Cooper's Crossing Residents' Association

Thank you to all of the residents who attended our 2nd Annual General Meeting. And a special thank you to Greg Fair and the team at Save On Foods for hosting our AGM on May 26, 2018.

For those new to our community or who were unable to attend, when you become part of this community, you automatically belong to the Cooper's Crossing Residents' Association (CCRA). Examples of CCRA led initiatives include this newsletter, enhanced park maintenance and flowers, community garage sale, Trails of Light, Deck the Drive, and Christmas lights (at main Cooper's Crossing entry and Discovery Park).

There are architectural controls and restrictive covenants on all homes in Coopers. This is a condition set by the developer - Westmark Holdings. Once a house is built and passes an architectural inspection, architectural controls are removed. At this time, a resident may change the color of their home.

Due to a restrictive covenant registered on title for all properties in Coopers however, the restrictions for fences and sheds are NOT removed. If a resident has a shed or fence that is not in compliance with the restrictive covenant on their home's title, they will receive a notification from WestMark Hold-

ings. These are generally sent out in the spring and fall and are sent out until such time as the homeowner is in compliance.

The City is responsible for road, alley and park maintenance (except for new parks which have yet to be turned over to the City), as well as snow removal on pathways and roadways. The City is also responsible for the sound fencing surrounding the community.


The Streets in Our Community

Many concerns have been raised by residents in Cooper's Crossing regarding road safety. Like many communities, Cooper's Crossing is very family oriented, with heavy pedestrian and bicycle traffic. Many of our children walk or bike to school, to playgrounds or to neighbors' homes to play with their friends. Together we all can make a difference in our community by remembering the following (as noted in Alberta Transportation's Drivers Guide and City of Airdrie Bylaw No. 8-14/2016):


 Park a minimum distance of 5 m (16 ft) on either side of a fire hydrant. Every second counts when a home is on fire and restricting access to a fire hydrant can change a neighbor's life forever.

- Park a minimum distance of 5 m (16 ft) from a stop sign or a marked crosswalk. Keeping an open line of vision for drivers approaching an intersection or marked crosswalk is critical and even more so near schools and playgrounds/parks.
- Park a minimum distance of 5 m (16 feet) of the edge of an intersecting roadway, except where there is an indication that parking is permitted.
- Practice street sense with our children, both for walking and crossing

- the street, and for biking. By teaching them proper rules and safety for when they are outside of the home, we are giving them the tools they need when walking, biking and playing outside.
- 5. Do not exceed the speed limit of 30 km/h. The City of Airdrie set these speed limits in the residential areas to keep our streets as safe as possible for residents. And as we all know, the slower a vehicle is moving, the shorter the distance it requires to stop (pending road conditions).



Cooper's Crossing Real Estate



As we are well into Q3 of 2018, let's have a look at how Airdrie and, more specifically, Cooper's Crossing performed in Q2.

Comparing inventory in Q2 2018 vs. Q2 2017 for all of Airdrie, listing inventory increased slightly by just over 3%, while overall sales decreased by 12.5%. Total sales in Q2 this year

came in at 358 sales vs. 409 sales during the same period in 2017. Of the 358 sales this year, 243 were detached homes, 91 were attached homes and 24 were apartments.

In Coopers Crossing, 10 detached homes were sold in Q2 2018 vs. 22 sold in Q2 2017, showing a 55% decrease in sales while the average sale price slipped by roughly 5%. Average Days on Market also increased from 39 in 2017 to 144 days this year. Only 2 attached homes were sold in Q2 2018 vs. 9 sold in Q2 2017, showing nearly an 80% decrease while the average sale price increased by roughly 5%. In 2017, 5 of the 9 units sold were builders' spec homes, which is why we saw a large decrease in units sold

when comparing 2017 to 2018. The average Days on Market went from 96 days in 2017 to 168 days this year.

As we review the sales data, we can see that we are experiencing a slow market with just over 5 months of inventory in all sectors. But, like always, we will continue to ride the up and down cycles of the Alberta economy and make it out on top in the end.

Did You Know?

When properly maintained, aggregate concrete is a durable building material that can last for years. As with other building materials, care must be taken with its use and maintenance is required.

- New driveways need to be re-sealed after the first year, and at least every two years after to maintain them. This will depend on traffic and should be done once the sealant fades.
- Remove leaves promptly as some foliage can stain concrete.
- Do not use acid to remove stains or to clean concrete. Use a stiff broom and concrete cleaner if necessary.
- Keep fertilizers away from your driveway.
- Keep rain and snow run-off, and excessive hose water, away from concrete as the soil below or beside the driveway can become destabilized.

Blue (Recycling) and Green (Organic Waste) Bins

Here in Airdrie, we experience a significant amount of wind year round. As summer comes to a close and fall sets in, it is important to remember that the weather impacts our neighbourhood significantly. Items such as lightweight recyclables and dried plant materials can be carried by the wind into neighbours' yards and onto the road ways, causing potential issues for traffic and an unsightly mess in our neighborhoods. It is important to ensure that your blue and green bins are stored in a secure location, and that the lids are securely closed, especially when they are set out at the curb for bin pick up.

REMINDER: Change in organics waste schedule commencing November 1, 2018

A reminder that commencing November 1st, organics waste will change from a weekly pick-up to a biweekly pickup. For the remainder of 2018, organics waste will be picked up by the city on November 12 and 26 and on December 10 and 24 (2019 schedule will be posted by the City of Airdrie once it has been determined). Letters from WestMark to Residents

In August, residents, whose fencing is not in compliance with the caveats registered on homes in Cooper's Crossing, received letters from WestMark Holdings Ltd. Below is further information on the stain required for those with wood screen fences.

WOOD FENCE STAIN COLOUR

All wood screen fencing facing public streets or parks must be stained the colour "Beachwood" by Cloverdale. The exterior SOLID STAIN is available at Cloverdale Paints in Airdrie (Sharkskin-Solid Stain (product #7240101)/colour EX202, with a 30% discount offered to AMA members) or at Airdrie Paint & Décor (Arborcoat-Solid Stain/Colour EX202 on file in their system under "Cooper's Crossing").
