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CLPOA Board of Trustees Meeting • October 13, 2009

Substantive Motions Approved in this Meeting —

Motion 09-014: Gene Brundige made a motion that the Board recognizes the Choctaw Cruisers as a resident club which will permit them to utilize the sign board for announcements and a lake facility for meeting when there are no conflicting activities. Seconded by Bob McKinley. Vote was taken. Motion passed.

Call to Order:

The Board of Trustees meeting convened at 7:00p.m. in the CLPOA conference room. A roll call was taken as follows:

Shannon Hastings: present, Tom Boyd: present, Bob McKinley: present, Ruth Sowers: present, Bill Laney: present, Gene Brundige: present, Thad Gifford: present, John Foote, Sr.: present, Rick Ballard: present.

Mike Hexamer (CLPOA Lake Manager), Carla Dye (CLPOA Office Manager) and Craig Smith were also present.

Property Owner's Time:

Charlie and Linda Rinehart (lot 895) were present to discuss the building permit they have requested to erect a boathouse over the existing slip. Mr. Reinhart showed the Board photos of what he is proposing. He was told that the Board needs to look into the issue of the shoreline and whether it would affect his permit. To be discussed in new business.

Michael Hoffman (lot 439) was present to represent the Choctaw Cruisers social group and submit a club charter. The group intends to continue being involved in the community. To be discussed in new business.

Minutes:

Bob McKinley noted that the CLPOAVariance Notification Policy wording does not reflect all the updates agreed upon by the Board. Bob McKinley made a motion to amend the minutes. Gene Brundige seconded the motion. Vote was taken. The minutes were amended. Gene Brundige made a motion to accept the amended September minutes. Seconded by Ruth Sowers. The Board approved the amended minutes.

Patrol Report:

(Presented by Mike Hexamer)

Dan Summers was not in attendance. The Patrol report was accepted as submitted.

Maintenance Report:

(Presented by Mike Hexamer)

Maintenance report accepted as submitted.

Office Report:

(Presented by Carla Dye)

Carla reported on a property that has been in foreclosure since 2006 and is scheduled for closing. She said the company handling the foreclosure has a policy of not paying dues, liens, etc. Richard Flax would like to know if the Board would like to forgive these unpaid dues & assessments. The Board agreed to treat mortgage companies the same as everyone else. Carla will treat them as normal property owners.

Treasurer's Report

(Presented by Ruth Sowers)

The treasurer's report was approved as submitted. The Board reviewed several accounts to prior year noting reasons for variation.

Manager's Report:

(Presented by Mike Hexamer)

The activity report was approved as submitted. Mike updated the Board on other lake's policies regarding boat stickers. It is now time to purchase the larger stickers based on a 5-year cycle. Mike and Carla will shop around for best price.

Mike reported that Lakeside Plaza would like to run a sales promotion endorsed by the Board and have the proceeds returned to the lake. The Board discussed this and decided not to endorse any business.

Mike and Bob McKinley attended the Ohio Lake Community Association fall meeting. Mike asked the Board if they would consider hosting the spring meeting. The Board agreed to host it.

Committees:

- Beautification: John Foote reported that Mike is continuing to work on several items including the lodge exterior. Everything is looking very nice.
- Lake Drainage and Roads: Rick Ballard will present a proposed communication regarding shoreline maintenance during old business.
- Publications and Public Relations: nothing to report.
- Recreation: nothing to report.
- House and Office: nothing to report.
- Land/Facility Use: nothing to report.
- Choctaw Utilities: John Foote reported on the Utility Board meeting. The Board member terms are one 5-year, two 4-years and two 3years. They would like to set up a committee of members from both Boards to review their budget for long-range capital planning.
- Sewer: Bill Laney explained that the two atlarge Choctaw seats on the Sewer Board are appointed by the CLPOA Board. One of these seats will expire March 2010 and the other in March 2011. These are 3-year seats. The Sewer Board is reviewing service call data to determine if any changes need to be made in service response procedures.
- Long-range Planning: Bob McKinley reported on the recent meeting. They are preparing a questionnaire and would like to send it out with the property owners' billing.
- Security: nothing to report.
- Personnel: nothing to report.

Old Business:

Rick Ballard discussed the proposed communication for shoreline maintenance prepared by the Lake, Drainage and Roads Committee. He asked the Board for any recommendations or changes. He and Mike will finalize it and have it published in The Peace Pipe. The Building Committee will look into any proposed changes to the rules concerning shorelines.

John Foote reported on fencing material. The committee does not want to limit fencing to a specific material due to the vast selection available. Their recommendation to the Building Committee

is to enforce the aesthetics of the fencing rather than the material. The Board agreed with this recommendation.

New Business:

Gene Brundige made a motion that the Board recognizes the Choctaw Cruisers as a resident club which will permit them to utilize the sign board for announcements and a lake facility for meeting when there are no conflicting activities. Seconded by Bob McKinley. Vote was taken. Motion passed. (see Motion 09-014)

The Board discussed the Rinehart building permit request for a boathouse. The plan calls for placing a support post beyond the lot line. Also the roof extends one foot beyond the post. This plan does not satisfy the existing building code and would require a variance. The Board's stance is to not grant a variance for this type of situation. This was communicated to Mr. & Mrs. Rinehart. No action taken.

Gene Brundige made a motion to enter executive session to consider legal advice that could lead to possible legal action and that the lake manager be included in said executive session. Bill Laney seconded the motion. The Board entered executive session at 9:02p.m. The Board returned from executive session at 9:40p.m.

Ruth Sowers made a motion to adjourn. Bob McKinley seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 9:41p.m.

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





Helpful Hints For Swimmers

Pre-register!

Registration and required waivers must be completed, signed, and turned into the lake office by noon, December 31, 2009.

Wear Protective Footwear.

Wear something on your feet, i.e., old tennis shoes or "aqua socks," etc. to prevent cuts on your feet from the ice and to prevent your feet from sticking to the snow and ice on shore.

Bring Warm boots.

Have warm/dry boots or shoes to put on once you get out of the lake. This is an important point! Once your feet get cold, your entire body will want to go on strike. Not good for a walk back to your car.

Bring a Blanket to sit on.

Bring an old blanket or towel to put down on the ice shoreline to sit down on and change before/after the swim.

Do you wear glasses?

E-Mail Address

If you wear glasses, we suggest you obtain an "athletic strap" or something similar to hold them to your face, or not wear them at all! It is impossible to find glasses that have been dropped in the water.

The swim is at noon, but arrive early.

The swim itself is exactly at noon, but get there by 11:30 a.m.

Choctaw Lake Polar Bear Club Waiver and Release Agreement

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING. THIS IS A RELEASE OF LIABILITYAND WAIVER OF CERTAIN LEGAL RIGHTS.

In consideration of my being permitted to participate in the Choctaw Lake Polar Bear Club's 2nd Annual New Year's Day Swim, (hereafter referred to as "the Swim", I agree to the following waiver and release: I acknowledge that jumping into cold water, standing and walking upon ice, walking and lingering in the snow in the vicinity of the Swim, lingering near and among the crowd gathered for the Swim, and traveling to and from the Swim and its various attractions have inherent risks, hazards and dangers. I understand that these risks, hazards and dangers include without limitation:

Risks arising from exposure to large and sudden changes in environmental temperatures that can lead to loss of consciousness, Hypothermia, heart attacks, and other life-threatening conditions; Risks involved in standing and moving about on frozen portions of Lake Choctaw and on snowy, icy or irregular terrain; Such other risks, hazards, and dangers that are inherent to the sport of cold plunging and being out of doors during winter.

I am voluntarily participating in the Swim with full knowledge of the inherent risks, hazards, and dangers involved and hereby assume and accept any and all risks of injury, paralysis, or death, and agree to abide by all Choctaw Lake rules, regulations and guidelines.

I, for myself, my heirs, successors, executors, and superiors, hereby knowingly and intentionally waive and release, indemnify, and hold harmless the Choctaw Lake Polar Bear Club, Choctaw Lake Board of Trustees, Choctaw Lake Property Owners Association, or any of its officers, agents, affiliates, employees, contractors, sponsors, or volunteers, from and against any and all claims, actions, causes of action, liabilities, suits, expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) and negligence of any kind or nature, whether foreseen or unforeseen, arising directly or indirectly out of any damage, loss, injury, paralysis, or death to me or my property as a result of participation in the Swim, whether such damage, loss, injury, paralysis, or death results from the negligence or other acts however caused by or contributed to by the Choctaw Lake Polar Bear Club and all related entities named above, or from some other cause. I, for myself, my heirs, my successors, executors, and superiors, further agree not to sue the Choctaw Lake Polar Bear Club, its officers, agents, affiliates, employees, contractors, sponsors, or volunteers, as a result of any injury, paralysis or death suffered in connection with my participation in the Swim. I attest that I am of the age of 18 years or older.

Care and Use of Your Grinder Pump

The Environmental One grinder pump is capable of accepting and pumping a wide range of materials. Regulatory agencies advise that the following items should not be introduced into any sewer, either directly or through a kitchen waste disposal unit:

Glass Diapers, socks, rags or cloth
Metal Plastic objects (toys, utensils, etc.)
Seafood shells Sanitary napkins or tampons

Goldfish stone Kitty litter
In addition, you must **never** introduce into any sewer:
Explosives Strong chemicals

Flammable material Gasoline

Lubricating oil and/or grease

Periods of Disuse

If your home or building is left unoccupied for longer than a couple of weeks, perform the following procedure:

Purge the System. Run clean water into the unit until the pump activates. Immediately turn off the water and allow the grinder pump to run until it shuts off automatically.

Caution: Do not disconnect power to the unit.

Power Failure

Your grinder pump cannot dispose of wastewater without electrical power. If electrical power service is interrupted, keep water usage to a minimum.

Pump Failure Alarm

Your Environment One grinder pump has been manufactured to produce an alarm signal (120 volt) in the event of a high water level in the basin. The installer must see that the alarm signal provided is connected to an audible and/or visual alarm in such a manner as to provide adequate warning to the user that service is required. During the interim prior to the arrival of an authorized service technician, water usage must be limited to the reserve capacity of the tank.

Building Permits

A. Scope of Permits:

Building Permits shall be required for the construction or alteration of the following items as defined by Section 4 Express Standards of Construction: (a) Houses, (b) House Additions, (c) Garages & Outbuildings, (d) Sheds, (e) Boathouses, (f) Driveways, (g) Fences, (h) Decks, (i) Patios, (j) Docks, (k) Seawalls, (l) Swimming Pools, (m) Siding, (n) Patio Roof, porch roof, sun room, screened porch, (o) Roofing, (p) Other structural alterations not covered above. Other Structures shall be defined as anything with a footer and / or any mechanics applied to it.

(2) Building Permit fees and deposits will be paid according to the following schedule:

(Amended Jan. 17 1996, Sept. 14,1998, July 8,2008)

(a) House Additions up to 300 square feet \$1000 deposit \$150

(b) House Additions 301 to 600 square feet \$1000 deposit \$300

(c) House Additions 601 to 1200 square feet \$1000 deposit \$500

(d) New Homes and Additions over 1201 square feet \$1000 deposit \$750

(e) Garages \$1000 deposit \$300

(f) Boathouses \$1000 deposit \$300

(g) Patio Roof, porch roof, sun room, screened porch \$500 deposit \$150

(h) Driveways \$50

(i) Fences \$50

(j) Decks \$50

(l) Docks \$50

(l) Sawalls \$500 deposit \$150

(n) Swimming Pools \$50

(o) Siding \$25

(p) Sheds \$50

(q) Roofing \$25

Property Owners must have a permit for all Permanent Structures including the following projects: House, House Additions, Sheds, Boathouses, Driveways, Fences, Decks, Patios, Docks, Swimming Pools, and Satellite Dishes over 24" in diameter. 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

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
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














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
