

Each year Cardinal Dolan welcomes the graduating seniors of all our Catholic High Schools to come to Mass with him in Saint Patrick's Cathedral. On those days in Manhattan I was always happy to see the surge of Catholic HS students coming by busses and subway, in uniforms with a variety of school colors, noticed and admired by the midtown workers.

This year only two representatives from each school could be invited to that Mass. The other seniors – there are 5,277 seniors scheduled to graduate this spring! - were watching on livestream in their homerooms. But the account in CATHOLIC NEW YORK, on page 11 of the May 6th issue, was a proud one for us at Saint Teresa Parish, because the one senior chosen from thousands to address the Cardinal during the Mass on behalf of all of the graduates was our own Sarah Mastoros, a senior at Notre Dame Academy.

A Catholic school student since kindergarten, Sarah attended St. Teresa School and St. John Villa Academy before Notre Dame Academy. Her three siblings (Mary, Elizabeth, and Christopher) are also Catholic school young adults, and Sarah thanked her parents {Chris and Bernice} for the sacrifices they had made to make her education possible.

Here are quotes from Sarah's speech, as reported in that article in CATHOLIC NEW YORK:

"This past year has been very difficult for people in many ways. The death of a loved one, the loss of a job, and financial difficulties are just some of the problems Covid-19 forced people to face.

Through all of these hardships, having hope and taking solace in our Catholic faith have been the forces that bring people out of the darkness and into the Light.

I am very proud to say that I go to a Catholic high school in the Archdiocese of New York, and I hope to use the foundations of my education in my college years and beyond."

Sarah concluded her words with thanks to her teachers, saying that she has been inspired to study education and looks forward to one day educating her own students in the Catholic principles she feels very fortunate to have learned.

We have received encouraging news from NY's Governor that as of this Wednesday, May 19, there will no longer be a capacity restriction on houses of worship. (For our 500 seat church, it had been 250.) However, masks are still to be worn, and the six foot social distancing requirement for strangers is still in effect. That last part means that we still have to tape off rows and remind you to sit apart. So — in effect we are not really back to using full capacity yet.

Nevertheless, I am happy to remind you of our previous Parish Council recommendation to return the 9am Mass to St. Nicholas Chapel one month from now - on Fathers Day, June 20. Until then, the 9am Mass will continue at St. Teresa Church.

I am looking forward to saying that first Mass on June 20 for the devoted people who love the Chapel. I visited there this week to be sure that it will be in good order. One window was broken by a lacrosse ball. There hasn't been an apology yet for this accident. Some spots on the ceiling will get some paint. The lectionary on the pulpit and the missal on the altar were still open to the Second Sunday of Lent (2020). Otherwise we are almost ready. Perhaps we can all channel the spirit of Jimmy Cagney / George M. Cohen and sing: "Tell all the gang at 42" Street (or Saint Nicholas Chapel) that I will soon be there..."

Let us continue to pray for the unfortunate people in countries like India where the coronavirus is taking a heavy toll. We will respond to their practical needs with a contribution from our parish, in lieu of a second collection, sent to Cardinal Dolan to forward to the very effective Catholic Near East Welfare Association. Anyone who wants to send a personal contribution can mail it to: CNEWA, 1011 First Avenue, NY NY 10022. And ask for a copy of their excellent magazine called ONE.

Among the welcome signs of renewal and anticipated return to favorite activities is the line-up of one-day and multiday bus trips for our Golden Age Society members (and for other parishioners and neighbors who want to join us.)

- * Golden Age members only will meet for lunch on Monday June 7, at Casa Verde restaurant.
- * The next two one-day bus trips, open to everyone, will be:
 - Wednesday August 25 to Peddlers Village in PA for shopping and a murder mystery lunch {"DEATH AT THE DOO WOP"). Price is \$110 complete. \$25 deposit is required to save a seat.
 - Wednesday October 13 to see a new musical at the Sight and Sound Theater based on the Bible's Book of Esther:
 QUEEN ESTHER AT THE SIGHT AND SOUND THEATER WITH LUNCH AT MILLER'S RESTAURANT. Price is \$160 complete.
 Deposit required soon to save a seat.
- * As for the longer bus trips: most seats are already reserved for a four day/three night expedition to Boston, Salem, and Cape Ann. A casino may be in there somewhere. Dates: Sept 17-20, 2021. Price is \$424. Deposit is needed now.

Then next year, in 2022, three multi-day trips are already planned:

- 5 day, 4 night trip to Vermont; May 16-20; \$621.
- 4 day, 3 night trip to Cape Cod and Martha's Vineyard; July 18-22 \$499.
 - 7 day, 6 night trip to Nashville, Tennessee, Oct 2-8; \$762.

How to Apply for Financial Assistance With Funeral Expenses for COVID-19 Deaths

People should know that under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, <u>FEMA will provide financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses</u> incurred after January 20, 2020. If your family lost someone to COVID and had COVID-19 funeral expenses, you could gather documentation such as:

- Official death certificate that attributes the death directly or indirectly to COVID-19 and shows that the death occurred in the United States
- Funeral expense documents (receipts, funeral home contract, etc.) that includes the applicant's name, the deceased person's name, the amount of funeral expenses, and the dates the funeral expenses happened;
- * Also, proof of funds received from other sources specifically for use toward funeral costs.

Those who meet the FEMA guidelines will need to order a new certified copy of the death certificate with a cause of death. Any hospital, nursing home or home death will not have a cause of death listed on the death certificate due to NYC HIPAA laws. Funeral homes can only reorder death certificates for family within one year from the date of death. For more infotmation; https://www.fema.gov/disasters/coronavirus/economic/funeral-assistance.


