Research Interests:

My research interests are primarily focused on developing strategies to improve the care of children who require mechanical circulatory support, particularly ventricular assist devices (VAD). I am interested in exploring: 1) methods to improve/assist clinical decision making regarding timing of device implantation 2) strategies to improve the clinical outcomes of patients in high risk categories (single ventricle physiology, young infants) 3) the psychological impact of VAD care.

I am also interested in exploring the utility of erythropoietin in reducing transfusion burden for patients with cyanotic congenital heart disease. Last, I have a developing interest in utilizing the electronic medical record to develop early warning systems for decompensation in hospitalized patients with critical cardiac disease.
