Fall 2018 - Undergraduate Supplemental Application Worksheet

Use this worksheet to help prepare your materials for electronic submission via the UCLA Arts Supplemental Application website.

Access to the UCLA Arts Supplemental Application is granted on a rolling basis to all applicants who have completed the UC Undergraduate Application between November 1-30 and have selected Dance as their first choice major to UCLA.

Approximately 1-5 business days after submitting your UC Undergraduate Application, you may access your department supplemental application at *https://supplemental.arts.ucla.edu*. To log in, you will need your UC Application ID.

There will be a \$55.00 <u>non-refundable</u> processing fee associated with this supplemental application. You will be prompted when you sign in to the online upload system, and this fee is payable by credit card or echeck. If you have received a UC fee waiver, you will not be responsible for this additional fee and will not see the payment prompt.

Please turn off your email spam filter and/or include "arts.ucla.edu" and "ucla.edu" as accepted recipients.

All applicants are required to meet minimum UC academic eligibility to be considered for admission. To view eligibility requirements for prospective freshmen, please visit http://www.universityofcalifornia.edu/admissions/freshman/requirements/index.html. Prospective transfers, please visit http://admission.universityofcalifornia.edu/transfer/index.html.

Applicants must select Dance as their first choice major to be eligible for review. If you want to change your major, the UC application will accept changes up through November 30 (11:59pm PST).

Your supplemental application must be submitted by <u>December 15 (11:59pm PST)</u>. This is a strict deadline, please plan ahead to avoid any unexpected technical delays at the last minute. Late, incomplete, or hard copy application material will not be considered.

Make sure you review all categories before you submit your supplemental application. You may log in/log out of the system as many times as needed during the filing period, but once the application is submitted, you will not be able to make **ANY** corrections or additions. You will receive an email confirmation within 24 hours after you have submitted your supplemental application.

2. UNOFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS (in PDF format)

If you are a freshman applicant, upload a PDF copy of your current high school transcript.

If you are a <u>sophomore-level transfer</u> applicant, upload PDF copies of all colleges you have attended since high school, as well as your final high school transcript.

If you are a <u>junior-level transfer</u> applicant, upload PDF copies of all colleges you have attended since high school.

Do not mail your transcripts. The University of California only requests hard copy transcripts from students who have been admitted and matriculated to a campus.

All unofficial transcripts MUST be generated from their respective institutions, and must include the name of the institution as well as the student's full name. Please redact/black out your Social Security number.

3. PERSONAL STATEMENT

The Dance BA integrates composition, training, and improvisation, while challenging students to locate dance politically, culturally, and historically. What experiences or goals do you have that align with this point of view of how art and society intertwine?

You will have 3500 characters (including spaces) / approximately 500 words. We recommend that you write your statement in a separate word processing program, then cut and paste it into the web application.

4. AUDITION

All applicants must audition either in person or by video.

You will be asked to perform a <u>one-minute piece</u> of your own choreography in a style most comfortable to you. We encourage the presentation of composition studies that reflect study/interest in any dance traditions.

Live Audition

The UCLA Department of World Arts and Cultures/Dance will host their Dance auditions on **Friday**, **February 2, 2018**, in Glorya Kaufman Hall.

The audition will consist of your **one-minute individual showing**, as well as **participation in group classes** offering a warm-up and two styles of movement. You are not expected to be experienced in these styles: the faculty will be watching to see how you take on new movement.

In your individual showing, please be prepared to introduce yourself and briefly describe the name (if any) of the choreographed piece, the music credit (if any), as well as any additional information you feel might be important to the faculty committee. The faculty may also ask you questions about your work and background.

More detailed information about the live audition day, directions to Kaufman Hall, lodging information, and other travel resources are on the last pages of this document.

Video Audition

In the event you are unable to attend the audition in person, you may submit a video in lieu of a live showing. The video should be **no more than four minutes long**, and should include the following:

- A brief introduction and description of what we will be seeing.
- Your one-minute piece of your own choreography in a style most comfortable to you.
- Any additional performance/techniques/choreography. You may show studio or in-performance work.

5. RELATED TOPIC RESEARCH PAPER

A sample research paper that you have written for a class, demonstrating your critical thinking skills.

- 6-12 pages, double-spaced, Times New Roman, 12 point font
- At least **three** (3) external research sources (books, journals, films, etc.) that you have identified. Your reference list may count towards the total paper count.
- A cover sheet or abstract is optional. If you include a cover sheet and/or abstract, they will count towards the 12-page maximum.
- Place your full name and page number in the header of each page.
- Your paper may cover any topic that you see relates to the Dance BA. In this paper, faculty are looking to see how you select a research topic and present your analysis and critical thinking in relation to it.
- Write simply and clearly. A person who has no background in your subject matter, should be able to understand and appreciate your viewpoint.

6. LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

Two (2) Letters of Recommendation are required; <u>one of the two letters must come from an academic instructor</u>. Letters of Recommendation are uploaded through the online supplemental application. The department does not accept hard copy letters.

Recommenders must upload their letters by **January 10 (11:59pm PST)**.

You will list your recommenders in the online supplemental application. A recommendation request will be sent, by email, to each of your references. The email will provide a link where recommenders may upload their letters. The request can be sent at any time provided you meet department deadlines. You can change references or send a reminder through your application.

Contact your references ahead of time, so that they can expect your request for recommendation.

7. OTHER EVIDENCE OF CREATIVITY (Optional)

In support of your application to the Dance major, you may also choose to include relevant work in alternate genres and forms, such as:

Short stories / Creative Writing / Poetry / Visual artwork / Photography / Music

You will be able to upload a maximum of two (2) files in PDF, video, or sound format. You may submit any combination of files, ex. PDF + Video, PDF + Video/Sound, PDF + PDF, etc.

Please provide a brief description of the material(s) you are submitting indicating any source(s) and/or inspiration(s) for your work. You will have a maximum 200 words.

<u>File types accepted</u>: Dvix (Div3/4/5)/DX50, DV, H263, H264/AVC, MPEG-4 Visual, MPEG-1/2, MJPG, MP42/3, IV40/50 (Indeo codecs), RV30/40, RMVB, FLV1/4, VP3/5/6/7/8, SVQ1/3 (Sorenson), XVid, Theora, WMV1/2/3, VC1, VP8, ProRes 422, ICOD, DVCPRO. PXLT, TCSS/TCS2, G2M3/4

SOUND

<u>File types accepted</u>: MP3, MP1/2, AC3, AAC, Vorbis, AMR, PCM, WMA7/8/9, WMSpeech, FLAC, QDM2, RA, Nellymoser, Cook, GSM, SPEEX.

Your media file may consist of video, sound, or the two compiled together as a reel. The <u>total length</u> of the entire compilation should be no more than four (4) minutes.

There is no formal file size limit set for the media files. However, smaller file sizes (less than 480p) may yield faster and easier upload times from most home internet connections, and will be of sufficient quality for the faculty review.

DANCE AUDITION INFORMATION

Dance auditions are scheduled for **Friday**, **February 2**, **2018**, and will be held on the UCLA campus in **Glorya Kaufman Hall**. We are adjacent to the UCLA Anderson School of Management and the intramural fields.

The closest entrance to **Kaufman Hall** is off Sunset Blvd., at Westwood Plaza, which is a signaled entrance onto campus. Shortly after you turn onto campus, you will see a driveway that leads into underground **Parking Lot #4**. If you look to your left as you go down the driveway, you will be looking at Kaufman Hall. All-day parking is **\$12** (as of August 2017 – parking fees are subject to change without notice).

Please leave enough travel time to accommodate for traffic, and for check-in and warm-up.

We will provide water, but you will be responsible for your own food. There are a number of campus eateries nearby where you may purchase meals.

Please plan on being on campus for the whole day, until 5pm.

Please arrive by **8:00 A.M**. for check-in.

GROUP SESSIONS: At the start of the day, you will participate in a group class offering a warm-up and two styles of movement. You are not expected to be experienced in these styles. The faculty will be watching to see how you take on new movement. Attire should be body conscious and in solid, neutral colors. No shoes will be required for these sessions.

During a portion of the morning, the School of the Arts and Architecture admission staff will conduct a Q&A session for family members/guardians in attendance.

Dance Audition Information (cont.)

INDIVIDUAL SHOWINGS: After the group movement sessions, the individual showings will begin at approximately **10:30 A.M**.

For your individual showing, you will perform a <u>one-minute piece</u> of your own choreography in a style most comfortable to you. We encourage the presentation of composition studies that reflect your study/interest in any dance tradition(s). Customary attire for the dance audition is a leotard or otherwise fitted garment(s). You also have the option to wear a costume appropriate to your choreography.

Please be prepared to introduce yourself and briefly describe the name (if any) of the choreographed piece, the music credit (if any), as well as any additional information you feel might be important to the faculty committee. The faculty may also ask you questions about your work and background.

If you are bringing recorded music for your audition, the department will have speakers with .mp3 ports (3.5mm headphone jack). We also have CD players; however you will need to test your CD with a staff member prior to the audition to ensure that it is compatible with our players. Please note that .mp3 players are preferred.

Because of the number of applicants, there may be long periods of waiting. You may leave the building during that time. However, you should be back in enough time to prepare for your scheduled showing. There will be a room available with provided materials about our department and faculty, as well as the UCLA campus. You may also use this room to warm up.

After your individual showing, you are free to leave. Freshman applicants are notified in March of their admission status; transfer applicants receive notification in April.
