#### **Paving Season Ends with Success**

Phoenix's 2019 street paving season will go on record as the biggest ever to be accomplished featuring more than 250 miles of newly paved streets. Due largely to the Council-approved \$200 million financing of Transportation 2050 street program revenues, the city tripled the number of arterial and major street miles that were paved this year. Accomplishments from this year's street paving season include:

- 195 local street miles paved,
- 60 arterial and major street miles paved,
- 120 local street miles and 35 arterial and major street miles received a pavement preservation treatment, such as fog seal or crack seal, and
- 5,650 new wheelchair accessible sidewalk ramps installed.

This year's season required approximately 75,000-man hours and over 500,000 tons of asphalt material.

Positions may be assigned to shop or field locations. Certain assignments may include electronics metering and instrumentation and working with various voltages. Assignments are received by sketches, blueprints verbally, and through work orders. These positions require successful completion of a four-year recognized apprenticeship program or three years of experience as a skilled electrician.


To get invited to the event, you must apply by Dec. 9. The most qualified candidates will be contacted by phone or email to schedule their interview time.

Each Monday, the city posts jobs available for current employees to consider.


