STAR-D Summary

Level 1: Citalopram ~30% in remission Level 2: Switch or Augmentation ~50% in remission Level 3: Switch or Augmentation ~60% in remission Level 4: Stop meds and start new ~70% in remission



Impact

- 2 Integrated Care Fellows
- 1 Accepted for 2017–2018 Fellowship Program
- 39 Faculty contributing to Fellowship Program
- 1161 Attendees for 39 UW PACC Sessions
- 45 Cases presented at UW PACC by 30 providers
- 99 Community-Based Psychiatrists received training
- 11 Psychiatry Fellows received training (6 Psychosomatic and 5 Addictions)
- 20 UW Psychiatry Residents received training
- 2 Implementation sites
- 7 staff trained at Multicare Clinic in Eatonville; 20 patients supported in this clinic by one of our Fellows
- 20 staff trained at Providence in Spokane
- 26 PCPs/others trained on bipolar disorder, Suboxone treatment, and collaborative care
