



What is required to develop an appropriate Standard?

REGULATORY SPECTRUM

Law (government legislation) Co-regulation, including Australian Standards called up in regulation Standards Quasi-regulation, including Australian Australia Standards endorsed by government Self-regulation, including Australian Standards, industry codes Non-regulatory solutions e.g. information program No action

STARTING POINT

AS 1668.2-1991: Primary reference in BCA

Early 2000 – work on new edition

Published in 2002

No adoption into the BCA







Round 11






