
# Coutts Crossing Public School Newsletter

#### P&C AGM

Come along to the 2020 P&C Annual General Meeting tomorrow, Tuesday 18th February, in the school hall at 9.30am.

The role of the P&C is to promote the interests of the school by bringing parents, community, students and teaching staff into close cooperation; assisting in providing additional resources for the school community; providing valuable feedback to the school and Department of Education; and assist the teaching staff through providing valuable feedback during school planning and management processes.

Nominations will be called at the meeting. If members are not able to attend the AGM they must submit apologies to the P&C and indicate in writing if they are happy to accept nomination to a position or wish to nominate for a position. For a member to be eligible to vote or stand for office, they must be financial at least one meeting prior. If more than one person is nominated for a committee position, a secret ballot will be conducted by those present during the meeting. The executive committee positions available on the P&C are: President, Secretary, Treasurer and Vice President.

#### **Violin lessons**

Violin lessons will be starting in week 5. These lessons will provide a wonderful introduction to music for students who are thinking about learning to play any instrument. An expression of interest has been sent home with students in years 3&4 today. There will be limited positions available in the violin group. Interested students should get their expressions of interest back to school as soon as possible.

#### **Classroom organisation**

Our school has continued to grow this year with many new enrolments for 2020. Increased numbers across our infant years has created a need to restructure our infants cohort into a K/1 composite class and a 1/2 composite class. All families and students effected by this change have already been notified.

#### **School Fees**

An annual general voluntary contribution fee of \$50 is levied for each student, with a reduced fee for siblings. This money is used to purchase all resources needed for each student and subsidise or cover additional school activities and excursions. Coutts Crossing Public School has always strived to minimise any cost of education for students. The payment of voluntary contributions will allow the school to continue to offer special opportunities to students that would otherwise not be accessible or affordable.

Fees can be paid online via our website, or by cash or cheque at the school office. We understand that at the start of the year other expenses have been a priority, such as uniforms and school photos, so we ask that school fees be paid by the end of Term 1.

#### Leader Induction Assembly

This year we will continue to hold assemblies on Wednesday afternoons every second week if schedules and extra curricula events allow. Our first assembly of the year will be our special leader induction assembly where our captains, vice captain and sport captains will be officially inducted into their new roles and receive their badges. This assembly will be held on Wednesday, 12th February at 2.30pm. All welcome.

The 2020 official school photos, for individuals and class groups, will be taken on Thursday 5th March. Each student will be given an order envelope to return on the day. Envelopes can also be held at the office if returned prior. Please follow the instructions on the envelope for ordering and payment.

We are incredibly grateful for their kindness and ongoing support.




#### Classroom News - 1/2


