NOTES/CLARIFICATIONS

Since the start of the 2016 season, Florida State is the third winningest team in ACC play with a 115-38 record (.752 winning percentage)...Florida State averages 24.8 over wins per season in the last five seasons with a school-record 29 wins coming during the 2019 season. The Seminoles have won at least 23 games in four of the last five seasons...Florida State averages 12.8 ACC wins in the last four seasons with a school record 16 ACC wins coming in winning the first ever regular season championship in school history in 2020...Florida State is one of three teams in the nation that has played in the Sweet 16 of each of the last three NCAA Tournaments (Florida State, Gonzaga, Michigan)...Florida State is one of six teams in the nation that has won at least one game in each of the last four NCAA Tournaments. (Florida State, Gonzaga, Kansas, Michigan, and Villanova, Florida)...Florida State has won eight games in the last four NCAA Tournaments. The Seminoles are 8-4 with at least one win in each of the last four NCAA Tournaments...Florida State led the ACC in scoring offense, scoring margin, field goal percentage shooting and 3-point field goal percentage shooting during the 2020-21 season...Florida State is 77-4 at home in the last five (plus) seasons (.951 winning percentage). The Seminoles have won 77 of their last 81 games since February 27, 2015...Florida State has won 25 consecutive ACC home games – the second longest streak in ACC history. The Seminoles are just one ACC win from tying the all-time ACC record for consecutive ACC wins at home (26 by Duke 1997-2000)...Florida State has finished 12th or higher in the national polls in each of the last three seasons (2021, No. 10; 2020, No. 4; 2019, No. 18; 2017, No. 16) and are one of only two teams in the ACC to be ranked in the final poll in each of the last five seasons...Florida State has won an all-time national record-tying 11 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime games since January 13, 2018.

"If there's one trend that has emerged over the years in the ACC it is that Florida State doesn't get enough respect for the program they have built. Head coach Leonard Hamilton has guided the Seminoles to at least the Sweet 16 in each of the past three NCAA Tournaments, a product of shrewd team-building. Florida State has produced five NBA first-round picks since 2016, including a trio of lottery picks, a run that should be extended once Scottie Barnes goes pro. The losses of M.J. Walker and RayQuan Evans will also hurt but the Seminoles are projected to return six key rotation players, headlined by their second-leading scorer in RaiQuan Gray. Hamilton has also built a solid recruiting class featuring three ESPN 100 prospects, with the headliner being small forward Matt Cleveland. Another intriguing player in the class is 7-foot-3 center Naheem McLeod, a junior college transfer who could be an impact player in the paint.

"Are we still going to do this? You know, that thing where we underestimate Leonard Hamilton and Florida State in the preseason and then they go out and win 25 games and compete for an ACC title and win multiple games in March? The Seminoles have gotten out of the first weekend in three straight NCAA tournaments and likely would have made it four if the 2020 dance hadn't been canceled. I'm expecting them to lose M.J. Walker and Scottie Barnes, while RaiQuan Gray is also testing the NBA draft waters. But Anthony Polite is back and Hamilton will also have his usual assortment of 7-footers to throw at teams. He also brings in a deep and talented recruiting class, led by Houston transfer Caleb Mills, the preseason AAC Player of the Year this past season. Freshmen Matthew Cleveland and Jalen Warley should add serious scoring pop on the perimeter."

"I feel like it's just the right move to put the 'Noles somewhere in the top 25 even though they always lose a couple key pieces every year (look for Scottie Barnes to go to the NBA, and M.J. Walker and RaiQuan Evans are seniors). FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton will add Houston transfer Caleb Mills and a talented freshman class that includes wing Matthew Cleveland and combo guard Jalen Warley."

"The Seminoles will lose projected lottery pick Scottie Barnes and could also lose leading scorer MJ Walker to the NBA draft. But coach Leonard Hamilton lost two players to the NBA last year and still got FSU to the Sweet 16. He'll have returning pieces to mesh with an elite recruiting class that currently ranks second and is headlined by five-star Matthew Cleveland."

"The Seminoles should be really good again despite the likely losses of MJ Walker, RaiQuan Gray and Scottie Barnes and thanks to the expected return of proven pieces like Anthony Polite and Malik Osborne. Florida State will add the nation's second-ranked recruiting class to that core, as well as former Houston standout Caleb Mills."

"The nation's No. 2 recruiting class, per 247Sports, belongs to the Seminoles, a group headlined by a pair of top-30 recruits in Matthew Cleveland and Jalen Warley. Cleveland, Warley and Houston transfer Caleb Mills should provide tons of scoring pop in the backcourt for Leonard Hamilton's club. The Seminoles should have the combination of young talent (Warley, Cleveland) and experience (Anthony Polite) to be very dangerous."

"Within basketball circles, Leonard Hamilton is respected and praised. He has been overshadowed in a league that has won half of the national titles since 2015, a league with teams anchored by Tony Bennett, Mike Krzyzewski and, until his retirement, Roy Williams. But his résumé is tremendous. He has finished in the top 45 in adjusted offensive efficiency and defensive efficiency for the past five seasons. Hamilton's ability to identify the right players for his style of play and develop those players over time has fueled his success. Players get better when they go to Florida State and compete for Leonard Hamilton."

"The winner of any award with the word "underrated" in it is going to be Leonard Hamilton more often than not, and some day some historian is going to have to explain how exactly that happened. Just look at last season. Florida State had just said goodbye to starters Trent Forrest and Devin Vassell and key reserve Patrick Williams. No problem for Hamilton, he added Scottie Barnes to a core made up of MJ Walker, RaiQuan Gray and Anthony Polite and secured the program's third top-four seed in the NCAA tournament in the past four brackets. The coach has been a model of consistency, and ordinarily that should mean that at some point he would cease to be underrated. Go figure."

"There are two things that really stand out to me about the way Leonard Hamilton constructs his roster. One, it's the height and size in the frontcourt. Every year, the Seminoles seem to have a handful of 7-footers who find ways to contribute over the course of their careers in Tallahassee. One grassroots coach once told me a story about a visit to Florida State's campus, where the coach spotted a 7-footer he had never heard of, let alone seen before, on a visit. He asked Hamilton who it was, and Hamilton responded, "Oh, we found him. He's coming next year." It's just a pipeline of shot-blockers at this point. The second thing is depth. Most coaches are shortening their benches and having trouble keeping seven or eight guys happy. Hamilton routinely uses 10-11 guys every season and rarely does he have chemistry or personnel issues."

"At the risk of wearing out one of my previous answers, I would rest easy if my highly talented, skilled and versatile son (chip off the old block) were being recruited by Leonard Hamilton. I would trust the coach to give it to my kid straight, I would know that this is not Hamilton's first such rodeo by any means and most of all I would expect my son's team to enjoy a fair level of success over the next few years (in a fairly salubrious setting, no less). Moreover, based on past experience watching Hamilton, I would not see my son berated unduly much less physically accosted by his coach if my youngster did choose to sign with the Seminoles. Sadly, this is not the standard coaching practice everywhere.

"Last season, MJ Walker told me how much he'd grown during his time at Florida State. He arrived as a five-star recruit with NBA dreams and he left FSU as one of the first members of his family to graduate. Hamilton has proven he can develop NBA talent, but he's also teaching young players to become better people. I also know, based on our conversations, that he takes the most pride in watching players walk across the stage. Last month, he tweeted a photo of the 10 Florida State players -- yes, 10 -- who'd just graduated. My guess is a lot of the ACC's coaches, if they couldn't coach their own sons, would send them to Hamilton, too."
