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INTRODUCTION

1. This Standard Request for Proposals (SRFP) has been prepared for use by public entities in Kenya in the procurement of consultancy services and selection of consultants.
2. The SRFP includes Standard form of Contract for Large Assignments and small assignment which are for lump sum or time based payments.
3. A separate SRFP has been provided for selection of individual professional consultants.
4. The General Conditions of Contract should not be modified and instead the Special Conditions of Contract should be used to reflect the unique circumstances of the particular assignment. Similarly the information to consultants should only be clarified or amended through the Appendix to information to Consultants.
5. This SRFP document shall be used where a shortlist of consultancy firms already exist or has been obtained through a shortlist after an advertisement of Expression of Interest for Consultancy required.

1.6 Any additional information, addendums or clarification in respect to this tender will be available in our COUNTY GOVERNMENT OF KERICHO website www.kericho.go.ke All bidders are advised to regularly check the website during the bidding period.

1.7 The original and all copies of the Technical Proposal shall be placed in a sealed envelope clearly marked “**TECHNICAL PROPOSAL**,” and the original and all copies of the Financial Proposal in a sealed envelope clearly marked “**FINANCIAL PROPOSAL**” and warning: “**DO NOT OPEN WITH THE TECHNICAL PROPOSAL**”. Both envelopes shall be placed into an outer envelope and sealed. This outer envelope shall bear the submission address and other information indicated in the Appendix “ITC” and be clearly marked, “**DO NOT OPEN, EXCEPT IN PRESENCE OF THE OPENING COMMITTEE.**”

Tender Validity

The tender shall remain Valid and open for acceptance for a period of one hundred and twenty (120) days from the specified date of tender opening or from the extended date of tender opening (whichever is later).

SECTION II – INFORMATION TO CONSULTANTS (ITC)

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SECTION II: - INFORMATION TO CONSULTANTS (ITC)

2.1 Introduction

- 2.1.1 The Client named the Appendix to “ITC” will select a firm among those invited to submit a proposal, in accordance with the method of selection detailed in the appendix. The method of selection shall be as indicated by the procuring entity in the Appendix.
- 2.1.2 The consultants are invited to submit a Technical Proposal and a Financial Proposal, or a Technical Proposal only, as specified in the Appendix “ITC” for consulting services required for the assignment named in the said Appendix. A Technical Proposal only may be submitted in assignments where the Client intends to apply standard conditions of engagement and scales of fees for professional services which are regulated as is the case with Building and Civil Engineering Consulting services. In such a case the highest ranked firm of the technical proposal shall be invited to negotiate a contract on the basis of scale fees. The proposal will be the basis for Contract negotiations and ultimately for a signed Contract with the selected firm.
- 2.1.3 The consultants must familiarize themselves with local conditions and take them into account in preparing their proposals. To obtain firsthand information on the assignment and on the local conditions, consultants are encouraged to liaise with the Client regarding any information that they may require before submitting a proposal and to attend a pre-proposal conference where applicable. Consultants should contact the officials named in the Appendix “ITC” to arrange for any visit or to obtain additional information on the pre-proposal conference. Consultants should ensure that these officials are advised of the visit in adequate time to allow them to make appropriate arrangements.
- 2.1.4 The Procuring entity will provide the inputs specified in the Appendix “ITC”, assist the firm in obtaining licenses and permits needed to carry out the services and make available relevant project data and reports.
- 2.1.5 Please note that (i) the costs of preparing the proposal and of negotiating the Contract, including any visit to the Client are not reimbursable as a direct cost of the assignment; and (ii) the Client is not bound to accept any of the proposals submitted.
- 2.1.6 The procuring entity’s employees, committee members, board members and their relative (spouse and children) are not eligible to participate.

2.1.7 The price to be charged for the tender document shall not exceed Kshs. 1,000.00

2.1.8 The procuring entity shall allow the tenderer to review the tender document free of charge before purchase.

2.2 Clarification and Amendment of RFP Documents

2.2.1 Consultants may request a clarification of any of the RFP documents only up to seven [7] days before the proposal submission date. Any request for clarification must be sent in writing by paper mail, cable, telex, facsimile or electronic mail to the Client's address indicated in the Appendix "ITC". The Client will respond by cable, telex, facsimile or electronic mail to such requests and will send written copies of the response (including an explanation of the query but without identifying the source of inquiry) to all invited consultants who intend to submit proposals.

2.2.2 At any time before the submission of proposals, the Client may for any reason, whether at his own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by an invited firm, amend the RFP. Any amendment shall be issued in writing through addenda. Addenda shall be sent by mail, cable, telex or facsimile to all invited consultants and will be binding on them. The Client may at his discretion extend the deadline for the submission of proposals.

2.3 Preparation of Technical Proposal

2.3.1 The Consultants proposal shall be written in English language.

2.3.2 In preparing the Technical Proposal, consultants are expected to examine the documents constituting this RFP in detail. Material deficiencies in providing the information requested may result in rejection of a proposal.

2.3.3 While preparing the Technical Proposal, consultants must give particular attention to the following:

- (i) If a firm considers that it does not have all the expertise for the assignment, it may obtain a full range of expertise by associating with individual consultant(s) and/or other firms or entities in a joint venture or sub-consultancy as appropriate. Consultants shall not associate with the other consultants invited for this assignment. Any firms associating in contravention of this requirement shall automatically be disqualified.

- (ii) For assignments on a staff-time basis, the estimated number of professional staff-time is given in the Appendix. The proposal shall however be based on the number of professional staff-time estimated by the firm.
- (iii) It is desirable that the majority of the key professional staff proposed be permanent employees of the firm or have an extended and stable working relationship with it.
- (iv) Proposed professional staff must as a minimum, have the experience indicated in Appendix, preferably working under conditions similar to those prevailing in Kenya.
- (v) Alternative professional staff shall not be proposed and only one Curriculum Vitae (CV) may be submitted for each position.

2.3.4 The Technical Proposal shall provide the following information using the attached Standard Forms;

- (i) A brief description of the firm's organization and an outline of recent experience on assignments of a similar nature. For each assignment the outline should indicate *inter alia*, the profiles of the staff proposed, duration of the assignment, contract amount and firm's involvement.
- (ii) Any comments or suggestions on the Terms of Reference, a list of services and facilities to be provided by the Client.
- (iii) A description of the methodology and work plan for performing the assignment.
- (iv) The list of the proposed staff team by specialty, the tasks that would be assigned to each staff team member and their timing.
- (v) CVs recently signed by the proposed professional staff and the authorized representative submitting the proposal. Key information should include number of years working for the firm/entity and degree of responsibility held in various assignments during the last ten (10) years.
- (vi) Estimates of the total staff input (professional and support staff staff-time) needed to carry out the assignment supported by bar chart diagrams showing the time proposed for each professional staff team member.

(vii) A detailed description of the proposed methodology, staffing and monitoring of training, if Appendix “A” specifies training as a major component of the assignment.

(viii) Any additional information requested in Appendix “A”.

2.3.5 The Technical Proposal shall not include any financial information.

2.4 Preparation of Financial Proposal

2.4.1 In preparing the Financial Proposal, consultants are expected to take into account the requirements and conditions outlined in the RFP documents. The Financial Proposal should follow Standard Forms (Section D). It lists all costs associated with the assignment including; (a) remuneration for staff (in the field and at headquarters), and; (b) reimbursable expenses such as subsistence (per diem, housing), transportation (international and local, for mobilization and demobilization), services and equipment (vehicles, office equipment, furniture, and supplies), office rent, insurance, printing of documents, surveys, and training, if it is a major component of the assignment. If appropriate these costs should be broken down by activity.

2.4.2 The Financial Proposal should clearly identify as a separate amount, the local taxes, duties, fees, levies and other charges imposed under the law on the consultants, the sub-consultants and their personnel, unless Appendix “A” specifies otherwise.

2.4.3 Consultants shall express the price of their services in Kenya Shillings.

2.4.4 Commissions and gratuities, if any, paid or to be paid by consultants and related to the assignment will be listed in the Financial Proposal submission Form.

2.4.5 The Proposal must remain valid for 60 days after the submission date. During this period, the consultant is expected to keep available, at his own cost, the professional staff proposed for the assignment. The Client will make his best effort to complete negotiations within this period. If the Client wishes to extend the validity period of the proposals, the consultants shall agree to the extension.

2.5 Submission, Receipt, and Opening of Proposals

- 1.8.1 The original proposal (Technical Proposal and, if required, Financial Proposal; see para. 1.2) shall be prepared in indelible ink. It shall contain no interlineation or overwriting, except as necessary to correct errors made by the firm itself. Any such corrections must be initialed by the persons or person authorized to sign the proposals.
- 1.8.2 For each proposal, the consultants shall prepare the number of copies indicated in Appendix "A". Each Technical Proposal and Financial Proposal shall be marked "**ORIGINAL**" or "**COPY**" as appropriate. If there are any discrepancies between the original and the copies of the proposal, the original shall govern.
- 1.8.3** The original and all copies of the Technical Proposal shall be placed in a sealed envelope clearly marked "**TECHNICAL PROPOSAL**," and the original and all copies of the Financial Proposal in a sealed envelope clearly marked "**FINANCIAL PROPOSAL**" and warning: "**DO NOT OPEN WITH THE TECHNICAL PROPOSAL**". Both envelopes shall be placed into an outer envelope and sealed. This outer envelope shall bear the submission address and other information indicated in the Appendix "ITC" and be clearly marked, "**DO NOT OPEN, EXCEPT IN PRESENCE OF THE OPENING COMMITTEE.**"
- 1.8.4 The completed Technical and Financial Proposals must be delivered at the submission address on or before the time and date stated in the Appendix "ITC". Any proposal received after the closing time for submission of proposals shall be returned to the respective consultant unopened.
- 1.8.5 After the deadline for submission of proposals, the Technical Proposal shall be opened immediately by the opening committee. The Financial Proposal shall remain sealed and deposited with a responsible officer of the client department up to the time for public opening of financial proposals.

MANDATORY PRELIMINARY REQUIREMENTS

The tenderer must provide the following information and/or copies of the following documents:

1. Certificate of Incorporation or Business Registration Certificate
2. Attaché Certified CR 12 (Certified by Attorney or Commissioner of Oath)
3. Registration and valid license by the professional body for the lead consultants
4. Valid business permit
5. Valid Tax Compliance certificate (Current Certificates)
6. Bid bond of Kshs. 100,000
7. Letters of reference from three(3) major clients for whom similar assignments have been undertaken for the last 10 years;
8. List and contact details of the organization for which similar consultancies have been undertaken over the five (5)years;
9. Attach premises ownership certificate or lease agreement or copies of utility bills
10. All bids submitted must be serialized/paginated
11. Duly filled declaration form not to engage in corruption fraudulent practices
12. Duly filled Business Questionnaire
13. Duly signed Certificate of site Visit/pre-proposal Meeting.
14. Bidders are allowed only to bid for one contract.

NB: Bidders that do not meet all the above mandatory requirements will be declared non responsive and shall not be evaluated further.

2.6.3 Any proposal which will be examined and found not to comply with all the requirements for submission of the proposals will be declared non responsive. All the proposals found to have complied with all the requirements for submission of proposal shall be declared responsive by the evaluation committee

2.6.4 Each responsive proposal will be given a technical score (ST). Any technical proposal which fails to achieve the total **minimum score 60Marks** indicated in the appendix to the information to tenderers shall be rejected at this stage and will not proceed to the next stage of evaluation. The respective financial proposal will be returned to the firm unopened.

2.6 Proposal Evaluation General

2.6.1 From the time the bids are opened to the time the Contract is awarded, if any consultant wishes to contact the Client on any matter related to his proposal, he should do so in writing at the address indicated in the Appendix "ITC". Any effort by the firm to influence the Client in the proposal evaluation, proposal comparison or Contract award decisions may result in the rejection of the consultant's proposal.

2.6.2 Evaluators of Technical Proposals shall have no access to the Financial Proposals until the technical evaluation is concluded.

2.7 Evaluation of Technical Proposal

2.7.1 The evaluation committee appointed by the Client shall evaluate the proposals on the basis of their responsiveness to the Terms of Reference, applying the evaluation criteria as follows

2.8 Public Opening and Evaluation of Financial Proposal

- 2.8.1 After Technical Proposal evaluation, the Client shall notify those consultants whose proposals did not meet the minimum qualifying mark or were considered non-responsive to the RFP and Terms of Reference, indicating that their Financial Proposals will be returned after completing the selection process. The Client shall simultaneously notify the consultants who have secured the minimum qualifying mark, indicating the date and time set for opening the Financial Proposals and stating that the opening ceremony is open to those consultants who choose to attend. The opening date shall not be sooner than seven (7) days after the notification date. The notification may be sent by registered letter, cable, telex, facsimile or electronic mail.
- 2.8.2 The Financial Proposals shall be opened publicly in the presence of the consultants' representatives who choose to attend. The name of the consultant, the technical. Scores and the proposed prices shall be read aloud and recorded when the Financial Proposals are opened. The Client shall prepare minutes of the public opening.
- 2.8.3 The evaluation committee will determine whether the financial proposals are complete (i.e. whether the consultant has costed all the items of the corresponding Technical Proposal and correct any computational errors. The cost of any unpriced items shall be assumed to be included in other costs in the proposal. In all cases, the total price of the Financial Proposal as submitted shall prevail.
- 2.8.4 While comparing proposal prices between local and foreign firms participating in a selection process in financial evaluation of Proposals, firms incorporated in Kenya where indigenous Kenyans own 51% or more of the share capital shall be allowed a 10% preferential bias in proposal prices. However, there shall be no such preference in the technical evaluation of the tenders. Proof of local incorporation and citizenship shall be required before the provisions of this sub-clause are applied. Details of such proof shall be attached by the Consultant in the financial proposal.
- 2.8.5 The formulae for determining the Financial Score (Sf) shall, unless an alternative formulae is indicated in the Appendix "ITC", be as follows:-
$$Sf = 100 \times \frac{FM}{F}$$
where Sf is the financial score; Fm is the lowest priced financial proposal and F is the price of the proposal under consideration. Proposals will be ranked according to their combined technical (St) and financial (Sf) scores using the weights (T=the weight given to the Technical Proposal; P = the weight given to the Financial Proposal; T + p = 1) indicated in the Appendix. The combined technical and financial score, S, is calculated as follows:- $S = St \times T \% + Sf \times P \%$. The firm achieving the highest combined technical and financial score will be invited for negotiations.

- 2.8.6 The tender evaluation committee shall evaluate the tender within 21 days of from the date of opening the tender.
- 2.8.7 Contract price variations shall not be allowed for contracts not exceeding one year (12 months).
- 2.8.8 Where contract price variation is allowed, the variation shall not exceed 15% of the original contract price.
- 2.8.9 Price variation requests shall be processed by the procuring entity within 30 days of receiving the request.

2.9 Negotiations

- 2.9.1 Negotiations will be held at the same address as “address to send information to the Client” indicated in the Appendix “ITC”. The aim is to reach agreement on all points and sign a contract.
- 2.9.2 Negotiations will include a discussion of the Technical Proposal, the proposed methodology (work plan), staffing and any suggestions made by the firm to improve the Terms of Reference. The Client and firm will then work out final Terms of Reference, staffing and bar charts indicating activities, staff periods in the field and in the head office, staff-months, logistics and reporting. The agreed work plan and final Terms of Reference will then be incorporated in the “Description of Services” and form part of the Contract. Special attention will be paid to getting the most the firm can offer within the available budget and to clearly defining the inputs required from the Client to ensure satisfactory implementation of the assignment.
- 2.9.3 Unless there are exceptional reasons, the financial negotiations will not involve the remuneration rates for staff (no breakdown of fees).
- 2.9.4 Having selected the firm on the basis of, among other things, an evaluation of proposed key professional staff, the Client expects to negotiate a contract on the basis of the experts named in the proposal. Before contract negotiations, the Client will require assurances that the experts will be actually available. The Client will not consider substitutions during contract negotiations unless both parties agree that undue delay in the selection process makes such substitution unavoidable or that such changes are critical to meet the objectives of the assignment. If this is not the case and if it is established that key staff were offered in the proposal without confirming their availability, the firm may be disqualified.

- 2.9.5 The negotiations will conclude with a review of the draft form of the Contract. To complete negotiations the Client and the selected firm will initial the agreed Contract. If negotiations fail, the Client will invite the firm whose proposal received the second highest score to negotiate a contract.
- 2.9.6 The procuring entity shall appoint a team for the purpose of the negotiations.

2.10 Award of Contract

- 2.10.1 The Contract will be awarded following negotiations. After negotiations are completed, the Client will promptly notify other consultants on the shortlist that they were unsuccessful and return the Financial Proposals of those consultants who did not pass the technical evaluation.
- 2.10.2 The selected firm is expected to commence the assignment on the date and at the location specified in Appendix "A".
- 2.10.3 The parties to the contract shall have it signed within 30 days from the date of notification of contract award unless there is an administrative review request.
- 2.10.4 The procuring entity may at any time terminate procurement proceedings before contract award and shall not be liable to any person for the termination.
- 2.10.5 The procuring entity shall give prompt notice of the termination to the tenderers and on request give its reasons for termination within 14 days of receiving the request from any tenderer.
- 2.10.6 To qualify for contract awards, the tenderer shall have the following:
- (a) Necessary qualifications, capability experience, services, equipment and facilities to provide what is being procured.
 - (b) Legal capacity to enter into a contract for procurement
 - (c) Shall not be insolvent, in receivership, bankrupt or in the process of being wound up and is not the subject of legal proceedings relating to the foregoing.
 - (d) Shall not be debarred from participating in public procurement.

2.11 Confidentiality

2.11.1 Information relating to evaluation of proposals and recommendations concerning awards shall not be disclosed to the consultants who submitted the proposals or to other persons not officially concerned with the process, until the winning firm has been notified that it has been awarded the Contract.

2.12 Corrupt or fraudulent practices

2.12.1 The procuring entity requires that the consultants observe the highest standards of ethics during the selection and award of the consultancy contract and also during the performance of the assignment. The tenderer shall sign a declaration that he has not and will not be involved in corrupt or fraudulent practices.

2.12.2 The procuring entity will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the consultant recommended for award has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for the contract in question.

2.12.3 Further a consultant who is found to have indulged in corrupt or fraudulent practices risks being debarred from participating in public procurement in Kenya.

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR FEASIBILITY STUDIES, ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESMENT, DESIGN, PREPARATION OF BID DOCUMENTS (BQ'S) AND SUPERVISION OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF MORDERN MARKET AND HIGH MAST FLOOD LIGHTS

INTRODUCTION

Kericho County is a beneficiary of the World Bank funded Kenya urban Support Programme. In the 2019/2020 financial year, the County is expected to appropriate approximately Two Hundred and fifty Six Million Shillings (KShs. 256,000,000) for various projects as enumerated in the Municipal Annual Investment Plan. The projects include construction of storm water drainage facilities, construction of a market, erection of high mast flood lights and construction of a slaughter house.

GOAL

The main goal of the consultancy is to undertake feasibility studies, design and supervision of the projects enumerated above.

OBJECTIVES

- a) To carry out feasibility studies for the construction of modern market
- b) To prepare detailed designs for the market.
- c) To carry out consultations with the Department, the Municipal Board and the citizenry on their proposed interventions.
- d) To prepare a supervision manual for the projects
- e) To prepare maintenance manuals.
- f) To provide areas of possible location of flood lights

SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work in the consultancy shall include, but not limited to the following tasks:

- a) Carry out feasibility studies and prepare feasibility report.

- b) Carry out inspection of the proposed site for the construction of modern market
- c) Prepare a Resettlement Action Plan (RAP).
- d) Prepare an Environmental Impact Assessment report.
- e) Map out areas for the location of flood lights.
- f) Prepare preliminary and final design reports including drawings and bid documents (B.Q's) for both the market and the high mast flood lights.
- g) Prepare a supervision manual for the works

Specific Scope for the Environmental Impact Assessment

- a) *Reconnaissance and site assessment; Define the location of the project including the vicinity that might be affected by the proposed project*
- b) Evaluate the legislations that govern and control environmental impact assessment and advise the proponent on how to mitigate the impacts
- c) Inspect the entire proposed project and establish status quo on environmental impact and establish a link with social well-being of the people.
- d) Examine and record all the activities of the project and indicate how it is likely to impact on the environment
- e) To examine the products, by- products and waste generated by the project.
- f) To evaluate the alternative technologies and processes available and reasons for preferring the chosen technology and processes
- g) Identify key areas of potential environmental challenges, which may require monitoring and evaluation thereafter in line with unfolding environmental/social changes.
- h) Prepare a comprehensive Environment Management Plan for the project management to implement. The EIA report should cover among others policy, health and safety and legal framework, and containing among other issues, identification of key aspects posing significant environmental impacts, recommendations on appropriate mitigating measures in order to minimize or prevent the adverse impacts to manageable levels.
- i) A draft an Environmental Impact Assessment report to be submitted to the National Environment Management Authority for review, approval and licensing.

Specific Scope for the Design of modern market and High Mast Lights

- (a) The objectives of this assignment are
 - To asses and determine the practicality of the proposed modern market.
 - To evaluate likely environmental impacts of the project.

- To conduct an assessment of the existing site conditions and determine the suitability of the location.
- To provide comprehensive architectural & design responses of the site conditions for the design of the proposed market.
- To develop concept, scheme and design detail that will ensure optimal functionality, aesthetics and cost effectiveness.
- To prepare bid documents for the proposed market.
- To supervise construction works of the project.

The following are the expected deliverables;

1. Feasibility study report.
2. Environmental study report.
3. Site analysis report
4. Comprehensive composite maps and site plan.
5. Concept design and study models.
6. Scheme designs with final models
7. Production drawings with design details.
8. Bills of quantities and bid documents.
9. Supervision reports.

The consultants are expected to produce all the necessary design documents (Architectural, structural, civil, electrical, mechanical etc) to enable seamless construction process and ensure quality ,timely and cost effective construction of the modern market.

(b) Scope of the Services,

- i) The design of the **modern market** may cover approximately 2000m² to 3000m² and may have the following functional spaces and utilities;
 - Adequate parking and circulation spaces enabling efficient produce handling (use of pallets and forklifts) as well as uninterrupted flow of traffic and goods including offloading & loading zones.
 - Market stalls /halls for display and sale of agricultural produce, juakali/workshops products, clothes etc as the case maybe.
 - Innovative exhibition spaces.
 - Upper level commercial and storage spaces
 - Administrative office spaces of between 10-15 m² per office worker with small kitchen.
 - Specialized uses(such as auction slab, banana ripening rooms, value-added chicken units etc)

- Public cold stores for perishables and adequate storage spaces.
- Ancillary spaces for service users(e.g. Banks, ATM lobbies, catering facilities, firefighting etc)
- Wet rooms and adequate waste disposal utilities.

ii) The winning consultant will be expected to perform the task in two phases;

- Phase 1

1. Feasibility study, methodology and detailed work plan.
2. Environmental study.
3. Survey user needs, carry out soil investigations including doing trial pits, and topographical surveys to establish service lines passing through the site.eg drainage channels, cables should be well documented.
4. Site analysis and responses to culminate to a comprehensive composite map and an outline design.
5. Detail design drawings and preparation of tender documents;
 - a. Composite map and site plan
 - b. Concept design with study models.
 - c. Scheme design and final model.
 - d. Working drawings
 - e. Detail designs.
 - f. Bills of Quantities and Bid documents.

- Phase 2

These will entail supervision of the construction works and it includes

1. Issuance of all the necessary instructions to the contractor and monitoring the execution of the works ensuring that they are carried out as per the contract documents.
2. Provide guidance to the contractor(s) as and when necessary ensuring that the works are carried out expeditiously according to the agreed time schedule and within the terms of contract.
3. Undertake inspections of the works

4. Receive certificates from contractors where applicable as well as check and approve materials, ensuring they comply with specifications.
5. Ascertain contractor's measurements and payment claims and certify this to County Government of Kericho as correct and within the terms of the contract.
6. Record the results of the measurements of works for interim or final payments in standard forms normally used in Kenya or as agreed with County Government of Kericho.
7. Check and approve all working/shop drawings prepared by the contractor.
8. Provide all necessary supervision as normally understood and agreed upon by County Government of Kericho for proper execution, completion and commissioning of the works.
