
A New Year is upon us. I hope and pray, that it will be healthy, happy, prosperous, and joyous for you. Happy New Year!

We also attend theater events and take day trips to interesting sights in the area. We're always willing to expand upon these ideas if proposed events have the potential for drawing a good crowd.









WINTER YOUTH RETREAT

JANUARY 22 - 24, 2016

"THE BIBLE TELLS ME SO"

This year our retreat theme is based on learning more about the Bible. God used a number of people to create the Bible and put it all together for us. Who were these people? When did they write the Bible? Is the Bible in chronological order? Should we start reading from Genesis and finish at Revelation? If you do not know the answers to the above questions, this retreat is for you. We will also take a look at some hard questions about social issues that face us during our time and how the Bible addresses a number of these questions.

The Bible has been given to each and every one of us to read and understand how it can be used to live a better life here on earth. It tells wonderful stories that can be used as metaphors to understand how to live on this earth with others. And it also tells us the wonderful story of the life of Jesus Christ.
