Social

Most schools utilize social media to engage with students, parents and the greater school community. Get to know the person at your school responsible for social media. Make it simple and provide content for each post.

Change It Up: Use a variety of content for maximum engagement, such as short videos, fun graphics and simple and straightforward, plain text to grab attention quickly.

Use All Platforms: Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, or maybe even TikTok? Where can you creatively show up online to create buzz around your yearbook?

Simple Is Best: Don't lose important details! Avoid busy backgrounds and using decorative fonts difficult to read. Try dark backgrounds with light text or white backgrounds with dark text.
