From the Pastor - December 2020

As I write this newsletter article from my office, Peace Lutheran Church in Dickinson has been transformed into a lefse making factory. It is an annual tradition and fund raiser for this church to make and sell lefse to the community for the holidays. The entire floor in the fellowship hall has been covered with a protective heavy duty plastic (I'm told it comes from the oil field, some sort liner for ponds or something). Tables have been set out around the perimeter of the room. Griddles, lefse boards, flat wooden sticks, towels to hold the cooling rounds, bowls of flour and rolling pins cover the surface of the tables. Extension cords stretch to every corner of the church to pull current to heat the griddles. Congregational members of every age assemble safely with mask and glove to participate in this annual tradition.

As we engage in this activity, I am consciously aware that many traditions that take place at this time of year will have to be postponed, cancelled, or reinvented. Both churches and families have to make tough decisions about what to do and what not to do in an effort to keep ourselves, our neighbors, and our communities safe this year. For all of us, this is our first time entering into the holidays during a pandemic. Unfortunately, I have been hearing a new phrase being used as of late: COVID fatigue. We are exhausted from the changes, challenges and restrictions that have come from this new disease thus far. Going into our "favorite time of year" already discouraged and exhausted will not set well when we have to adjust our traditions.

This time of year always begins with the season of Advent, a time of waiting for a promised hope. For most of us, we have been in a season of Advent for nearly a year. We are waiting for this pandemic to come to an end. We are waiting for a cure or at least a vaccine to stop this virus' destruction. And we are waiting for our lives to go back to normal. Christians are descendants of Advent people. Our ancestors waited for the promised hope to come in the Messiah for hundreds of years! I wonder what they called their fatigue. I wonder how they endured for as long as they did. I wonder what traditions they had to put on hold and what new traditions were developed while waiting for and after hope's arrival.



Knowing the patience of those who waited for the Messiah gives me encouragement to wait a few more months for us to get through this pandemic. The powerful season of Advent reminds us every year that our waiting pays off, that God is faithful, that light comes in the darkness, that we have a Savior, that we have hope!!

Thanksgiving, Christmas, your birthday, your annual vacation may all look different this year. Traditions, expectations, and activities will all have to be adjusted and for good reason. But our waiting will pay off some day. And I promise it will not take a hundred years! Just think how long the world waited for a Messiah. Eventually, our Savior comes, often in unexpected ways.

May God bless your Advent waiting and your Christmas joy.

A MESSAGE FROM BISHOP CRAIG SCHWEITZER

"Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing." 1 Thessalonians 5:11
