Hau Mitakuyepi. The Koska Society is going well, we have a consistent membership of around 10-12 boys ranging from 5th-10th grade.

Our last day of riding for the fall season was October 15th 2012. Red Wing Thomas, a guest speaker, came on Oct 22nd. He is the language teacher in Flandreau SD and hails from Santee NE. Red Wing also has his own drum group-"Mato Pejuta", Red Wing used the traditional creation story of the earth and sky to do an oral Dakota Language lesson. He also taught the Koska Society to do basic introductions in the Dakota lapi. He is very motivational in his teaching methods and in two and a half hours, he covered everything from Dakota language, Dakota culture, horse culture, kinship words, and pride in self-identity. In the month of November, the Koska Society will celebrate Native American Month by taking part in cultural activities at Redwood Valley High School. We have many more activities planned for our Koska Society, like drumstick making and hand drum making to name a couple. The Father & Son drum night is also going very well with the Koska being consistent on participation. A special set of drum sticks and a drum

Dakota Wicohan is honored to be a part of these events, and look forward to participating!

The events are as follows:

October 25, 2012-Tipi Painting

One tipi will be painted with handprints by the 6th grade youth, Dakota Studies Class, and the youth and staff of the Indian Education Department at 8:30 a.m. Handprints in red, blue, yellow and green will signify unity.

November 1, 2012-Banner Presentation and set up Tipis

Dakota Wicohan will present a banner with the Redwood Valley School District's mission statement with the Dakota Language translation to the Redwood Valley School staff and students at 8:30 a.m. Following that, a history on the tipis will be shared with the youth and staff, and then the two tipis will be set up and remain on the school grounds throughout the month of November.

November 5, 2012-Pledge of Allegiance

The Pledge of Allegiance will be said in Dakota by Grace Goldtooth-Campos and in Dine by Pete Nez over the announcement system in the morning.

November 8, 2012-Cooking Demonstration

A traditional Dakota food cooking demonstration will take place in the home economics classroom. We will be sharing frybread, waskuya, psdayapi, wozapi and squash with the Dakota Studies and 6th grade students and staff.

November 21, 2012-Dance Performance

The Native Pride Dancers will be performing along with some of the local Native American youth at the Redwood Valley School Gymnasium from 8:45-10:00am.
