Member Art Exhibition at Com

An exhibition of the paintings, drawings and prints of artist and member Sherry Deems will be on display at Congregation of Moses this month. A couple of examples of her work are shown here and Sherry offers the following Artists' Statement.

"I only like work that surprises me and I only keep work that I like."

This sums up my attitude to the work in this exhibit. It represents work created over the last 40 years or so that I have chosen to keep and see every day.

My work has primarily been about my response to the natural world, whether it is a drawing that is recognizable or an abstract response to a feeling generated in response to the environment.

I have chosen to also show a few works that are more traditional, both portraits and interior room views. These works are on loan and not part of my permanent collection.

I have taught at Virginia Commonwealth University, The Hand Workshop of Richmond and Savannah College of Art and Design. Currently, I am a part-time faculty member at Kalamazoo Valley Community College. In addition to teaching, I have been a guest lecturer, juror and visiting artist throughout the southeastern United States.

I have exhibited both nationally and internationally, including Eastern Europe, England, Brussels, India and Australia. My work was selected for the prestigious U.S. State Department's Art in Embassies Program.

My commitment to art and arts education have been recognized nationally. I am listed in Who's Who in America, Who's Who in American Art and Who's Who in The World, among others.



The Ethical Life: Jewish Values in an Age of Choice

From political and financial scandals to rapid progress in biomedical science and technology, the complex issues of modern society are, at their core, issues of ethical and moral concern.

Now more than ever, we require a solid understanding of how Jewish ethics can inform our discussions and decisions about the critical questions of the day. Judaism has a long history of wrestling with moral questions, responding to them in a way that considers all sides of an issue.

The Ethical Life: Jewish Values in an Age of Choice from the Jewish Theological Seminary will be presented by Rabbi Spivak throughout the coming year. The first three segments are scheduled as follows. Signup information is coming.

Kindergarten Learning Fun

This summer I got a phone call from a kindergarten parent who offered to help with crafts and dance in the kindergarten class. I value parent and congregational involvement in our school and worked with the Joint Religious School Committee to develop a formal role

for this volunteer. Mariana Levin was offered the newly developed volunteer position of Room Parent for the Kindergarten class.

In her day job, Mari teaches math teachers and has a deep understanding of teaching methods and lesson planning. I observed that she was very organized and visiting her home I saw how she and her husband, Aaron, managed to keep their two small children involved in activities that were both fun and educational even while they entertained me and Alex Goldenberg, our kindergarten teacher. The logistics involved were truly impressive. All of this skill was being offered to our school as a gift.

As I look back on what Mari has given to the Kindergarten class during the fall semester, I am truly amazed. Mari came up with ideas for more than a dozen projects, gathered and prepped the supplies and led the children in each activity. Every Sunday she comes with her own two children, Akiva and Juliana, carrying bags of activities she has prepared. She guides our little ones through a routine of crafts and dance that begins their day. Here is a bit of what she has prepared for our smallest children and what they have created.

When we introduced the letter Kaf, Mari led the children in making their own kippot. On Rosh Hashanah, Mari and the children made holiday cards. For Sukkot, Mari and the children painted gourds and made lulavs and etrogs. On Simchat Torah, they made flags for their march through the synagogue with the Torahs. When the children were introduced to the letter Hey, Mari showed the children how to make braided Havdalah candles. When they learned the letter Chet, they braided Play Doh challah. One day Mari brought an amazing art box and the children colored tzedakah boxes. As we prepared for Hanukkah, Mari brought clay and the children made hanukkiot which were baked in the oven. They made Hanukkah cards and for our Hanukkah celebration, Mari brought felt for the children to make felt Menorahs and baked sugar cookies for each child in the school to decorate and




HADASSAH FIRST TO USE NEW TUMOR DIAGNOSTIC TEST

The Hadassah Medical Organization's Department of Molecular Pathology and Diagnostic Tumors department is the first in the Middle East—and just the third outside of the United States—to conduct the new tumor diagnostic test Foundation-One-CDx (F1CDx) within its own laboratories.

F1CDx detects and identifies genetic changes in cancerous tumors. Looking at 324 genes within a single sample of a patient's tissue, the test identifies substitutions, insertions, mutations and alterations. As a result, the new test will guide decisions regarding immunotherapy protocols and expand options for targeted personalized therapies. This is a big step towards improving growth in "personalized medicine." Read more about this and other Israeli innovations at **nocamels.com**.
