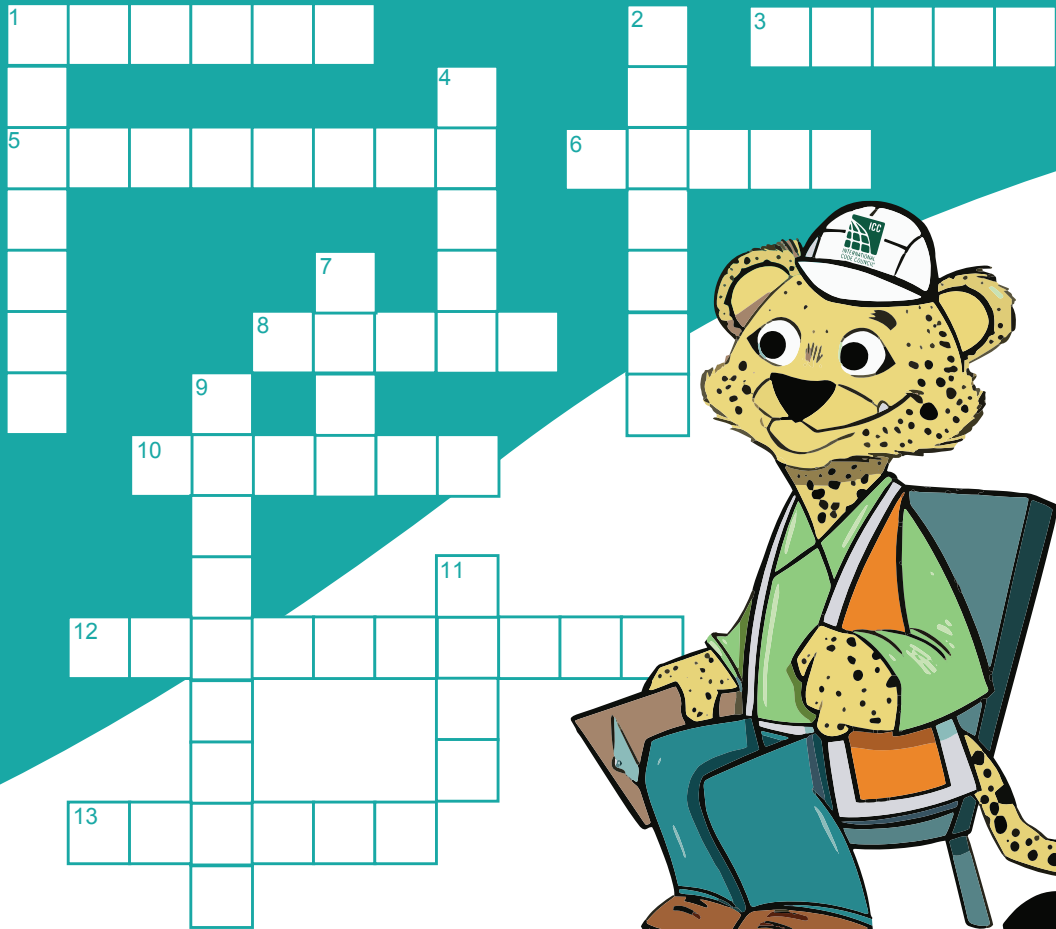


CROSSWORD PUZZLE

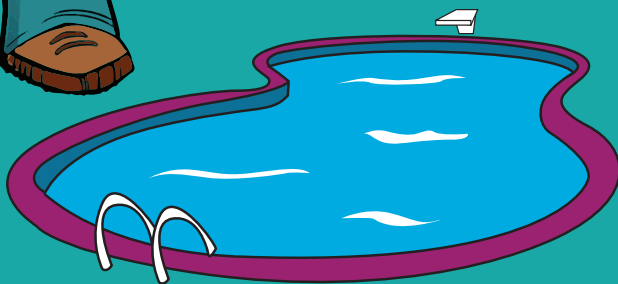

Be sure to always have a safety kit around the house in case of bad weather. Circle 10 items to include in the kit.

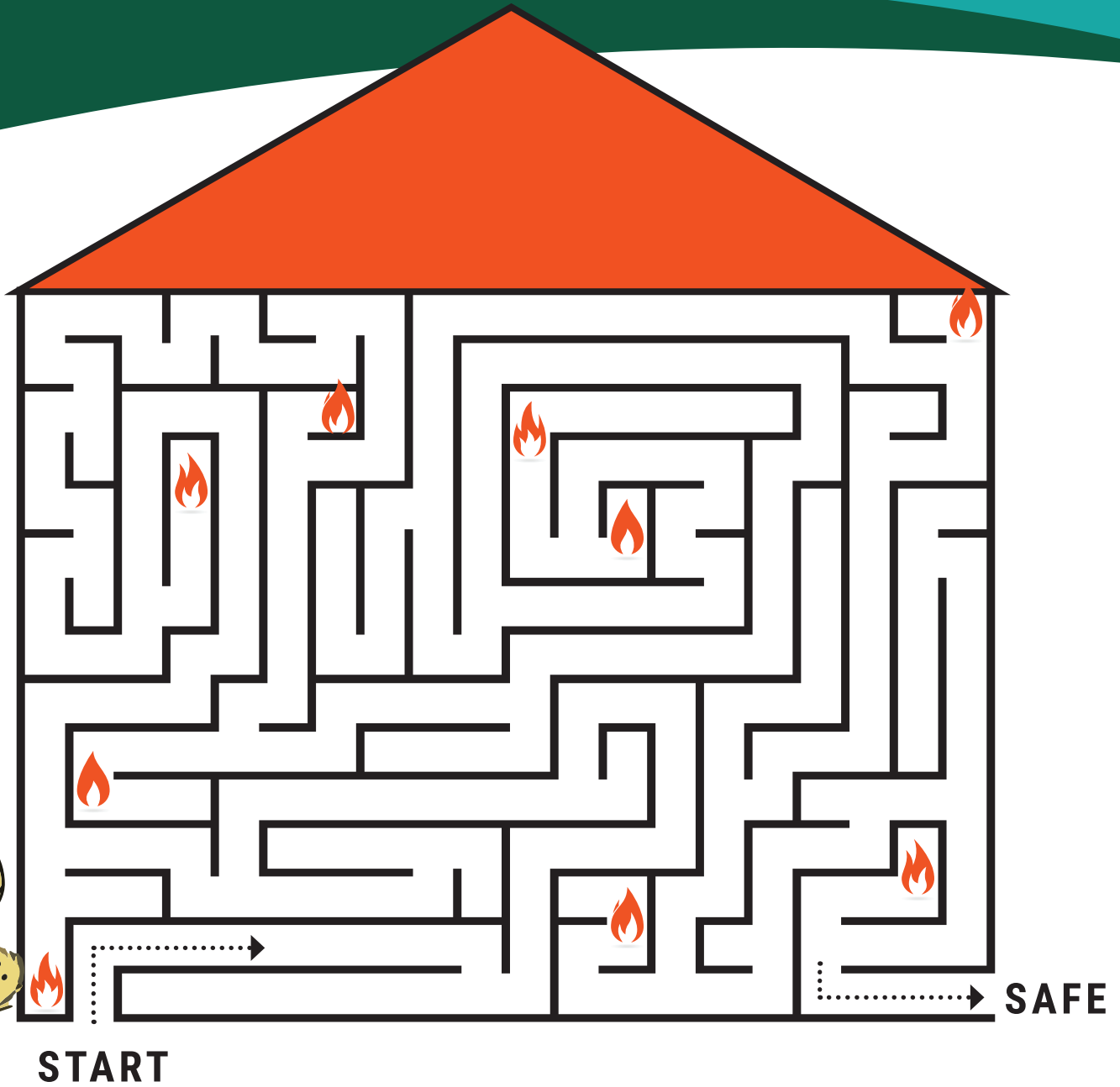
