

Director's Notes



Justin Allen Slagle, Director

When *Guys and Dolls* opened at the 46th Street Theatre on Broadway in November of 1950 the *New York Daily News* called it, "the perfect musical comedy." Frank Loesser and Abe Burrows had turned Damon Runyon's world of short stories into an integrated book musical. The show ran for 1,200 performances and won the Tony Award for Best Musical. It would have won the 1951 Pulitzer Prize for Drama, but Abe Burrows's troubles with the House Un-American Activities Committee prompted the Trustees of Columbia University to veto the selection, and no Pulitzer for Drama was awarded that year.

It remains today in the eyes of many as it was from the beginning, "the perfect musical comedy." With its brilliant score, fun story and endearing characters, our team's most important job was to trust the material and not screw it up. When taking on such a well-known show such as *Guys and*

Dolls there is a great responsibility to get the story "right." Each audience member walks in with an expectation of what they are about to see. I take that responsibility very seriously. What we present for you now is *Guys and Dolls*: No spectacle, No new take: Simply a great story: a story of love, luck and a floating crap game. I hope you enjoy our production of *Guys and Dolls*. And how can you not? It just may be the "perfect musical." - Justin Allen Slagle




