagering. Pool 4 betting opens Friday at noon (EDT) and will close Sunday at 6 p.m. This will be the final future wager offered prior to the first Saturday in May.

Trained by Hall of Fame conditioner and five-time Kentucky Derby winning trainer Bob Baffert, Game Winner finished second in a split division of the

March 16 Rebel Stakes (G2) at Oaklawn Park – his first start in more than four months. Game Winner is expected to enter Saturday's Santa Anita Derby (G1) as his last major prep race before the Kentucky

Maximum Security, based in South Florida with trainer Jason Servis, scored a three-and-one-half-length front-running victory in last Saturday's Florida Derby (G1). A bay colt by New Year's Day, Maximum Security debuted for a \$16,000 claiming tag in late December and has won four lifetime starts by a combined 38 lengths.

Overall, Baffert is tied with Pletcher for the most entrants in Pool 4 of the KDFW. Along with Game Winner, Baffert conditions #10 Improbable and #17 Roadster while Pletcher trains #6 Cutting Humor, #15 Outshine, and #19 Spinoff.

Bets can be placed at Churchill Downs

Racetrack, TwinSpires.com and other online wagering outlets and satellite wagering across North centers America. There are no refunds in the future wagers. Should Churchill Downs officials determine during the duration of the three-day pool that one of the wagering interests has experienced an injury, illness or other circumstance that would prevent the horse from participating in the Kentucky Derby, betting on the individual horse will be suspended.

Total handle for Pool 1 of the Kentucky Derby Future Wager on Nov. 22-25 was \$258,389. "All Other 3-Year-Old Colts and Geldings"

closed as the 6-5 favorite with Game Winner at 5-1. The Pool 2 betting on Feb. 8-10 reached \$533,977. Again, "All Other 3-Year-Olds" was the 5-2 favorite with Game Winner at 5-1. Pool 3 betting on March 8-10 yielded \$385,464 - with "All Other 3-Year-Olds" notching favoritism at 9-2 with Game Winner at 6-1.



Florida TB Museum Hosts April Art Show

The Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association Museum and Gallery is hosting an Art in April event. The art-themed month includes a charity art sale, an exhibition by sports artist Debbie Sampson, and a showcase of special pieces from the archives of the museum collection.


The charity sale offers prints by Sampson, Cuban Picasso-style artist Dania Sierra, caricature artist Remi Bellocq and art books by Robert Clark. A portion of the proceeds benefits Florida Thoroughbred Charities which funds the Florida Thoroughbred Retirement Farm at the Lowell Correctional Institute. The program is the only one in the country to partner female inmates with retired thoroughbreds giving the women a chance to learn horsemanship skills while the horses enjoy lifelong care.

The Sampson exhibition features a large-scale painting of famed Floridabred Lost in the Fog. The horse was undefeated in his first 10 starts with a final record of 11 wins in14 races. Bred by Susan Seper, he was raised at Greg and Karen Dodd's Southern Chase Farm in Williston, and he had connections via his dam to Andy and Susie Cant in Williston. He died of lymphoma during his 4-year-old season, having amassed almost \$1 million in earnings. He is buried at Golden Gate Fields next to Silky Sullivan.

Sampson was the Artist-in-Residence at Calder Race Course for a decade, showcasing her work in the Turf Club and later was commissioned to produce large-scale pieces for the tracks top VIP spaces.

In addition, her work was selected for the official poster for the Dressage First Coast FEI Great American/USDF Region 3 Championships and Aventura Festival of the Arts. Additionally, she has painted at the World Equestrian Games in Lexington and has shown at the Museum of Polo and Hall of Fame, the National Museum of Sports Art in Indiana, Adena Springs thoroughbred sales, and at Fine Arts for Ocala.

Sampson's paintings gained national recognition with appearances on *CNN*, *ESPN*, *Fox Miami* and the *Sunshine Network*. Numerous articles covering her accomplishments appeared in *USA Today*, *The Miami Herald*, and the *Fort Lauderdale Sun-Sentinel*. Her sports art

has appeared on covers of major publications such as *The Sports Collectible Digest* and *Dan's Papers*. Her work has been most recently showcased in Las Vegas.

Debbie Sampson said, "My specialty is using paint and color to capture the motion and energy in my sports pieces adding a three dimensional effect. In my horse and pet portraits, I specialize in capturing the personality of my subjects."

The Florida Thoroughbred Museum at 801 SW 60th in Ocala is open week-days at 8:30 a.m. to Noon and 1 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Florida-bred Weekend Recap

Live Oak Plantation Doubles Up on Florida Cup Day

Charlotte Weber hit the double at Tampa Bay Downs Saturday but it had nothing to do with the pari-mutuel windows. Instead, her Florida-homebreds March to the Arch and Global Access took two of the six Florida Cup races during the 17th annual Florida Cup Day produced by Tampa Bay Downs, the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association and the Tampa Bay Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association.

The 2019 Florida Cup offered six stakes for registered Florida-

breds, each worth \$100,000 plus a \$15,000 win bonus from the FTBOA for Florida Sire Stakeseligible runners, making the potential \$690,000 day the richest in the event's history.

It was the second stakes double of the year for Live Oak Plantation after their Souper Tapit won the \$200,000 Sunshine Millions Classic at Gulfstream Park and Win Win Win took the \$125,000 Pasco Stakes at Tampa Bay on Jan. 19. However, this double was perhaps more gratifying for Live Oak Plantation owner Charlotte Weber as Global Access and March to the Arch are half-siblings out of the Black Sam Bellamy (Ire) mare - Daveron (Ger).

"Mrs. Weber has done that a few times with other families in stakes races, but it's a very nice deal to do that with these half-siblings," Live Oak General Manager Bruce Hill told the Tampa Bay Downs media relations staff.

March to the Arch found racing room after leaving the far turn and accelerated to the front to win the \$100,000 Touch Vodka Turf Classic to kick off the program.

The Turf Classic saw a field of six 4-yearolds and older going a mile-and-one-eighth on the Tampa Bay Downs turf.

Trained by Mark Casse, March to the Arch picked up his first added-money victory since winning the \$107,000 Toronto Cup at Woodbine in July of 2018. Since that win, the 4-year-old Florida-bred finished third, fourth and fifth, all against graded company, in the Sept. 1 Saranac (Grade 3) at Saratoga, in the Grade 2 Hill Prince on Oct. 6 at Belmont Park and in the Grade 3 Commonwealth at Churchill Downs on Nov. 10.

But a good ride from jockey Tyler Gaffalione allowed him to fare much better in the Turf Classic.

After breaking from the inside post one, March to the Arch sat in a stalking position along the rail behind early leader and 6-5 favorite Big Changes as they went the first quarter-mile in :24.76 and the half-mile in :48.42.

March to the Arch passed the frontrunners at the top of the stretch before going on to win by three-and-one-quarter lengths over Swagger Jagger in second with a final time of 1:47.66 on the firm turf. Big Changes hung on for third.

Third Time A Charm for X Y Jet in Golden Shaheen

Florida-bred X Y Jet appeared as though he was tired of finishing second in Dubai Saturday when the Florida-bred speedster won the \$2.5 million Dubai Golden Shaheen sponsored by Gulf News (Group 1) at Meydan Race Course.

X Y Jet led the 2016 Golden Shaheen until the final jumps but finished second when he was passed by eventual winner Muarrab. It was almost a replay of that race in last year's Golden Shaheen when Mind Your Biscuits made a late run to pass X Y Jet, again in the final strides.

But he would not be denied in his third trip to the United Arab Emirates.

Trained by Jorge Navarro and ridden by Emisael Jaramillo, XY Jet went right to the lead from **POWERED BY**

post three in the 1,200meter (about six furlongs)

Golden Shaheen. Followed to the outside by longshot Matera Sky and jockey Yutake Take with fellow Florida-bred Imperial Hint and jockey Jose Ortiz behind them in third, X Y Jet led from start to finish to score by a length-and-one-half for owners Rockingham Ranch and Gelfenstein Farm. Matera Sky held on for the place from Imperial Hint in third. Promises Fulfilled was fourth.

The victory was especially pleasant for Navarro, who has nursed X Y Jet throughout a career that has included three knee surgeries.

"I don't know what I'm feeling right now. I guess it will hit me later on," Navarro said. "I do feel a lot of pride in my horse. They knocked him and they forgot he lost twice here by a nose. But he did it today. He won the race and he was the best against the best horses here tonight."

"I'm very happy," Jaramillo said. "For me, this is so special. I'm very excited. I've come back two times and now I've won today, it's very emotional for every-

one with the horse. What a horse he is."

X Y Jet is by Kantharos out of Soldiersingstheblues, by Lost Soldier and was bred in Florida by Didier Plasencia. He has now won 12 of 15 career starts with earnings of \$3,095,513 as he passes Peace Rules to become the tenth all-time richest Florida-bred.

The time for the about six furlongs

was 1:10.75 over the fast track.

He is also a two-time graduate of the Ocala Breeders' Sales having sold for \$30,000 as a short yearling at the 2013 OBS Winter Sale from the consignment of Two Sharp Hats. Two Sharp Hats again consigned him later that year at the OBS August Yearling Sale where trainer Antonio Sano bought him for \$56,000.

Florida-bred Weekend Recap

St. Joe Bay Upsets San Carlos Stakes

Since September of 2014 when St. Joe Bay made his first career start as a 2-year-old when third in a Los Alamitos maiden special weight from the barn of trainer Peter Miller, the 7-year-old Florida-bred has built quite the reputation.

He is said to have been a barn favorite among Miller's staff and holds that same admiration from the crew working with current trainer John Sadler. He is known to produce a solid effort in every startexemplified by his record of seven wins, seven seconds and six thirds from 36 career starts for a career in-the-money percentage of 56%. And he was the first horse Hall of Fame and Triple Crown-winning jockey Victor Espinoza worked when he returned to the saddle for the first time in more than seven months after fracturing vertebra in a morning training accident at Del Mar.

St. Joe Bay scored more points with Espinoza and his fans Saturday when he upset the \$200,702 San Carlos Stakes (Grade 2) at Santa Anita Saturday while winning at odds of 15-1 and giving Espinoza his first trip to the

winners' circle since his comeback.

[St. Joe Bay] was the first horse I worked since my accident," Espinoza said after the San Carlos. "He's changed since that work. The next time I worked him he was so positive. He built up with more weight and he was so happy. I never thought he would win that easy. This is fun and exciting."

Although St. Joe Bay stumbled at the start of the seven furlong San Carlos, he recovered quickly to lead 6-5 favorite Ax Man and the other five San Carlos runners by two lengths when clicking off a firstquarter fraction in a rapid :22.45 and the half-mile in an equally fast in :45.22. He extended his lead to four-and-a-half lengths over a late-running Dr. Door after six furlongs in 1:10.41 before galloping home in 1:24.06 and three-lengths in front.

Dr. Door finished second, a length-andone-quarter ahead of Kanthaka in third.

"I tried to jump in and open up as much as I could and [St. Joe Bay] took it from there," Espinoza continued. "He wanted to come out of there but really his body was not too capable so he bobbled a bit. But by the second stride he picked up nicely and

then I just let him cruise to the lead.

"It feels great to be back in the winner's circle. It's very encouraging to go forward in my career after what happened. This has put me on a different level, mentally as well. I thought I would never be back to ride. It was not easy not riding."

Sadler also said he was happy for Espinoza and St. Joe Bay.

"We're really happy for Victor who's on his comeback," Sadler said. "He's worked hard and it's been tough with the calendar. He was ready to go a month ago and he had to stop, so it's good for him to get back to the winner's circle.

"The horse was second, got beat a head, in this race last year. It's a good distance for him, he got out, got rolling and the rest is history."

St. Joe Bay earned \$120,000 for owners Kosta and Peter Hronis's Hronis Racing LLC and he returned \$33.60 to win, \$14.20 to place and \$7.40 show. His career

bankroll now stands at \$734,515.

St. Joe Bay is by Saint Anddan out of the Honor Glide mare Dream Ride and he was bred in Florida by Bonnie Heath Farm, LLC.

"We're just thrilled for all of the connections, Hronis Racing and Sadler; and especially for [St.] Joe [Bay] at the ripe old age of seven," Bonnie Heath said.



HOW TO GET INTO THE KENTUCKY OAKS STARTING GATE – The Road to the Kentucky Oaks is a 30-race series that awards points to the Top 4 finishers in each race. "He broke alertly and put himself in good position, right behind the speed," said Gaffalione, a 2013 graduate of Sunlake High School in nearby Land O' Lakes. "I was following the favorite [Big Changes], and when it looked like he wasn't really going anywhere, I just tipped [March to the Arch] out and he finished the job.

"He came home very powerfully, and all the credit goes to Mark [Casse] and his team."

The victory was the fifth Florida Cup tally for Casse, who two years ago won the EG Vodka Turf Classic with future Breeders' Cup Mile (Grade 1) winner and Eclipse Award champion turf

horse World Approval, another homebred for Live Oak.

"This is where World Approval got it all going, so those are our hopes and dreams," Casse said. "The Live Oak team does a tremendous job, and we've had this horse at Palm Meadows Training Center getting ready, and my team there, led by Nick Tomlinson, has done a great job with him."

March to the Arch is by Arch and he won for the fourth time in 11 career starts. He earned \$60,000 for the win and now has lifetime earnings of \$259,314.

Sent to the post at the 2-1 second choice, March to the Arch paid \$6.40, \$3.80 and \$2.60.

Global Access Takes DRF Bets Sophomore Turf

The famous red, white and black silks of Live Oak Plantation found the winners' circle for the second time Saturday after Global Access outran seven Florida-bred rivals in the \$100,000 DRF Bets Sophomore Turf.

The Sophomore Turf was for 3-year-old Florida-breds going a mile-and-one-sixteenth on the turf and also featured a \$15,000 win bonus for FSS-eligible runners.

After Global Access broke his maiden going a mile-and-one-sixteenth over Woodbine's Tapeta main track on Oct. 31, trainer Michael Trombetta graduated the son of Giant's Causeway into stakes-company where he finished third in the \$100,000 Display Stakes, again at eight-and-a-half furlongs on Tapeta, on Dec. 8. A subpar eighth in a first-level optional claiming race at Gulfstream Park followed on Jan. 19 before he again finished in the show spot against stakes horses in the \$75,000 Columbia Stakes at one mile at Gulfstream on Mar. 9.

Antonio Gallardo allowed Global Access to settle into fifth-place early in the Sophomore as stablemate Souper Jaguar led through a quarter-mile in :23.67 and the half-mile in :48.02. Max K.O. and Swamp Rat moved up to challenge Souper Jaguar on the far turn as those three fought it out down the stretch. Meanwhile, Global Access began to make a run from farther back and got up just in time for a head victory over Swamp Rat in a time of 1:41.35. Swamp Rat finished a head in front of Jais's Solitude, who was a three-quarters-of-a-length ahead of Max K.O. in fourth.

It was the second win in six starts for Global Access, who

earned \$60,000 to push his career bankroll to \$103,668.

Let go as the 7-2 third choice in the DRF Bets Sophomore, Global Access returned \$9, \$5.60 and \$3.20.

Jackson Leads From Start to Finish to Win OBS Sophomore

Tracy Pinchin's homebred Jackson was able to control the pace while running on a clear lead and won the \$100,000 Ocala Breeders' Sales Sophomore Stakes for 3-year-old Florida-breds going seven furlongs on the grass. Jackson is also a Florida Sire

Stakes alum and therefore earned a \$15,000 FSS win bonus from the FTBOA in addition to his \$60,000 winners' check.

Ridden by Samy Camacho from post two, Jackson went right to the front and led the field of five through fractions of :22.42 for a length-and-one-half lead over Gran Paraiso after the first quarter-mile, :45.16 for the half and six furlongs in 1:09.86. At the top of the stretch, Great Success passed Gran Paraiso but was unable to get to Jackson, who crossed the wire a length in front in a time of 1:23.05. Great Success was second while Gran Paraiso hung on for third.

"[Trainer Jose Pinchin] told me to try to break on top and go to the lead, but if we didn't, to be close and ride my race," Camacho said. "I warmed up really good in the post parade. He broke on top and I said to myself, 'Let me try to go wire to wire.'"

Jackson is by Kantharos out of the Put It Back mare Deposit Only and earned his third

win from eight career starts. His \$75,000 check for the OBS Sophomore increased his career earnings to \$218,475.

Jackson paid \$6.40, \$3.60 and \$2.80.

With Florida-bred world class sprinters X Y Jet and Imperial Hint in Dubai to finish first and third respectively in the \$2.5 million Dubai Golden Shaheen (Group 1) at Meydan Race Course, millionaire Firenze Fire appeared to the one to beat in the six furlong, \$100,000 Zaxby's Sprint for 4-year-olds and older. But Extravagant Kid had other ideas.

The Zaxby's Spint presented a \$100,000 purse and a \$15,000 win bonus for FSS-eligible competitors for the field of six.

Ray'swarrior, who was the 8-5 second choice behind Firenze Fire at 6-5, was fastest from the starting gate and led Extravagant Kid by a length as they clicked off the first two furlongs in a quick :22.39 and the half-mile in :45.04. Meanwhile Firenze Fire and Quijote tracked the top two while racing as a pair down the back-stretch.

Extravagant Kid made his move on the turn and put a half-length on Ray'swarrior at the top of the stretch but the latter would not surrender as those two raced to the finish while pulling away

from the others. Under the wire, Extravagant Kid put a head in front of Ray'swarrior as they finished the six furlongs in 1:09.77.

Extravagant Kid earned the \$60,000 first-place check plus the \$15,000 win bonus for being an FSS-nominee. It was his ninth career win from 32 starts as the 6-year-old son of Kiss the Kid out of Pretty Extravagant, by With Distinction increased his earnings to \$477,739.

He is trained by Brendan Walsh for owner DARRS Inc.

"He is a cool old horse. He was a really smart claim by Mr. Ross around this time last year at Gulfstream, and he's won a stakes [the Lucky Coin] for us at Saratoga and here today," James Bredin, racing manager for DARRS said. "He really knows when and how to win. He's a battler, and every time they get to him, he seems to find a little bit more."

He was bred in Florida by Vicino Racing Stable and paid \$13.60, \$5 and \$3.

Wildwood's Beauty Snaps Streak to Win Stonehedge Farm South Sophomore Fillies

William Stiritz's Wildwood's Beauty has been close in her last three races, but just couldn't break though to get her second career win. Since winning in her first lifetime start at Gulfstream Park West Nov. 10 against special weight maidens, the 3-year-old daughter of Kantharos out of Miss Propitious, by J P's Gusto has finished second three times against first level optional claimers, all at six furlongs at Gulfstream Park.

Twice she was just a head short including a loss to winner Just Aint Right on Jan. 16 and again on Mar. 7 while losing to winner Starship Nala, in her race just prior to the Florida Cup.

But the bridesmaid streak came to an end when the dark bay or brown filly won the \$100,000 Stonehedge Farm South Sophomore Fillies by a widening three-and-one-half lengths over seven rivals for trainer Scott Becker.

Breaking from post four with jockey Chris Landeros, Wildwood's Beauty ran to the inside of 9-5 favorite Eyeinthesky during the initial stages of the six furlong dash as they clicked off a first quarter-mile in :23.10 with longshot Scowling Ridge just to their outside.

Around the far turn, Eyeinthesky put a length lead Scowling Ridge to her outside with Wildwood's Beauty another half-length back on the rail in third.

However, as they turned for home, Landeros took Wildwood's Beauty to the outside where she quickly took over after completing four furlongs in :46.16.

Wildwood's Beauty drew clear from Eyeinthesky and raced under the wire three-and-one-half lengths ahead of Eyeinthesky, who held off a late run by Here Comes Jackie in third. The final time 1:24 flat

"I gave her a little breather from about the three-eighths-mile pole to the quarter pole, just to get her to relax," Landeros said. "She was all professional for me today and kept on when I asked her. I just tried to stay patient."

Wildwood's Beauty picked up the \$60,000 first-place prize in the Sophomore Fillies plus an additional \$15,000 in win only bonus money as an FSS runner. That pushed her career record to two wins in five starts with earnings of \$134,340.

Bred in Florida by Phil and Karen Matthews, Miss Propitious

returned \$7.60, \$3.20 and \$2.80.

She is also a graduate of OBS as Stiritz purchased her for \$47,000 out of the Summerfield consignment at the 2017 October Sale.

Sweet Streak Stays Alive for Crown and Sugar in Pleasant Acres Stallions Distaff Turf

Crown and Sugar continued her winning ways as the 4-year-old filly won her fifth consecutive race and the seventh in her last eight starts by taking the Pleasant Acres Stallions Distaff Turf. The Distaff turf saw nine fillies and mares going a mile-and-one-sixteenth on the turf.

Ridden by Antonio Gallardo for trainer Darien Rodriguez, who also owns the filly under his Sabal Racing Stable banner, Crown and Sugar went to the post as the 7-5 favorite and she did not disappoint her supporters with an apparent easy win.

Racing past the grandstand for the first time, Crown and Sugar sat in a comfortable position in fourth, about five lengths off of early leader Picara, who had daylight on longshots Royal Jewelry and Southern Sis racing in second and third respectively.

After a two furlong split in a comfortable :23.31, Picara and Royal Jewel raced together down the backstretch about two lengths clear of Southern Sis and Crown and Sugar as they went the first half-mile in :47.50. As they made their way around the second turn, Gallardo let out a notch on Crown and Sugar and she began to advance while racing three-wide.

By the time they hit the stretch, Crown and Sugar was drawing away and had a four-length lead on Picara after three-quarters in 1:11.22. Bitacora was also putting in a rally from far back but never got close to Crown and Sugar, who galloped under the wire two-and-three-quarter lengths in front of Bitacora in second with a final time of 1:41.32.

Supercommittee also made a late run to get third over Treasure of Gold in fourth.

"I was behind two horses, and I saw Joe Bravo [on pace-setter Picara] start asking his horse a little and not really going anywhere," Gallardo said. "She wanted to go and she was dragging me to the lead, so I thought, if they catch me, my bad, but she kept running and running and I knew nobody could beat me."

"She's been running mostly in claiming and starter allowance races, and I didn't know if she could handle this kind of company," Rodriguez said.

"It was a big step up for her, but she seems to keep getting better. It means a lot because I also own her [under his Sabal Racing Stable banner], and she's been fun from Day 1."

Crown and Sugar is by Crown of Thorns out of Sugarlick, by Congrats and she was bred in Florida by Woodford Thoroughbreds. It was career victory number 11 from 23 starts for Crown and Sugar who increased her earnings to \$217,237 with the \$60,000 winner's check.

Crown and Sugar may have taken the award as the best investment purchased at auction on the day as Carl Hess Jr. took her for \$1,500 out of the Woodford consignment in the 2016 OBS August Yearling Sale.

She returned \$4.80, \$3.20 and \$2.40.

The Florida Cup Day also proved popular with racing fans with a total handle of \$6,853,237 on the 12 race card, a 6.7 percent increase over the Florida Cup Day wagering last year.
