Capital: Port of Spain, Trinidad

<u>Location</u>: Trinidad and Tobago are the most southern islands in the Caribbean, located a mere seven miles off Venezuela's north eastern coast. The islands are a 3 hour and 19 minute flight from Miami, 4 1/2 hours from New York and 58 minutes from Caracas.

<u>Climate & Weather:</u> Trinidad and Tobago has a warm, sunny climate year round. The average daytime temperature is about 28 degrees Celsius.

Our islands have two main seasons, the Dry Season, from January to May and the Rainy Season, from June to December.



Population: Trinidad and Tobago's population stands at 1,297,944.

People of African and Indian descent comprise the majority of the population, with people of mixed race, European, Chinese and Middle Eastern ancestry adding diversity to our ethnic mix.

<u>Currency</u>: The local currency is the Trinidad and Tobago dollar.


US dollars are widely accepted at an approximate rate of TT \$6 to US \$1

Traveler's cheques and international credit cards are accepted at most hotels, restaurants and malls. ATM machines are located at the airport, banks, malls, cities and towns.

Area: Trinidad is approximately 185 square miles (4,800 sq km) and Tobago 116 square miles (300 sq km)
