



Identifying Interests and Motivations

Introduction

Potential goal setting areas - farm and family - are identified by the interests and motivations of individual team members. When they have been clearly identified the team can begin the process of developing goal statements.

Performance Objectives

Upon completing the material in this module you will be able to:

- identify your interests and motivations in farming and family life;
- identify the management team's interests and motivations in farming and family life, and
- identify potential goal setting areas for the management team.


Why Identify Interests and Motivations?

People are most willing to invest themselves and their available resources toward goals they find interesting and motivating. An understanding of the interests and motivations of all team members provides a framework for goal development.

There is no purpose in setting goals if team members have no desire to work toward them. People work effectively only toward goals that are interesting, motivating and satisfying.

For example, you may enjoy working with livestock and are interested in the activities necessary to pursue a goal to establish a 100 head cow-calf operation.

It is important to know if your partner has the same enthusiasm as you do. Suppose that your partner is not the least bit interested in having cattle on the farm. This reality should reflect on your goal setting.



To identify potential goal setting areas the team will:

- Respond to an Individual Interest and Motivation Questionnaire. This is completed in isolation from other team members to ensure that the responses are not influenced by others and that they honestly reflect your own motivations and interests.
- Use a Management Team Questionnaire to collect and combine the responses from the Individual Questionnaires.
- Discuss responses to the Individual Questionnaire. This allows open and honest communication of the similarities and differences in personal interests and sources of motivation and satisfaction of team members.
- Decide if any of the responses to the Questionnaire indicate potential goal setting areas for the team to use when developing goal statements.

Individual Interests and Motivations

Individuals are most willing to invest themselves and their resources toward attaining goals they find interesting and motivating. Therefore, it makes good goal sense to consider the interests and motivations of individual team members when identifying goal setting areas.

Team members will individually respond to a questionnaire. The questionnaire provides each person an opportunity to identify his/her own unique and distinctive interests and motivations.

Later in this module, the individual responses by team members will be combined and examined to identify potential goal setting areas.

Activity

Team members will individually and in isolation of one another respond to the Individual Interest and Motivation Questionnaire.

Two copies of the Individual Questionnaire - one for each team member (pages 21 to 28) are found at the end of this module.

Instructions for completion of the Individual Interest and Motivation Questionnaire

- 1. Work alone, in isolation of other team members.
- 2. Focus on one statement at a time.
- 3. Respond to the statements without agonizing over responses most often the first response is the most accurate.
- 4. Be honest with yourself. Respond to the statements in terms of yourself not as you think or as you want others to see you.
- 5. Circle the answer that most closely describes your response to each statement.

Identifying Goal Setting Areas

Awareness of the interests and motivations of individual team members provides an opportunity to identify goal setting areas for developing goal statements.

The Management Team Questionnaire is used to record all the individual responses to the 52 Questionnaire statements. This allows the team to identify the similarities or differences in personal interests and sources of motivation and satisfaction among members.

Discussion questions encourage team members to explain their responses and to be aware of the responses of other members. Such mutual sharing is valuable because individuals can learn more about their interests and the interests of other team members. Often people do not communicate their interests and motivations and assumptions and misconceptions develop. This happens even among people who think they communicate well!

After discussing responses to a Questionnaire statement, the team can conclude if a goal setting area can be identified.

This discussion requires use of the 4 C's and the Communication "Do" List:


The 4 C's

Co-operation -	with each member of the team
Commitment -	to the development of the team goals and to the management team
Caring -	about the task of goal development and for the team members
Communication -	with the members in a positive manner

Communication "Do" List

- Take time to communicate
- Foster a relaxed atmosphere to communicate
- Walk in another's shoes. Try to understand the other person's point of view as if you are that person
- Listen with full attention
- Be clear when giving a message and ask for clarification if a message is unclear
- Avoid interrupting the speaker
- Keep to the topic
- Respect the individuality of the other person, and
- Speak with the pronoun "I' whenever possible.

Let's see how some teams have completed the Management Team Questionnaire.

Rita: "I disagree with this statement, because I enjoyed nursing and would like to nurse again."

Dave: "I agree with the statement. I enjoy the independence and challenges of my career."

Dave (to Rita): "I'm surprised. I thought you considered yourself a farmer. You've always been so involved in the farm since we got married."

Rita (to Dave): "I am involved and I like it that way. It's just that farming is your best occupation. I was a nurse before we got married and I really enjoyed that work too. I would like to go back to school someday."

Their responses to the Conclusion Statements are:

This suggests a goal setting area to be considered.



The goal setting area to be considered is: *Rita would like to update her nursing and re-enter the work force.*

The interaction between Hazel and George following the Discussion Questions is:

George: "This is just the way it is - when farm work is pressing, family responsibilities take a back seat."

Hazel: "For me, I disagree with this statement. The family responsibilities do not get forgotten during busy times."

George (to Hazel): "I know you get the extra burden of more family responsibilities when the workload is heavy."

Hazel (to George): "At least you appreciate the fact. It works out well for all of us - neither the work or the family responsibilities get neglected."





- 2. Use symbols to differentiate team members on the Questionnaire. In the Response Key place the name of each team member opposite a symbol.

What are the team's reactions to the responses?

Now is an excellent opportunity to discuss reactions to the responses. Use the 4 C's and the Communication "Do" List as the individual similarities and differences to responses are discussed.

The discussion resulting from Diane and John's responses to the Discussion Questions is:

Why did Diane (O) respond the way she did?

Diane: "I like being on the farm because it's an opportunity for the family to work together."

Why did John (Δ) respond the way he did?

John: "Yes - it means a lot to me too."

What are the team's reactions to the responses?

Diane (to John): "I know the kids are young but it's really important to me that we all work together. There's a lot they can learn."

John (to Diane): "They sure like the cattle and driving around in the truck. That's how I got started - I was always with my Mom and Dad."

6. Respond to the Conclusion Statements.


