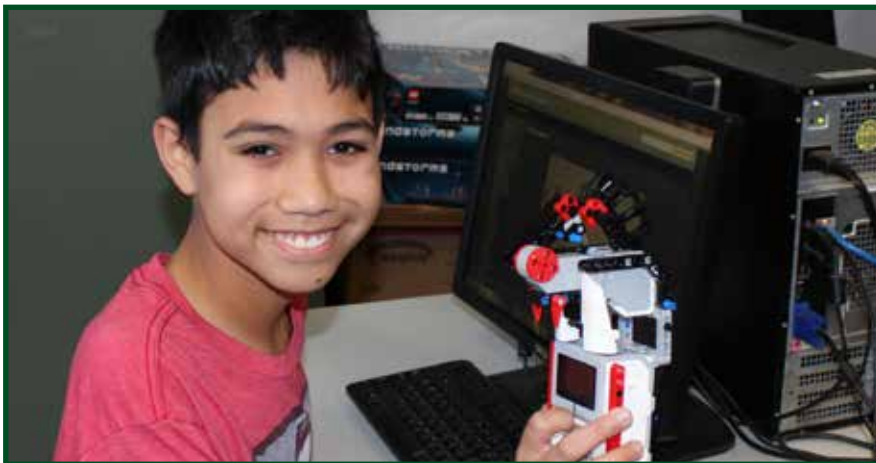

High school students interested in taking a class for credit or preparing for the challenging year ahead will find our High School Curriculum a perfect fit. We offer our traditional summer school classes in nearly all academic disciplines. Ten unit academic courses are open to high school students from any school as long as permission is given from the public school.

Whether middle school students are interested in expanding their writing, math, science skills or developing their artistic or musical talents, our middle school classes and camps are a perfect fit. Our middle school programs are open to students entering fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth grades next year. Students can come for two weeks or stay for the entire month. Each two-week long session makes it possible for students to explore new interests and make friends while experiencing a high school campus. Students can join our Sports Camp, Aquatics Camp or take a variety of academic and enrichment classes.

Our Sports and Aquatic Camps provide group instruction in tennis, swimming, diving, water polo, basketball, and volleyball. The camps are staffed by Garces and non-Garces faculty, coaches and graduates and the focus is on fun. The camps are dedicated to teaching teamwork, sportsmanship and positive self-esteem.

Credit may be withheld if a student is absent more than twice or is tardy more than three times during the equivalent of one semester. High School 10-Unit Credit Courses

THE FOLLOWING COURSES FIRST SEMESTER WILL BEGIN MONDAY, JUNE 21ST AND END WEDNESDAY, JULY 7TH. TIME WILL BE MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY 7:30 A.M. - 12:45 P.M. THE SECOND SEMESTER BEGINS ON THURSDAY, JULY 8TH.

Students who pass these courses will receive 10.0 units towards the fulfillment of a College Prep graduation requirement in the specific subject area. Grades will be assigned on a 4.0 scale and will be posted on the Garces transcript. These grades and units will be used in determining the student's GPA or class rank at GMHS. The grades may be a factor in determining extra curricular eligibility and/or in fulfilling requirements for college admission. Garces students enrolling in the following classes should complete a Summer School Contract with their counselor. Due to the rigor of the 10-unit courses, we cannot make accommodations for general or students with IEPs.

ALGEBRA I

This course is an introduction to the principles of Algebra 1. It satisfies the Garces and CSU mathematics requirement for Algebra I.

Tuition: \$725

(\$400.00 if only registering for one semester)

ALGEBRA 2

This course is designed for students who have completed one year of Algebra I and Geometry. At the completion of the course, the instructor will recommend Garces students for the appropriate placement in the next math course. It satisfies the Garces and CSU mathematics requirement for Algebra II.

Tuition: \$725

(\$400.00 if only registering for one semester)

ART I

This course teaches students a common core of knowledge, develops and refines students' sensibilities, and enables students to express their own creativity. Art I provides experiences with elements and principles of design, art history, color, perspective, human drawings and other various mediums. This class is open to students entering grades nine through twelve. This course meets the Garces Fine Arts requirement for graduation and the Visual and Performing Arts requirement for the University of California and the California State University systems.

Tuition: \$725 (Lab Fee is already included)

(\$400.00 if only registering for one semester)

ECONOMICS/GOVERNMENT

(Semesters 1 & 2)

Students entering grade twelve may take this course for credit. This course will cover basic macro and micro economic principles as well as a detailed analysis of the way the government works. The emphasis is divided equally between the two disciplines. Students are active participants in a fast paced class. Through discussion and a minimum of lecture, students are encouraged to become actively involved in the class. Students should have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 to consider the rigors of this course. This course meets the Garces requirement for graduation and accepted high schools social studies requirement.

Tuition: \$725

(\$400.00 if only registering for one semester)

**Economics is taught in the 1st Semester

ENGLISH

Garces Memorial requires each student to take and pass 8 semesters of English for graduation. This course is designed for those students who want or need to remediate any one or two semesters of English at any level, grades nine through twelve. This class will cover various pieces of literature, elements of grammar, essay structure and vocabulary enhancement. This class will also include oral discussions, tests and a research paper.

Tuition: \$725

(\$400.00 if only registering for one semester)

High School 10-Unit Credit Courses

THE FOLLOWING COURSES FIRST SEMESTER WILL BEGIN MONDAY, JUNE 21ST AND END WEDNESDAY, JULY 7TH. TIME WILL BE MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY 7:30 A.M. - 12:45 P.M. THE SECOND SEMESTER BEGINS ON THURSDAY, JULY 8TH.

Students who pass these courses will receive 10.0 units towards the fulfillment of a College Prep graduation requirement in the specific subject area. Grades will be assigned on a 4.0 scale and will be posted on the Garces transcript. These grades and units will be used in determining the student's GPA or class rank at GMHS. The grades may be a factor in determining extra curricular eligibility and/or in fulfilling requirements for college admission. Garces students enrolling in the following classes should complete a Summer School Contract with their counselor. Due to the rigor of the 10-unit courses, we cannot make accommodations for general or students with IEPs.

GEOMETRY (P)

This course is an introduction to the fundamentals of Euclidean Geometry and explores relationships, principles of geometric figures and deductive thinking of proofs. It satisfies the Garces, and CSU mathematics requirement for graduation.

Tuition: \$725

(\$400 if only registering for one semester)

SPANISH I, II, III

This course is designed for students interested in learning Spanish. Students may enroll in Spanish I, Spanish II or Spanish III. This class fulfills one year of the language requirement for the University of California and the California State University systems.

Tuition: \$725

(\$400 if only registering for one semester)

U.S. HISTORY

This class will be academically rigorous and will parallel the expectations and experience a student would attain during the regular school year. The program in United States History is designed to provide students with the analytical skills and factual knowledge necessary to deal critically with the problems and materials in United States history. Students should learn to assess historical materials- their relevance to a given interpretive problem, their reliability, and their importance—and to weigh the evidence and interpretations presented in historical scholarship. This class fulfills the requirement for Garces and the University of California and the California State University systems.

Tuition: \$725

(\$400 if only registering for one semester)

WORLD HISTORY

Students in grade ten study major turning points that shaped the modern world, from the late eighteenth century through the present, including the cause and course of the two world wars. They trace the rise of democratic ideas and develop an understanding of the historical roots of current world issues, especially as they pertain to international relations. Students develop an understanding of current world issues and relate them to their historical, geographic, political, economic, and cultural contexts. Students consider multiple accounts of events in order to understand international relations from a variety of perspectives. Students should consider that this course is a college prep class and homework will be assigned accordingly. This class fulfills the requirement for Garces and the University of California and the California State University systems.

Tuition: \$725

(\$400 if only registering for one semester)

OTHER CREDIT COURSES

All classes are Monday, June 21 - Friday, July 16.

PLEASE NOTE: THE FOLLOWING CREDIT COURSES WILL MEET MONDAY, JUNE 21ST THROUGH FRIDAY, JULY 16TH. THE CLASS PERIODS OFFERED ARE LISTED BELOW EACH COURSE DESCRIPTION.

Students who successfully pass the following courses will receive units towards the fulfillment of a graduation requirement in the specific subject area. Grades will be assigned on a 4.0 scale and will be posted on the Garces transcript. These grades and units will be used in determining the student's grade point average or class rank at Garces Memorial. The grades may be a factor in determining extra curricular eligibility and/or in fulfilling requirements for college admission. Due to the rigor of the 5-unit courses, we cannot make accommodations for general or students with IEPs.

ALGEBRA I- ACCELERATED, 5 UNITS

This course is equivalent to the second semester of the Algebra I (P) course. This course is designed for incoming freshmen who wish to be considered for Geometry in the fall.

Incoming freshmen: Students who scored below 80% on the second semester equivalent of the Algebra I (P) Challenge Exam are recommended to take this course. At the conclusion of this course, students will be able to retake the entire Algebra I (P) Challenge Exam. If they score between 80-89%, they will be eligible to enroll in Geometry (P) and those who score 90% or above will be eligible to enroll in Honors Geometry. Eighth Grade Algebra I is a prerequisite for this class.

Tuition: \$375

(This class meets for both Periods 1 and 2)

COMPUTER APPLICATIONS, 5 UNITS

This course is designed for students to fulfill their graduation requirement in computer applications. All students are required to successfully complete the computer applications course. Elements included in this requirement include keyboarding (20 correct words per minute), word processing (software skills necessary to produce academic essays and lab science reports), spreadsheets (basic and intermediate data processing skills).

Tuition: \$375

(This class meets for both Periods 1 and 2)

THEOLOGY 9-12, 5 UNITS

This course will fulfill the requirement for any one semester Theology course not passed or received a D during the regular academic year. Only those students who have failed a course or who would like to improve a grade that was given during the academic year are eligible for the course. The topic of the course will be determined by the needs of the students enrolled in the course. This class meets from June 21 to July 16 regardless of which semester you are making up.

Tuition: \$375

(This class meets for both Periods 3 and 4)

HEALTH EDUCATION, 5 UNITS

This course is designed to teach skills for wellness. It offers the students rich opportunities for analyzing their behaviors and learning new ways to create healthy lifestyles. Topics include nutrition and fitness, facts about HIV and AIDS, prevention strategies, while focusing on abstinence, substance abuse, and safety and first aid. Students who successfully pass the Health Education course will receive 5.0 units towards fulfilling their graduation requirements at Garces or any other acceptable high school.

Tuition: \$375

(This class meets for both Periods 3 and 4)

High School Courses

ACADEMIC NON-CREDIT COURSES

Students taking the following classes will receive a pass/fail grade. The grades received in these classes will not factor into the student's grade point average at Garces Memorial nor will the grade be posted on the Garces transcript. No credit toward graduation will be given for these classes.

All classes go from Monday, June 21 - Friday, July 16, except noted otherwise.

ENGLISH 9 SUMMER BRIDGE

This course is designed to introduce and to develop the skills necessary for success in the first year of English at Garces. The focus of the class will be on the development of study skills, vocabulary, grammar, writing, and literature. During second period, students will complete the summer reading requirement for the freshman year. This course is designed for incoming Garces freshmen who were recommended to take this course in their acceptance letter and any incoming freshmen who need or want extra practice.

**non-Garces students may take the 1st period only for \$200.

Tuition: \$350

(This class meets Period 1 and 2)

SUMMER READING GRADE 9

This course is designed to meet the Garces Summer Reading Requirement for students entering the ninth grade. The selections from the required SUMMER READING PROGRAM will be taught in class through writing assignments, oral discussions, direct analysis, and testing. Emphasis will be on the completion and passing of the summer reading requirement.

Tuition: \$200

(Periods 1, 2, 3, or 4)

SUMMER READING GRADE 10

This course is designed to meet the Garces Summer Reading Requirement for students entering the tenth grade. The selections from the required SUMMER READING PROGRAM will be taught in class through writing assignments, oral discussions, direct analysis, and testing. Emphasis will be on the completion and passing of the summer reading requirement.

Tuition: \$200

(Period 4)

SUMMER READING GRADE 10(H)

This course is designed to meet the Garces Summer Reading Requirement for Honors English 10. Classes will be in the seminar format and the tests will be a combination of essays, short answer and objective questions. Emphasis will be on the completion and passing of the summer reading requirement.

Tuition: \$200

(Period 4)

SUMMER READING GRADE 11

This course is designed to meet the Garces Summer Reading Requirement for students entering the eleventh grade. The selections from the required SUMMER READING PROGRAM will be taught in class through writing assignments, oral discussions, direct analysis and testing. Emphasis will be on the completion and passing of the summer reading requirement.

Tuition: \$200

(Period 4)

SUMMER READING GRADE 11 (H)

This course is designed to meet the Garces Summer Reading Requirement for Honors English 11. Classes will be in the seminar format and the tests will be a combination of essays, short answer and objective questions. Emphasis will be on the completion and passing of the summer reading requirement.

Tuition: \$200

(Period 4)

SUMMER READING GRADE 12

This course is designed to meet the Garces Summer Reading Requirement for students entering the 12th grade. The selections from the required SUMMER READING PROGRAM will be taught in class through writing assignments, oral discussions, direct analysis and testing. Emphasis will be on the completion and passing of the summer reading requirement.

Tuition: \$200

(Period 4)

SUMMER READING GRADE 12 (AP) ENGLISH

This course is designed to meet the Garces Summer Reading Requirement for AP English 12. Classes will be in the seminar format and the tests will be a combination of essays, short answer and objective questions. Emphasis will be on the completion and passing of the summer reading requirement.

Tuition: \$200

(Period 4)

INDEPENDENT SUMMER READING

This course is designed to meet the Garces Summer Reading Requirement for any student who can't take the regular reading class due to a conflict. Students will be required to receive and send assignments to the instructor and will come to school to take the tests. The instructor will facilitate the reading experience, but will not conduct a structured class discussion on each book. Students will be expected to read the book entirely on their own; however, they will be able to test on the book once they have finished reading. Students must show up on the first day of school June 21st and meet with Mr. Detloff in Room 6 at the beginning of 4th period to get your first assignment.

High School Courses

ACADEMIC NON-CREDIT COURSES

Students taking the following classes will receive a pass/fail grade. The grades received in these classes will not factor into the student's grade point average at Garces Memorial nor will the grade be posted on the Garces transcript. No credit toward graduation will be given for these classes.

All classes go from Monday, June 21 - Friday, July 16, except noted otherwise.

MATHEMATICS

At the end of the summer session, the course instructor, in conjunction with the specific department chair and the Assistant Principal, will review the students' grade in the summer class. Course placement for the following academic year will be determined by this review.

ALGEBRA I - AN INTRODUCTION

This course is designed for students who wish to get a head start in their fall Algebra I course. The topics of algebraic expression, real numbers and solving of variable equations will be explored. This course will be equivalent to the first quarter of the Garces Algebra I (P) course. This class is recommended for incoming freshmen and for any students who will be taking Algebra I in the fall.

Tuition: \$200

(Periods 1, 2, or 3)

GARCES MATH

This course is designed as a review of basic arithmetic operations and as an introduction to Algebra I. It is also designed for the incoming Garces freshman who was recommended to take Garces Math in the acceptance letter.

Tuition: \$200

(Periods 2, or 3)

High School Courses

ATHLETICS - NON-CREDIT COURSES

All athletic courses for students entering grades nine through twelve will be graded on a pass/fail basis with no unit value applied toward graduation and no grade posted on the Garces transcript.

All classes go from Monday, June 21 - Friday, July 16, except noted otherwise.

SWIMMING

This course will provide quality and safe instruction of basic/intermediate/advanced technique involved in swimming. The focus of the class is to improve your skills and techniques while improving fitness. Each of the four competitive strokes will be learned and/or refined. Conditioning will take place each day. This is a two week course and can be taken either 1st or 2nd session.

Tuition: \$135 each session

(Period 1, 2, or 3)

DIVING

This course introduces the theory and practice of diving drills necessary to use the one-meter diving board. Emphasis is placed on performance of basic dives. No formal experience is necessary to take this class and is the perfect way to introduce a child to the sport of diving and provide a format for improvement. Kids of all ages and skill levels are welcome to participate. Divers must be comfortable swimming in deep water. This is a two week course and can be taken during the 1st or 2nd session.

Tuition: \$135

(Period 2)

BEGINNING WATER POLO

An introduction into the sport of water polo, this class will cover the basics of eggbeater, heads-up freestyle, passing, shooting, and the rules of the game. Prerequisite: Students must be able to swim 50 yards heads-up freestyle, 50 yards backstroke, and tread water for three minutes. This is a two-week camp and can be taken either 1st or 2nd session.

Tuition: \$135 each session

(Period 4)

JV/VARSITY WATER POLO AND SWIM CONDITIONING

This course is designed for any incoming freshman and all current high school water polo players and swimmers, boys and girls, who are interested in playing water polo or participating on the swim team at high school. Strength and Conditioning will be held in the weight room on Monday and Wednesday mornings. Swimming and "in water" conditioning will occur on Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Students that wish to swim four day per week, have that option of swimming instead of weights. Students who plan on participating in water polo or swim are strongly encouraged to attend this class.

Tuition: \$150

Time: 6:00 a.m. - 7:30 a.m., Mon-Thurs

High School Courses

ATHLETICS - NON-CREDIT COURSES

All athletic courses for students entering grades nine through twelve will be graded on a pass/fail basis with no unit value applied toward graduation and no grade posted on the Garces transcript.

All classes go from Monday, June 21 - Friday, July 16, except noted otherwise.

FRESHMEN FOOTBALL

This class is designed for Incoming Freshmen. Students will learn the fundamental techniques of blocking, running pass routes, catching, and throwing the football. In addition, students will learn proper techniques in the weight room while conditioning for the upcoming season. Time will be devoted to field-work, strength training, and conditioning. There will also be some classroom and video instruction.

Tuition: \$150

This class will practice Monday – Thursday on the football field.

Time: 5:00 p.m. - 7:30 p.m.

JV/VARSITY FOOTBALL WEIGHT TRAINING

Members of the JV and Varsity football teams are required to enroll in this course. Students will learn the fundamental techniques of blocking, running pass routes, catching, and throwing the football. In addition, students will learn proper techniques in the weight room while conditioning for the upcoming season. Time will be devoted to field-work, strength training, and conditioning. There will also be some classroom and video instruction.

Tuition: \$150

The team will practice Monday – Thursday on the football field

Time: 5:50 a.m. - 7:30 a.m.

Strength and conditioning will be Monday – Thursday 8:00 am - 9:30 am or 1:00 pm - 2:30pm (for students who have 10 unit class)

CHEERLEADING

This class is designed for the GMHS 2021-2022 Varsity, Junior Varsity, and Freshman cheerleading teams to prepare for their upcoming season. Cheerleaders will learn football cheers, halftime performances, learn/advance in stunting, work on flexibility and jumps/kicks, and conditioning. This is a mandatory class for all Garces Memorial High School freshmen, junior varsity, and varsity cheerleaders.

VOLLEYBALL

This course is designed for any incoming freshmen and all current high school players who are interested in playing volleyball in high school. The fundamentals of volleyball will be covered in a competitive fun environment. Instruction will be provided from Garces varsity coach, Kim Harper. Students who plan on trying out for any level of the Garces volleyball program are strongly encouraged to attend this class. This class meets Monday - Thursday in the gym.

Tuition: \$150

This class meets Monday - Thursday in the gym.

Time: 1:00 p.m. - 2:30 p.m.

BASKETBALL - BOYS HIGH SCHOOL

This course is designed to teach sportsmanship, individual basketball fundamentals, team offensive and defensive concepts, and is led by Garces Varsity Boys Basketball Coach, Brian Dignan. This class will be a competitive environment on a daily basis. All incoming and returning Garces students who want to play basketball during the regular winter season should enroll in this class.

Tuition: \$150

(Period 2)

BASKETBALL - GIRLS

This course is designed to teach the fundamentals and techniques needed to play high school basketball. The class will emphasize ball handling, rebounding, shooting, and offensive and defensive skills. All students entering grades nine through twelve, who plan to play basketball at Garces, should take this class. The class will meet on Monday and Wednesday 3:00 p.m. - 4:30 p.m. Fridays TBA.

Please note the first class will meet on Monday, June 21st.

Tuition: \$150

SPORTS PERFORMANCE TRAINING & WEIGHT LIFTING

The purpose of this class is to enhance an athlete's performance in competition by using the latest advancements in sports science and kinesiology to develop a sport-specific strength and conditioning program that improves the athlete's overall athleticism. There will be specific concentration on strength, agility, speed, power, coordination, and balance as they relate to the sport in which the athlete competes. The course instructor is a certified strength and conditioning coach.

This class meets Monday - Thursday

Time: 3:00 p.m. - 4:15 p.m.

Tuition: \$150

Middle School Courses

All courses are 2 weeks in length but new material is presented each session so students can take over both sessions unless noted otherwise. Most courses require the purchase of a homework packet.

ENGLISH

READING LAB-LEVEL 1

Using informational and literary works appropriate for the individual student reading level, comprehension strategies for pre reading, during reading and post reading will be practiced. An emphasis on skimming, predicting, accessing prior knowledge, inference skills and summarizing main ideas will be incorporated. The common core standards for citing text evidence, and analyzing author point of view and character point of view will be addressed. Fluency skills will also be practiced. Students will acquire general academic vocabulary and practice strategies to determine the meaning of words and phrases used in the text. The strategies and vocabulary will be tiered for individual student learning needs of remediation or enrichment. This course is designed for students entering grades five and six. This course is only offered Session 1.

Tuition: \$135

(Period 1)

READING LAB-LEVEL 2

Using informational and literary works appropriate for the individual student reading level, comprehension strategies for pre reading, during reading and post reading will be practiced. An emphasis on applying inference skills to determine author point of view will be emphasized. The common core standards for citing text evidence, determining how a theme is developed, analyzing sentence structure, and analyzing how literary elements shape the plot and characters will be addressed. Students will acquire general academic vocabulary and practice strategies to determine the meaning of words and phrases used in the text. The strategies and vocabulary will be tiered for individual student learning needs of remediation or enrichment. This course is designed for students entering grades seven and eight. This course is only offered Session 1.

Tuition: \$135

(Period 2)

READING LAB-LEVEL 3

Using informational and literary works appropriate for the individual student reading level, comprehension strategies for pre reading, during reading and post reading will be practiced. An emphasis on how particular lines of dialogue or incidents in a story propel the action and reveal aspects of a character will be incorporated. The common core standards for citing text evidence, determining themes, analyzing sentence structure, and analyzing how the author acknowledges and responds to conflicting evidence will be addressed. Students will acquire general academic vocabulary and practice strategies to determine the meaning of words and phrases used in the text. The strategies will be tiered for individual student learning needs of remediation or enrichment. This course is designed for students entering grade eight. This course is only offered Session 1.

Tuition: \$135

(Period 3)

WRITING LAB-LEVEL 1

Participants will produce clear and cohesive writing that is developed and organized in a style appropriate for the genre. Incorporating the strategies of the Step Up to Writing Program and The Six Traits Program, writers will compose a narrative, persuasive and expository paragraph. The common core standard of organization will be emphasized. Students will demonstrate a command of the standard English. The tasks will be tiered to enrich individual student learning needs. This course is designed for students entering grades five and six. This course is only offered Session 2.

Tuition: \$135

(Period 1)

WRITING LAB-LEVEL 2

Participants will produce clear and cohesive writing that is developed and organized in a style appropriate for the genre. Incorporating the strategies of the Step Up to Writing Program and The Six Traits Program, writers will compose a narrative, persuasive and expository paragraph. The common core standard of developing and strengthening writing content focusing on style and relevant supportive details will be emphasized. Students will demonstrate a command of the standard English conventions and incorporate academic and domain specific vocabulary. The tasks will be tiered to enrich individual student learning needs. This course is designed for students entering grades seven and eight. This course is only offered Session 2.

Tuition: \$135

(Period 2)

WRITING LAB-LEVEL 3

Participants will produce clear and cohesive writing that is developed and organized in a style appropriate for the genre. Incorporating the strategies of the Step Up to Writing Program and The Six Traits Program, writers will compose a multi-paragraph narrative, persuasive and expository piece. The common core standard of supporting a claim with relevant evidence and appropriate vocabulary will be emphasized. Writing content will be revised for sentence variety and student reflection. Students will demonstrate a command of the standard English conventions and incorporate academic and domain specific vocabulary. The tasks will be tiered to enrich individual student learning needs. This course is designed for students entering eighth grade. This course is only offered Session 2.

Tuition: \$135

(Period 3)

Middle School Courses

All courses are 2 weeks in length but new material is presented each session so students can take over both sessions unless noted otherwise. Most courses require the purchase of a homework packet.

MATHEMATICS

MATH LEVEL 1

This course includes operations with whole numbers, fractions, decimals, and percentages. Students will take a pre-test to determine areas of strengths and weaknesses. With the help of the teacher and individualized materials, the student will work mainly on assessed areas of weakness. This course is designed for students entering either 5th or 6th grade but can be taken by any student entering grades five through eight.

Tuition: \$135 each session
(Periods 1, 2, or 3)

MATH LEVEL 2

The class is designed as an introduction to Pre-Algebra. Students will be given a pre-test and post-test in order to evaluate progress. This course is designed for students entering 6th or 7th grade but can be taken by any student entering grades six through eight.

Tuition: \$135 each session
(Periods 1, 2, or 3)

PRE-ALGEBRA - 2ND SEMESTER

This course is designed as a review of basic arithmetic operations and as an introduction to Algebra I. This course is fast-paced and the equivalent to Garces' second semester of Pre-Algebra. This course is a review in preparation for students entering Algebra I in the fall.

Tuition: \$135 each session
(Periods 2, or 3)

ALGEBRA I - AN INTRODUCTION

This course is designed for students who wish to get a head start in their fall Algebra I course. The topics of algebraic expression, real numbers, and solving one-variable equations will be explored. This course will be the equivalent to the first quarter of the Garces Algebra I (P) course. This class is recommended for incoming 8th grader and any student who will be taking Algebra I in the fall. This course runs from June 21st to July 16th.

Tuition: \$200
(Available Periods 1, 2, 3)

BASKETBALL - BOYS AND GIRLS

These camps are designed to teach sportsmanship, individual basketball fundamentals, team offensive and defensive concepts, and are led by Garces Varsity Boys Basketball Coach, Brian Dignan. We will also have daily competitions including shooting contests, games, and relays. There are two, 2-week sessions and campers are encouraged to sign up for both sessions.

Tuition: \$135 each session

(Period 1)

TENNIS

Have you always wanted to learn to play tennis? An introduction to the sport via the tennis court structured to utilize your child's developing motor skills, eye-hand coordination, balance, timing and patience. This camp focuses on stroke production and footwork, students work on getting the ball in play while demonstrating an understanding of the basics of form. Players are acquainted with the rules of tennis, scoring, and singles and doubles play. Students must bring their own racket. This is a two week camp and can be taken either 1st or 2nd session.

Tuition: \$135 each session

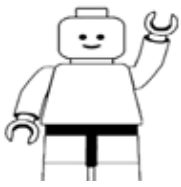

VOLLEYBALL

This camp is designed to teach the fundamentals of volleyball. Instruction will be provided in the techniques of basic skills such as serving, passing, setting, hitting, blocking, and basic court positioning. Each player will need to bring her personal gear including indoor court shoes. The camp is designed for players who want basic instruction or want to expand their skills in volleyball. S.T.E.M. CAMPS



BEGINNING ROBOTICS

This is a beginning course in robotics. We will be utilizing Lego Mindstorm kits and various Lego Robotics materials. The objective of this course is to introduce the student to basic programming as well as problem solving strategies. This course will involve students in the development, building and programming of a LEGO Mindstorm robot. Students will work hands-on in teams to design, build, program and document their progress. Topics may include motor control, gear ratios, torque, friction, sensors, timing and program loops. No experience necessary. This course runs from June 21st to July 16th.

Tuition: \$200
(Period 1)

ADVANCE ROBOTICS

This course covers advanced programming and hardware concepts associated with Lego Mindstorm robots. In this course, several robots are programmed to work together and with other common automation systems to increase the efficiency and throughput of industrial automation processes. Robot safety procedures and standards will be emphasized throughout the course. Students must have taken the Beginning Robotics class a previous summer or have a background in Lego Mindstorm. This course runs from June 21st to July 16th.

Tuition: \$200
(Period 2)

WEB DESIGN

This course is designed for a path toward future studies in web development and design. Students will construct webpages, learn publishing techniques and further enhance their existing knowledge of computers. This course is designed for students entering grades five through ten. This is a two-week class and can be taken either 1st or 2nd session.

Tuition: \$135 each session
(Period 3)

BEGINNING GRAPHIC DESIGN

Students learn the fundamentals of graphic design. Its terminology, tools, and working methods. Emphasis is placed on computer layout skills and their application to creative visual communication, with strong emphasis on typographical technical and historical elements. In addition, students will produce and will be assessed on many projects that include creating an original layout for a newsletter, vinyl cutting, catalogue, logos and brochures as well as designing and crafting effective promotional pieces, publications and digital art. This is a two-week class and can be taken either 1st or 2nd session.

Tuition: \$135 each session
(Period 4)

CSI: FORENSIC SCIENCE

Students will find themselves at the scene of a crime where their job will be to gather evidence, analyze, then solve the crime. They will explore evidence collection, fingerprinting, chromatography and splatter analysis. Students will also learn how to use laboratory equipment and metric measurements. This is a two-week class and can be taken either 1st or 2nd session. Tuition: \$140 for each session. Lab fees already included.

(Period 3 or 4)

AQUATICS CAMPS



SWIMMING

This camp will provide quality and safe instruction of basic/intermediate/advanced technique involved in swimming. The focus of the camp is to improve your skills and techniques while improving fitness. Each of the four competitive strokes will be learned and/or refined. Conditioning will take place each day. This is a two-week camp and can be taken either 1st or 2nd session.

Tuition: \$135 each session

(Period 1, 2 or 3)

BEGINNING WATER POLO

An introduction into the sport of water polo, this class will cover the basics of eggbeater, heads-up freestyle, passing, shooting, and the rules of the game. Prerequisite: Students must be able to swim 50 yards heads-up freestyle, 50 yards backstroke, and tread water for three minutes. This is a two-week camp and can be taken either 1st or 2nd session.

Tuition: \$135 each session

(Period 4)

INTERMEDIATE WATER POLO

This course is designed for any middle school students who already have a basic understanding of water polo. This class will review the basics of eggbeater, heads-up freestyle, passing, shooting, and the rules of the game. Prerequisite: Students must be able to swim one length of the pool. This is a two week course and can be taken either 1st or 2nd session.

Tuition: \$135 each session

(Period 4)

DIVING

This camp introduces the theory and practice of diving drills necessary to use the one-meter diving board. Emphasis is placed on performance of basic dives. No formal experience is necessary to take this class and is the perfect way to introduce a child to the sport of diving and provide a format for improvement. Kids of all ages and skill levels are welcome to participate. Divers must be comfortable swimming in deep water. This is a two-week camp and can be taken during the 1st or 2nd session.

Tuition: \$135

(Period 2)

FINE ARTS CAMPS



ART - DRAWING & DESIGN

This is a beginning level art camp that introduces the fundamentals of drawing. An emphasis will be placed on the six elements of art: line, shape/form, space, value, texture, and color. Students will also be exposed to some principles of design. Student work will include the following projects: cubism, pointillism, non-objective abstract, one and two-point perspective, color wheel, and fourth objective abstract. Students will be using a variety of mediums; pencil, colored-pencil, ink and paint. This camp is designed for students entering grades five through eight.
