## The "In Between" Time

My greatest frustration with surgery was (and still is) the recovery time. "Recovery time" is "in-between-time" - the time between a major event and being able to return to life as normal. The problem with such thinking, though, is the concept of "normal." Perhaps the reason "in-between-time" is so frustrating is because we are developing a new framework for how we will understand and operate in a "new normal." I can't return to life like it was: I can't undo what's been done. Likewise, I don't yet know what is to come, and so I'm stuck..."in-between." There may be no more crucial time in our lives to remember God's Word than our "in-between" times: for without God's Word reminding us of our identity in Him (and our future with Him), we might attempt a new normal without Him.

The time between Jesus' resurrection and ascension, and His ascension and the coming Holy Spirit, was certainly an "in-between" time for his followers. Normal was shifting: from life with Jesus resurrected and with us; to life with Jesus on His throne and no longer with us (at least in body). The words Jesus shared with His disciples before "normal" shifted now reminded them (and remind us) to keep our identity firmly rooted in Him:
"If you love me, you will obey what I command. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Counselor to be with you forever - the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. Before long, the world will not see me anymore, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live." - John 14:15-19

Because Jesus lives, we also will live. Regardless of the circumstances that define our "normal," the truth is that through Jesus we always have new normal: resurrection; everything else is just character development.
