Strong growth in education and health










Economic snapshot – Exports

Roads

- NH-8 Mumbai-Vadodara-Delhi (western express highway) touches Dadra & Nagar Haveli. All villages in the union territory are connected by road.
- NH-251 Connecting Una in Gujarat and Ghoghla in the union territory of Daman & Diu.
- The proposed eight-lane Baroda-Mumbai expressway will pass through the states of Maharashtra, Gujarat and Dadra & Nagar Haveli, thereby opening investments in the union territory.
- In January 2020, the Ministry of Road Transport & Highways assigned a new motor vehicle registration mark "DD" to 'Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu' for registration of vehicles




Airport


- A domestic airport is located in Diu with flights to and from Mumbai, Ahmedabad and Bhuj.
- The airport handled 5,260 passengers until October 2020 in FY21.
- In August 2020, the Government of India launched a Regional Connectivity Scheme, Udan (Ude Desh Ka Aam Nagrik), in an attempt to connect small cities of India with each other. Under this scheme, passengers in Diu will now be able to fly to and from Surat and Vadodara.

- The Electricity Department is a part of the Administration of Union Territory of Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu, headed by the Secretary (Power).
- Of the total installed capacity in FY21*, 500.49 MW was managed by central utilities. Thermal power plants accounted for a significant share in the total installed capacity with 684.49 MW, whereas nuclear energy and renewable energy contributed 16 MW and 39.83 MW, respectively.
- Under the State Budget 2019-20, the government proposed Rs. 28.03 crore (US\$ 0.38 million) for various schemes under the power sector.
- The industrial sector is the largest consumer of electricity, followed by the domestic sector. The Electricity Department controls power infrastructure in the state.

Physical infrastructure – Telecom





- As of June 2020, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu had 0.73 million telephone subscribers
- As of June 2020, the Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu had 0.73 million wireless subscribers. Tele-density stood at 70.53%.





- The union territory follows 'Samagra Shiksha', a programme for the school education sector extending from pre-school to class 12 and has the broader goal of improving school effectiveness in terms of equal opportunities for schooling and equitable learning outcomes.
- Most students migrate to other states to pursue higher education after completing their higher secondary education.
- The 'New Education Policy' will help in the development of higher education infrastructure within the boundaries of this union territory.

- As per the Union Budget 2019-20, the government allocated Rs. 119.32 crore (US\$ 16.1 million) to Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Rs. 33.88 crore (US\$ 4.5 million) to Daman & Diu in the form of various schemes to the health services sector.
- In 2018, the Central Government approved to set up the first medical college in Daman & Diu for which Rs. 189 crore (US\$ 25.6 million) had been approved.
- The upcoming private hospitals in Dadra & Nagar Haveli are Ayush Hospital with 50 beds and a cancer hospital and nursing hostel with 100 beds.

Industrial infrastructure



- The Union Territory Administration is responsible for the development of Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu.
- The Industrial Policy 2018 announced by the Union Territory Administration provides a strong momentum for industrial growth and employment generation
- There are over 7,100 industrial units in the union territory, of which 85% are MSMEs
- In Daman & Diu, the key industries are plastic, pharmaceuticals and texturising units and in Dadra & Nagar Haveli, textile, basic metal and rubber & plastic products are the key industries.
- In December 2020, Hindalco Industries announced plans to set up 34,000 tonne aluminium extrusion plant worth Rs. 730 crore (US\$ 99.28 million) at Silvassa.

Industrial estates



- There are 39 industrial estates in Daman and 3,292 industrial units, of which 2,929 are in the small-scale sector. Two industrial areas have been developed by the OIDC at Daman and other industrial areas are located in Dabhel, Bhimpore, Kachigam and Kadaiya.
- In Dadra & Nagar Haveli, there are 3,175 industrial units, of which 2,620 are in the micro and small sector and 590 in the medium and large-scale sector.
- It is estimated that the industry alone provides employment to 120,000 people in the union territory.
- The key sectors with a large presence includes polyester and coon yarn (80% of India's polyester yarn is reportedly made in Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu), plasticisers, papers, and petroleum by products such as lube oils, pharmaceuticals, plastics, electrical conductors and marble tiles.



Key sectors – Marine products



- The approximate length of coastline in Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu is 27 km with 7 landing centers.
- About 1,500 trawlers and mechanised boats are engaged in fishing in the union territory.
- The marine catch comprises oil sardines, shrimps, Indian mackerel, Bombay duck, croakers, cephalopods, other sardines and threadfin breams.
- As there is a large scope of investment in packaging, processing, preservation and export of coastal fish in the union territory, the xx is expected to provide better infrastructure facilities such as fishery harbour, preservation and processing infrastructure, cold chain with insulation transport facilities, etc.




