

**Poe after-school program:** We're looking for volunteers to assist with our Poe Middle School food ministry, October through May. We have four teams, and each team serves one Tuesday per month. The Caring Ministries team makes personal visits to AUMC members who are homebound, in a nursing or retirement home, in the hospital or at home being treated for an illness or recovering from surgery. Tutoring is on Wednesdays in the Mission Center fellowship hall, 3:45–5:45 p.m. We provide homework assistance to students in grades 1–9. We also need people who enjoy being read to by students.
