2020 FEES

As costs continue to increase in providing educational resources and facilities we have had to schedule a fee increase to meet the ongoing cost of providing Catholic Education in the Glenroy Parish. We have tried to keep the fee increase minimal (but realistic in meeting our financial needs) so as not to increase financial hardship on families. An overall \$30 increase will be implemented for 2020. This is an average increase of 75cents per week over the school year.

Families will be notified of their child's 2020 classroom teachers when they receive their child's end of year report.


We are extremely fortunate at Corpus Christi Primary School to have a group of wonderfully talented, dedicated and committed teachers and staff. We ask all children and parents to continue to support us through your continued cooperation and positive attitude to learning.

The following criteria are used as a guideline for formulating class groupings.

- 1) Awareness of positive social/friendship groups.
- 2) Potential Behavioural/personality conflicts
- 3) Maturity/independent working ability
- 4) Gender Balance where possible
- 5) Level balance in multi-age groupings
- 6) Maximum two consecutive years with teacher
- 7) Academic balance
- 8) Parental involvement and support
- 9) Number of new arrivals / ESL /Children with special learning needs.

All students attending Corpus Christi Primary School have the right to feel safe. The care, safety and wellbeing of children and young people is a fundamental responsibility of all within our school. Corpus Christi Primary School is committed to creating an environment where the safety, wellbeing and participation of all children within our care is paramount.

Our Swimming Program begins in Term Four on Monday 9th December, Tuesday 10th December, Wednesday 11th December, Thursday 12th December, Friday 13th December followed by Monday 16th December, at the Fawkner Leisure Centre 79-83 Jukes Rd Fawkner. This is an intensive swimming program whereby the children attend swimming each day for 6 days. The times are as follows:

Leave	9.00am for	9.30am to 10.15am Lesson	4/5MJ + F/1MP + 2/3SA

"	11.15am "	11.45pm to 12.30pm Lesson	2/3GB + 6AJ + 2/3SA
"	12.00pm "	12.30pm to 1.15pm Lesson	2/3CW+ 6MS+ 2/3SA

2/3SA will be split across the five sessions to reduce group numbers and meet bus capacity.

Grades 2/3CW, 6MS AND 2/3SA children who are attending the 12.30pm swimming lesson times are requested NOT to order <u>lunch orders</u> from the canteen during the Swimming program.

Instructors may conduct some lessons in the outdoor pool at Fawkner Leisure Centre. Children should ensure they have sunscreen and appropriate sun protection if advised by their instructor that they will be swimming outdoors. (eg Rash vest/Tee shirt).

Each child exiting primary school is required to have a minimum level of attainment recommended by the swimming and water safety industry, and if so will be issued with a "Victorian Water Safety Certificate".

Water safety and swimming is a part of the Health and Physical Education curriculum.

Year prep – Children are introduced to basic safety and survival procedures in and around the water.

Years 1 and 2 – Children explore different ways to move into, through, and out of water safely.

Years 3 and 4 – Children develop their knowledge and understanding of water safety, and extend their swimming and survival abilities.

Years 5 and 6 – Children improve their survival abilities and safety techniques in the water, extending their range of swimming skills to include those required for clothed, survival swimming.

The aim of educating the children with regards to swimming and water safety is to enable them to safely enjoy aquatic activities in a range of environments.

Each child in the school is expected to attend swimming classes, and as stated in the Chatter, a medical certificate will be required or you will need to see Mr Lucardie to be granted an exemption. If your child is granted an exemption, they will still be expected to attend the Fawkner Leisure Centre, where they will be supervised by their classroom teacher. This is to alleviate the pressure on school organization and supervision.

If your child has private swimming lessons please ask the swimming centre, where your child attends, to issue them with a certificate stating their current level of swimming competence.

SECURITY — FENCE - We request that parents do not talk to their children from outside our boundary fence as we are trying to educate our children not to talk to passer-by's outside the fence. If parents wish to talk to their children they are most welcome to sign in via the Office. All visitors to our school are required to obtain a Visitors Pass from the Administration Office. Parents working in the classrooms, PMP program canteen and Uniform Shop must have a Working with Children Check Card which must be displayed in the Visitors Pass. AFTER SCHOOL - Children waiting for collection after school must wait inside the school grounds so supervision can be provided. At 3.45pm all children must proceed to the Office area to await collection. If children are walking home they should not linger in the playground but depart immediately and walk directly home. BEFORE SCHOOL - Children should not be at school prior to 8.30am when Yard Supervision commences. With the introduction of BEFORE SCHOOL CARE we will be requesting families enrol in Before School Care if arriving at school before 8.30am. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. If parents have any concerns please feel free to contact Mr Lucardie.

"NO SHOW-LET US KNOW!" - If your child is absent from school we request you inform our School Office of their non-attendance by 9.00am on the day of absence using the following methods

If your child is marked as absent on the daily roll and we have not been notified, we will contact families to ensure that children are still at home. Your assistance will ensure we don't need to make time consuming or unnecessary phone calls. Children arriving after 9.00am must report to the School Office to obtain a late pass and have their attendance adjusted from absent to present. Thank you for your continued support and assistance.

In accordance with Child Safety Standards, visitors (including parents) entering the school between 9:10am and 3:00 pm MUST enter through the office and sign in.

Please also be aware that anyone wishing to assist in classrooms or be on the school grounds between 9.10am to 3.00pm and have signed into the Office must have a WWCC (working with children check).

RECESS & LUNCH TIME PICK UP - If you need to pick your child up between 11.00am— 11.30am or 1.00pm—2.00pm for an appointment or family matter could you please do so before or after these times as children are difficult to locate in the yard and classrooms are locked and bags are inaccessible. SKATEBOARDS /BIKES/SCOOTERS A number of children use skateboards, scooters or bikes to travel to school. We request skateboard/scooter, bike users wear a helmet and appropriate safety gear (eg knee pads/elbow/ wrist supports). Children should not ride their skateboards /scooters or bikes in our school grounds.

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL ARRANGEMENTS - Children should not be at school prior to 8.30am when Yard Supervision commences. With BEFORE /AFTER SCHOOL CARE we request families enrol in Before or After School Care if arriving at school before 8.30am or requiring supervision after 3.45pm. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. If parents have any concerns please feel free to contact Mr Lucardie.
