### NOTES/CLARIFICATIONS

Since the start of the 2016 season, Florida State is the third winningest team in ACC play with a 115-38 record (.752 winning percentage)...Florida State averages 24.8 over wins per season in the last five seasons with a school-record 29 wins coming during the 2019 season. The Seminoles have won at least 23 games in four of the last five seasons...Florida State averages 12.8 ACC wins in the last four seasons with a school record 16 ACC wins coming in winning the first ever regular season championship in school history in 2020...Florida State is one of three teams in the nation that has played in the Sweet 16 of each of the last three NCAA Tournaments (Florida State, Gonzaga, Michigan)...Florida State is one of six teams in the nation that has won at least one game in each of the last four NCAA Tournaments (Florida State, Gonzaga, Kansas, Michigan, and Villanova, Florida)...Florida State has won eight games in the last four NCAA Tournaments. The Seminoles are 8-4 with at least one win in each of the last four NCAA Tournaments...Florida State led the ACC in scoring offense, scoring margin, field goal percentage shooting and 3-point field goal percentage shooting during the 2020-21 season...Florida State is 77-4 at home in the last five (plus) seasons (.951 winning percentage). The Seminoles have won 77 of their last 81 games since February 27, 2015...Florida State has won 25 consecutive ACC home games – the second longest streak in ACC history. The Seminoles are just one ACC win from tying the all-time ACC record for consecutive ACC wins at home (26 by Duke 1997-2000)...Florida State has finished 12<sup>th</sup> or higher in the national polls in each of the last three seasons (2021, No. 10; 2020, No. 4; 2019, No. 12)...Florida State has been ranked in the final national poll in each of the last five seasons (2021, No. 10; 2020, No. 4; 2019, No. 12; 2018, No. 18; 2017, No. 16) and are one of only two teams in the ACC to be ranked in the final poll in each of the last five seasons...Florida State has won an all-time national record-tying 11 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime games since January 13, 2018.

One grassroots coach once told me a story about a visit to Florida State's campus, where the coach spotted a 7-footer he had never heard of, let alone seen before, on a visit.
