Ashtabula Co. 4-H Program Reminders

Interested in becoming a Volunteer or starting a new 4-H Club?

We need you!

Ashtabula County is currently in need of GREAT NEW 4-H Clubs and Volunteers! All Ashtabula County 4-H Clubs must be chartered annually by March 1st in order to use the 4-H Name and Emblem.

Charter criteria includes:

- * ALL adult volunteers are approved through the Ohio 4-H Volunteer Selection Process prior to March 1st.
- * At least 5 youth members from 3 different families are enrolled.
- * A current constitution approved by Ashtabula County, Ohio 4-H is on file.
- * Elected club officers under the guidance of volunteers.
- * A club name approved by the Ashtabula County Extension Educator.

All 4-H clubs are expected to provide a welcoming and safe environment for members, learning experiences for club members, and follow all national, state and county 4-H policies and procedures for use of the 4-H name and emblem and fundraising.

Thinking of becoming a 4-H Volunteer??

Do you have a passion about welding, gardening, archery, computer programming, animals? All Adults who desire to volunteer their time, energy and talents to Ohio State University Extension with the potential to serve minors, elderly, and/or disabled must complete a volunteer selection process. A young adult no longer eligible for 4-H must wait one year from the time they age out of 4-H until they may apply to be a 4-H volunteer. Volunteer applications must be fully complete including references with valid addresses and signed Standards of Behavior and submitted to the Ashtabula County Extension Office. It is the applicant's responsibility to provide references, schedule an interview with the 4-H Educator, complete the BCI check and attend New Advisor Orientation prior to MARCH 1st.

Those interested in fall training should submit an application to the Extension Office before December 1st.
