

She has shared her energy and skills in many ways, including: Outreach, Worship, and Faith Journeys Commissions; Social Justice, Pastoral Relations, Nominating, and Endowment Committees; and as both Vice Moderator and Moderator.

Joanne is a newer member of DCC and is a member of our Handbell Choir. She comes to us by way of Florida, Connecticut, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, the San Francisco Bay Area, Pacifica, and is now settled in Pleasanton. While in Florida, she grew up in a family which was dedicated to their Methodist Church. Mary Kay was born into the Congregational church, so to speak. Both her grandparents were Congregational ministers, and her father served on the UCC's National Theological Commission. Thus she has been immersed in conversations about theology from an early age. During a 15 year membership in the Annapolis (MD) UCC, she served on Council and was on the pastoral Relations Committee. In the mid-1970's she was the first woman to serve Communion to a congregation. More recently, she was a member of the Benicia (CA) UCC from 1982-1997. While there, she served on their Council twice, was a delegate to the UCC Conference at Asilomar (CA) twice, and chaired their Building and Grounds Committee three times. Since moving her membership to DCC, she has been active in retreats, workshops, our Lenten and Advent series, and the Women's Spirituality Group. She has overseen three Stewardship campaigns as Commissioner. As a member of the Circles committee Mary Kay became very aware of how Circles and the Diaconate jointly support our Congregation.


Volunteer for Caring Hands

Summer Backpack and School Supplies Drive Sign-up begins July 12

It hasn't been long since school let out for the summer, but July is the time to sign up for our Summer Backpack and School Supplies Drive. By providing a new backpack stuffed with school supplies for one of the 30 or more children of homeless, formerly homeless, and at-risk families now living in SHELTER, Inc. and Contra Costa Interfaith Housing (CCIH) facilities, you'll be helping them to get a good start in school this year. And new this year: we are adding an option to provide gift cards for back-to-school clothes and shoes for SHELTER, Inc. and CCIH kids.

SHELTER, Inc. of Contra Costa County strives to prevent and end homelessness through their homeless prevention programs: providing assistance to individuals and families to stay in their homes; ending the cycle of homelessness by providing temporary housing in combination with supportive services leading to self-sufficiency for homeless families and individuals; and providing affordable and supportive housing to formerly homeless individuals and families. CCIH also provides permanent, affordable housing and vital support services to homeless and atrisk families and individuals in Contra Costa County.

Backpacks and gift cards should be delivered to DCC by Sunday, August 9. Look for information and sign up at the Outreach table during our fellowship time starting on Sunday, July 12. Not a shopper? You can provide back-to-school clothes or shoes for a SHELTER, Inc. or CCIH student with a \$25 Target or Kohl's gift card. You may purchase a gift card or cards yourself, or write a check to DCC with memo "back-to-school gift card."

This is a great opportunity to help break the cycle of homelessness by giving children who have experienced many set-backs and disappointments an incentive to do well in school.

Dayspring's Summer Sessions are in full swing, with the theme "Let's Go Global!" Each week, the children "visit" another continent and celebrate the local culture, cuisine, wildlife, and language. They have been meeting new friends as they enjoy a variety of motor games, stories, art projects, cooking projects, and outdoor water activities which all are based on our global theme. Some favorite outdoor activities have included conducting science experiments, water play while wearing bathing suits, and creating waterways and canals in the sand pit.

During the first four weeks of Summer Session, our teachers and our imaginations will take us on an African Safari, the European Express, and all over North America. Then, our Antarctic Antics will include lessons on polar bears and penguins. The children are always fascinated by the bears' camouflage and how blubber helps to keep them warm. The teachers reinforce the lessons about blubber with classroom experiments using Crisco! The children also love learning that all of the penguin parents have a unique call that their very own chick will recognize and answer.

The children will celebrate the Fourth of July with their very own Dayspring Preschool Independence Day Parade! Dayspring will be hosting the fifth annual TRIKE-A-THON on Wednesday, July 15th to benefit St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in their research and treatment for childhood cancer.
