Happening this Week

Monday Night Movie, <u>April 11th</u> - *Florence Foster Jenkins* (2016), 1h 50m, Color Meryl Streep and Hugh Grant star in this true story of Florence Foster Jenkins, a rich New York heiress, and her dream to become an opera singer. The problem was, she had a terrible singing voice. Florence hired a singing teacher and a private pianist, Cosmé McMoon (played by Simon Helberg) to accompany her lessons and put on invitation-only recitals. Her husband, St. Clair (played by Hugh Grant who came out of retirement just to act opposite Streep) worked hard to make sure she never found out how awful her singing was. His biggest challenge came when she planned to appear on stage at Carnegie Hall. Florence finally did appear at a sold-out Carnegie Hall on 25 October 1944 famously decked out in one of the fantastic costumes she designed herself. In attendance that night were Cole Porter and Lily Pons. She received terrible reviews and died of a heart attack a month later. *Florence Foster Jenkins* received 47 award nominations including an Academy Award nomination for Meryl Streep for Best Performance by an Actress in a Leading Role.

SPEAKERS COMMITTEE, WEDNESDAY, APRIL 13, 7:30PM – AUDITORIUM: Jennifer Greiner, Refuge Manager of the Patuxent Research Refuge, will speak on "The Patuxent Research Refuge: A Gem in our Midst." Jennifer Greiner holds a Bachelor's degree in Biology from Kalamazoo College and a Master's in Natural Resource Policy and Administration from the University of Michigan. Now in her 28th year with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Jennifer has served the agency at its national headquarters, the North-Atlantic Region, and the field level. In 2020, she assumed the position of Refuge Manager for the 13,000-acre Patuxent Research Refuge and was appointed by Maryland's Governor to serve as Federal Facilities representative on the Patuxent River Commission. Jennifer's past positions include Habitat Coordinator for the watershed-wide Chesapeake Bay Program, National Coordinator for the agency's Coastal Program, and Wildlife Biologist with the Endangered Species program. Collington resident Ann Carlson, a volunteer at the Refuge, helped to arrange this program and will introduce the speaker. This event is co-sponsored by the Climate Committee. Circuit Court Judges

What's this all about - In the July primary and November election, there will be candidates for judge of the Prince George's County 7th Circuit Court on the ballot. Many of us don't have a clue about the Maryland judicial system in general or Circuit Courts in particular. So, sit back and let's take a little tour.

Circuit Structure - Each Maryland county and Baltimore City has a circuit court, grouped into eight judicial circuits. Prince George's County shares the Seventh Judicial Circuit with Calvert, Charles and St. Mary's counties. Currently, the Circuit Court for Prince George's County includes 23 full-time judges, assisted by 7 full-time magistrates in the Family Division, 15 retired judges recalled for part-time service, and about 100 employees.

Circuit Court Role - In Maryland, the Circuit Court is the general jurisdiction trial court. Circuit Courts have exclusive original jurisdiction over jury trials in civil and criminal matters and non-jury trials in equity matters involving family law and other matters. In addition, the circuit court tries appeals from the District Court, either in new trials or by review of the record, and reviews proceedings before state and county administrative agencies.

Becoming a Circuit Court Judge - Theoretically, Circuit Court judges are elected and serve 15 year terms; in practice, however, most are appointed by the Governor to fill vacancies. Since in 1970, each Maryland governor has established Judicial Nominating Commissions to review the qualifications of judicial applicants and fills a vacancy by appointing a new judge from the list of persons recommended by that court's Judicial Nominating Commission.

After appointment, the new judge serves until the next general election, when they must stand for election. Anyone meeting the minimum requirements of the Maryland Constitution may run against the appointed judges. All candidates who file for election appear on both the Democratic and Republican primary ballots and the winner(s) of each party primary appear on the general election ballot without party affiliation identification. The person(s) certified by the general election results then serve a 15-year term, when they may run for reelection to another 15-year term.

How many openings are there in any given year - The number of open positions in any given election year, meaning the number we can vote for, depends on how many, if any, sitting judges have reached the end of a 15-year term, and how many vacancies, if any, have been filled since the last election. For example,

- 2016: no one had completed a 15-year term but 4 had been appointed to fill vacancies; we voted for up to 4.
- 2018: 1 judge had finished a 15-year term and 5 had been appointed; we voted for up to 6.
- 2020: 1 reached 15 years and 4 vacancies had been filled; we voted for up to 5.

What makes 2022 an unusually important year – This year, no PGC Circuit Court judge has reached the end of a 15-year term and there has been only one vacancy filled since 2020. Thus, there is only one opening, and the newly appointed judge will be alone in defending her appointment in a race with at least 4 challengers. While "sitting judges" generally have a substantial advantage and challengers do not often succeed in unseating a sitting judge, the odds in a race with only one open position are considerably different.
