The Tournament Director reserves the right to make modifications to the rank, weight & age divisions to make competition in uncontested divisions. **WHITE JUDO GI IS MANDATORY, NO JU-JITSU GIS ALLOWED BRING YOUR OWN BLUE AND WHITE BELTS.**

Eligibility

1. Proof of current ATJA, USJF, USJA or USA Judo membership cards must be presented day-of tournament.
 - a. Any contestant unable to present a current and valid registration card will be required to purchase or renew membership prior to acceptance of the entry form for this tournament.
 - b. USA Judo registration will be available on-site.
2. Minimum age of five (5) years old on the day of the competition.
3. Signed certificate regarding non-black belt contestants (*Attached*).
4. Signed consent for weight change (*Attached*).
5. Signed SafeSport Policy/Waiver & release of liability & agreement to participate (*Attached*).

Rules

WHITE JUDO GI IS MANDATORY, NO JU-JITSU GIS ALLOWED BRING YOUR OWN BLUE AND WHITE BELTS.

All matches will be conducted using the current International Judo Federation Contest Rules with the following modifications:

1. Pre-2003 medical rules will be applied to all age groups under 16 and seniors (17+) not brown belt or above
2. Modified Double Elimination Bracket format for groups 5 or more
3. Round Robin for groups for groups 4 or less
4. Contest area shall be 7x7 meters with required minimum 3 meter safety area.
5. Double knee drop seio-nage **WILL BE allowed** for all divisions.
6. Any competitor who suffers a concussion (as determined by the medical staff) and/or who loses consciousness from head impact will not be allowed to continue competing in the tournament that day in any division. If a competitor suffers such an injury, they are strongly advised to obtain a medical release from their personal physician before returning to train and compete in judo.
7. Players who are choked out are NOT allowed to continue to compete in the tournament.
8. Golden Score (In case of no score in original match)
 - a. 1 min for < 10yr old
 - b. 2 min for 11-16 yr old
 - c. Unlimited for senior & master divisions
9. Match Times:
 - a. 5-6 yr old = 2 mins
 - b. 7-16 yr old & Masters (30+ yr old) = 3 mins
 - c. All other ages = 4 mins
10. Choking Techniques (Shime-waza)
 - a. 13 yr old and up
11. Arm Lock Techniques (Kansetsu-waza)
 - a. Senior Advance (Brown Belt +) and above ranks

Women: (all ranks): 17+ years old. (Weight divisions to be determined by registration). (Note: Modifications to standard weight divisions may be made to insure competition.)

Advance: (Brown & Black Belt) Men: 17+ years old (Weight divisions to be determined by registration). National Weight Divisions will be used if there is sufficient registrations.

Novice: (White-Green Belt) Men: 17+ years old (Weight divisions to be determined by registration).

Masters: 30+ years old. Age & weight divisions to be determined by registration.

Junior Girl's and Boy's Division: Divided by weights to be determined by registration [2 year divisions (i.e., 5-6, 7-8, etc.) are normally used, dependent upon registration.] **Minimum age: 5 years old.** (Note: Juniors who are at least **15 years old** may also compete in the Senior Division for the additional fee & will compete under Senior Rules; Masters may also compete in the Senior Divisions for the additional fee. (Blue & Purple Belt Juniors will compete in the Advanced Senior Division. No junior will compete against anyone more than 15% heavier, unless requesting to be moved up from an uncontested division by the coach or parent).

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY - AGREEMENT TO PARTICIPATE – AUTHORIZATION FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT

In consideration of being permitted to participate in any way, including travel to and from, any and all Judo Tournaments, clinics, practices, and related events and activities of United States Judo, Inc. (aka USA Judo), USJA, USJF, ATJA, the Nevada Judo Association (NJA), and Sports Leadership and Management of Nevada (SLAM NV) I hereby:

1. Acknowledge that I am familiar with the sport of Judo and understand the rules governing the sport of Judo.
2. Agree that, prior to participating, I will inspect the mats, equipment, weapons, facilities, competition pools or divisions, and the elimination or scoring system to be used. If I believe anything is unsafe or beyond my capability, I will immediately advise my coach, supervisor and/or an event/activity official of such conditions and refuse to participate.
3. Acknowledge & fully understand that I will be engaging in a contact sport that might result in serious injury, including permanent disability or death & severe social & economic losses due not only to my own actions, inactions, or negligence, but also to the actions, inactions, or negligence of others, the rules of the sport of Judo, or conditions of the premises or of any equipment or weapons used. Further, I acknowledge that there may be other risks not known to me or not reasonably foreseeable at this time.
4. Knowing the risks involved in the sport of Judo, I assume all such risks & accept personal responsibility for all damages resulting from any such injury, permanent disability, or death. I also grant permission to the event officials to authorize any necessary medical treatment for me, or in the case of a minor age child, I grant permission to the event officials to authorize any necessary medical treatment for my minor child.
5. Release, waive, discharge & covenant not to sue USA Judo, USJA, USJF, NJA, SLAM NV, together with their affiliated clubs, their respective officers, administrators, directors, agents, coaches, clinicians, & other employees or volunteers of the organization(s), event officials, medical personnel, other participants, their parent(s), guardian(s), supervisors & coaches, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers & if applicable, owners, lessors & lessees of premises used to conduct the event, all of whom are hereinafter referred to as Releasee(s), from any & all claims, demands, losses, or damages on account of injury, including permanent disability & death, or damage to property, caused or alleged to be caused in whole or in part by the negligence of the Releasees or otherwise to the fullest extent permitted by law.

SafeSport Policy/Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy:

I, a prospective or current member/licensee/participant of USA Judo or USA Judo event agree to abide by and be bound by the applicable USA Judo Bylaws, Code of Conduct, competition rules and the SafeSport rules, policies and procedures promulgated by the U.S. Center for SafeSport as they may be amended from time to time. I agree to be subject to the jurisdiction of the U. S. Center for SafeSport and agree that any sanctions imposed by the Center extend to my participation in all USA Judo events or activities and may be posted publicly and include information regarding the misconduct involved. The USA Judo SafeSport Handbook can be found at www.usjudo.org.

USA Judo defines "regular contact with minors" as meaningful or direct contact or oversight with minors that would be considered frequent, repeated or consistent. By way of example, an adult who will often assist with coaching/leading classes including minors would be considered "regular contact" with minors and is required to complete the SafeSport Online Training/Certification Course.

An adult who may "drop in" to coach and/or practice with minors on occasion would not be considered frequent, repeated or consistent and would not need to complete the SafeSport Online Training/Certification Course. In the spirit of the moral code of judo, USA Judo requires adult members to self-certify whether or not they considered having "regular contact" with minors based on the aforementioned description. If an adult member is unsure whether or not they have "regular contact" with minors, USA Judo encourages those individuals (and their clubs) to err on the side of caution and complete the SafeSport Training and Certification. USA Judo, in cooperation with USA Judo Clubs, has the right to randomly review and assess members who may have regular contact with minors and require compliance if/when considered necessary by USA Judo Leadership.
