### PUERTO RICO MISSION TRIP



Shortly before Thanksgiving, the Puerto Rico mission team returned safely from a productive week working in the town of Mayagüez. God blessed the work of the 13 participants as they re-roofed a home, re-plumbed the church's community center, painted two on-site apartments, constructed eight sets of bunks for use by future mission teams and demolished an unused structure behind the center.

In addition to the construction objectives, the volunteers got to know several missionaries serving on the island. They attended a Bible study

with the Ponce congregation and a worship service (¡en español!) with the Mayagüez congregation.




