





Taking charge, young

With its innovative solar technology ideas involving re-used materials, Shams Generation engages school, college and university students besides public at large through different programmes and workshops to teach them conservation, writes Umer Nangiana

ith one of the highest per capita waste generation rates globally, Qatar has a huge incentive for re-use and re-cycling of materials besides an efficient waste-management. According to one study, Qatar produced 28,000 tonnes of solid house waste per day in 2012.

The per capita waste generation in Qatar ranges between 1.6kg to 1.8kg each day, one of the highest in the world.

While the government is making efforts to reduce these numbers as much and as

soon as possible, the primary responsibility for developing the culture of re-use and re-cycling lies with the residents of the country, the mass consumers of goods that add to waste every day.

And the bulk of this social responsibility stems from behavioural change. The best bet therefore, would be to prepare a whole generation for it. And the best time to inculcate such values in them is when they are young.

At Shams Generation, they are aiming to do exactly this; teach them when they are young. A CSR (Corporate Social Responsibility) initiative established by Qatar

Solar Technologies (QSTec), Shams Generation is a learning programme that combines art and science to teach children the importance of reusing and solar

With its innovative solar technology ideas involving reused materials, Shams Generation engages school, college and university students besides public at large through different programmes and workshops to teach them conservation. And the efforts have been result-oriented.

With more and more educational institutions coming on board, Shams Generation

has triggered broad interest in the field. They recently held a workshop for children at Qatar Foundation, Garangao at Al Shaqab which was attended by more than 400 children.

Encouraged to design and construct miniature TV sets using solar panels and re-used material, the response from children was so overwhelming the organisers ran out of materials (solar panels). The workshop ended well before the estimated closing time, Amru Elfil, Events and Outreach Supervisor at Shams Generation, tells Community.

"We are teaching the basics

of solar energy to children. It is about what solar energy is, its different components and how it works. We try and give them simple examples with the aim to motivate children to be more interested in science and at the same time mix it up with arts," says Elfil.

All their projects are developed in-house within the company. This workshop for children was level I which is a basic introductory level. It introduces children to the idea of solar energy, sustainability and sustainable practices.

It was interesting watching

children building miniature TV sets, says Elfil. They would take a box of small size and cut a hole in it. Using a tracing paper, they would then draw whatever favourite characters or symbols

they have and paint them. The solar panels are then inserted at the bottom of the box which power the light and project it on the tracing paper, making it

look like a TV set.
At the workshop, there were Shams Generation supervisors who monitored the activity. They were there just to make sure that everything was available for the children but the children would do everything by themselves.

"I think it was the hands-on approach that attracted so many children to the workshop. It was quite interesting for a child to interact with a solar panel. It sounds like something from Star Wars or something out of their reach, but it was actually in their hands," explains Elfil.

"They see and touch it and they understand how it works. And then, they use it to see how it works. We had long queues here with children waiting to get a turn to participate in the activity. We were racing ourselves to catch up with the children," he adds.

In this workshop activity, the children were taught the basics of what is solar energy and why re-using is important. They were given examples on how much waste every individual produces in Qatar, why it is important to re-cycle and manage waste.

Elfil says they are aware that children pick up very quickly and that is why children were very interested in this activity.

He says Shams Generation usually follows up with the children who participate in such workshops. They are given a web address from where they can interact with the platform.

"We have one child who participated with us last year.

And he was very much into the programme so we gave him the advanced kit and now we are following up with him as well. Now he is a level III child and he is making his videos and getting feedback on the work that he has done," reveals Elfil.

He says they have a very big pool of such children who are interacting with them. Not just that, they have schools that are constantly approaching them, asking them to come onboard. Today, they have six schools asking them to be part of the programme.

"There are quite a few things that we are trying to achieve through this programme. We are trying to implement this programme in every school in Qatar and the schools along with the Ministry of Education have realised the importance of such programmes and the hands-on approach to education," says Elfil, adding they have already succeeded in many avenues.

At the workshops, they keep changing the ideas to make them more interesting. The workshops in the public domain are very different from that of school programmes. The school programmes involve teachers, who, then, implement these programmes with their students. Every school, Elfil says, has

a different way of looking at it. For example, they did it with one school on the theme of marine life and on robots with another school. "It is interesting to see that everyone implements it in a different way with different kind of materials. But it is attracting huge interest," says Elfil.
Working closely with teaching

and learning professionals, QSTec aims to develop the Shams Generation initiative into an annual program that will grow to become an established component of the participating schools science and learning curriculum.

NU-Q prepares students for global engagement

n an effort to underscore global understanding, students at Northwestern University in Qatar (NU-Q) take part in a wide array of planned activities ranging from study abroad to research trips, and exposure to developing countries through service learning.

In 2015-16, these experiences included a Global Media Experience programme in Dubai and New York City, screenings of student work at the Cannes Film Festival, assistance to the underprivileged in Vietnam as well as inter-campus study in communication and journalism on NU's home campus in Evanston, Illinois among others. In academic credit-bearing travel and student affairs arranged service programmes, over the course of an academic year, there are more than 80 opportunities for NU-Q students to participate in an international experience.

"NU-Q students are being prepared to live and work anywhere in the world by virtue of a veritable menu of global experience options that give them exposure to other people, cultures and traditions," said Everette E Dennis, Dean and CEO. "This is not only valuable but essential in an increasingly competitive global environment. Qatar is positioning itself as a global player, which means that for our students, global exposure is critical. At NU-Q, globalisation begins with our diverse student body from some 31 countries plus prowess in multiple languages and a desire to truly master the knowledge that will help them navigate change."

Northwestern's Journalism Residency programme is a 10-week internship that all journalism majors are required to complete. Students are placed with leading media and communications institutions in the Middle East, Europe, and the United States, where they learn how to deliver high-quality content under deadline pressure, as well as hone their news judgment, sharpen their fact-checking and research skills, build confidence in their capabilities, and explore new career paths not previously considered.

Among the companies who have hosted NU-Q students are National Geographic TV, VICE News, Financial Times, and Fleishman-Hillard and Grayling public relations

"NU-Q makes the residency a requirement because it enables students to learn professional skills and life lessons that can only be developed in a demanding, fastpaced business environment," said Mary Dedinsky, director of the journalism programme.

This year, as part of the residency programme, students worked for prestigious outlets in New York, London, and Doha, Chantelle D'Mello worked at the Huffington Post in New York where she tackled a wide range of subjects. "It tests your ability to shift tone. It tests your ability to talk to different audiences because someone who is reading about sea bunnies might not necessarily read a Trump piece," D'Mello said.

Another NU-Q students participating in the Journalism Residency programme was Aamer Hassan, an avid sports fan. particularly of tennis and European football. But, as an intern at USA Today, he received a crash course in the US sports scene. "USA Today Sports is such great place to be," Hassan said. "One of the things I learned here is how to communicate... communicating with students is different from

talking to people who have experience in the field. Basically, you sit down and talk with them, share ideas, you agree or disagree, but you come up with the solution."

While developing their journalism and strategic communication skills through the residency programme is a requirement for all Journalism majors, the university also offers students the opportunity to meet and network with global media leaders through its Global Media

Experience programme.
Each year NU-Q takes students on a career exploration trip to two international media hubs – Dubai and New York City — to provide them with a first-hand look at how the theoretical concepts that they learn in the classroom come to life at highly successful media organisations. This year, the trip visited ABC Eyewitness News, Made in NY Media Center, Vice, and OSN, BPG Public Relations, and Dubai Media City.
"As future leaders in the

media industry and international businesses, it is important for students to have a strong understanding of the global media industry and how rapidly changes are taking place. In addition, this gives our students an opportunity to meet with leaders in the media and business worlds to discuss their careers and receive advice on how to achieve career success," said Greg Bergida, director of student affairs and organiser of the trip.

"As media students, we found the topics...brought up were very relevant to our industry. The organisations we visited brought a new perspective to the table. It has encouraged us to look into upcoming trends in the media and be critical of them," said Ammar Younas, a junior in the communication programme

In addition to providing students with the academic and professional resources needed for professional success, the university also encourages all of its students to be engaged in service. This year NU-Q students participated in a servicelearning trip to Vietnam, which gave them the experience of a new culture, as well as offering them the opportunity to make a positive impact in the global community through service. In Vietnam, students prepared and served meals at a local soup kitchen and provided tutoring in conversational English to university students.

One of the students noted that the service learning trips are "deeply humbling, and very important for university life. Even though our experience was short term, it is transformational in thinking about long-term goals and plans for the rest of our lives. That kind of awareness is key to living a more service-oriented life," said Alva

"Northwestern's goal," Dennis said, "is to develop a well-rounded, globally aware citizen who is prepared to be engaged with their community as well as prepared to be a leader in media, business, and government as a professional communications executive?







Golden rules for an easy summer move

he nicer weather and longer days of summer make it the ideal season for moving. In fact, people move during the summer months. While it's exciting to settle into a new home, the logistics and process of moving can feel overwhelming.

If you're getting ready to pack up and ship out to a new home this summer, follow these tips for an easier move:

Prep for packing

Save time by ordering your moving supplies like boxes, labels, bubble wrap and packing tape online. Sometimes you can collect boxes at work or ask your local grocery store if they have any available.

Purge before packing

Less is better when it comes to moving your belongings. It's much easier to throw away, donate, sell or give away items that you don't

need than it is to pack them and move them.

Pack smart

Begin with out-of-season and non-essential items. Start early to avoid the stress of last-minute rushing. It's OK to leave a box open; it's much easier to tape a box shut on moving day than it is to pack at the last moment.

Label boxes well

It only takes a moment to label a box, but it can save you hours of frustration later. Start by labelling the room the box belongs in and then add details about contents including warnings such as "fragile." As you load the truck, try to keep boxes from each room grouped together.

Reserve a truck early

Transfer services

In addition to changing your address, call service providers and utilities to discontinue cable TV and trash collection. Consider scheduling cut-off for a day or two after you move, just in case there is a delay and you still need those services.

Ready the evening before

Pick up your truck rental the evening before the move to save time on moving day. Mover company professionals will get you familiarised with your vehicle and help you verify the best driving directions to your new

Start early

By leaving early in the morning, you'll run into less traffic and have extra time to unload at your destination. Take turns driving and take breaks once every two to three hours. Be patient and drive within the speed limits.



Drive wise

Moving trucks are taller, wider and heavier than passenger vehicles. Keep in mind they require more distance to stop. Be aware of low-hanging tree branches and building overhangs. Park only in well-lit areas and keep the rear door padlocked and the passenger compartment doors locked.

Keep important items close

The movie is a psychological thriller in which Bajpayee plays a mentally unwell man who is unable to decipher between what is real and what is his imagination. After Kunder put it up on YouTube, it got some decent responses. His movies have more or less always been

panned by critics, so one would think that he had managed to turn a corner.

But then the movie got marred in a controversy. A Nepali filmmaker put up a Facebook post saying that he had made a short film and found *Kriti* had many similarities to it. Kunder says that the Nepali film was released online in May and he had finished shooting in February, so he couldn't have copied. But the Nepalese filmmaker had also shown the movie last October to a select group of friends online, and insinuates that that was how Kunder might have seen it.

willing to suffer for it.



There are also small miniature chairs for children, which can be used as gift items.

"The glittering pieces that you see in the corner are actually Moroccan ashtrays and some handmade brass and steel vases with mirror finish. The artworks hanging above them are printed canvas covered with fancy glass," says Khir.

Most of the artwork is calligraphic representation of Qur'anic verses and other Arabic

expressions, in addition to names of God. The paintings are a collection from an artist from Bahrain.

Usually such artworks are copied trends from original copyrighted artworks. But not here.

"We buy the original artwork from the artist to do the printing. We have artists from Bahrain, Saudi Arabia and Bahrain but now we are trying to include Qatari artists as well," says the interior designer. He hopes they will have other lines as well from Qatari artists in future.

Bluribbon Design Atelier, Khir says, is a wide multidisciplinary agency focusing an approach to interior design languages, strategies and research.

"It is not a univocal choice but a skill that makes it possible to have the widest possible vision on design.
