What to expect from the conversion...

Conversion Summary

- QuickBooks Online looks and feels different
- Basic tasks and transactions are the same
- QuickBooks Online uses the same foundation of lists and transaction forms to do your accounting



What information gets converted?

List Information – converts all of your list information including

- Customer remain the same
- Vendors → Suppliers in QuickBooks Online
- Accounts remain the same
- Items → Products and Services in QuickBooks Online
- Classes remain the same
- Budgets



What information gets converted?

Account Balances – converts all account balances

Transactions Details – converts all transaction

Other Details

- Sales tax filings remain filed
- Multicurrency transactions are converted
- Inventory is converted



What's Different?

User Interface – it looks different with different ways of getting around

Form Templates – Custom Form Styles (additional setup required)

Memorized Reports → **Custom Reports** (additional setup required)

Inventory – QuickBooks Online uses FIFO (First in – First out costing method)

QuickBooks Premier – features not part of QuickBooks Online

- Units of Measure
- Assembly Items
- Price Levels
- Sales Orders

User Setup – you're required to setup users after converting



QuickBooks Online Versions

QuickBooks Online Essentials

- 3 users
- Bank Feeds
- Enter Bills and Pay Bills
- Tracking for expenses, sales and banking
- Multicurrency Option

QuickBooks Online Plus

- 5 users
- Class Tracking
- Purchase Orders and inventory
- Budgets
- Location tracking
- Project tracking
- Progress Invoicing

Create Reports – All dates created on accrual basis

- 2. Compare Balance Sheet in QuickBooks Online to QuickBooks Desktop
- 3. Compare A/R Aging Summary to QuickBooks Desktop
- 4. Review Lists like customers, suppliers, accounts in QuickBooks Online and compare to QuickBooks Desktop

New Menu - use this menu to create day-to-day transactions





Navigation Bar






- Setup users in your company
