


But make sure to take a look on the next page for your invitation to our 10th birthday party on January 15th at the Armouries in Renfrew. This is our kickoff to another truly










Valley Heritage remembers



Our own afternoon drive host Christa Pare was surprised on air in August as we showed up with a cake and to sing 'Happy Birthday' to her!




Hang in there!
