MISSION STATEMENT

"We, the community of St. Gregory Barbarigo, are called forth in Baptism to follow the mission of Jesus to teach, to love, and to serve."

I want to thank you for your kindness, your prayers and best wishes, the food some of you brought over, and in general your solicitude during the time I was recovering from COVID-19. I don't know exactly how I got the virus, but I don't think it came from our liturgical celebrations, which I believe are safe. In fact, one parishioner expressed the opinion that it is hard to find a place safer for our children than in school or for our parishioners than attending Mass. We are taking precautions, and appreciate the help that so many of you continue to provide by following protocols (wearing masks, sanitizing hands, cleaning before and after Masses). In any case, I did not have a severe attack of the virus, and am extremely happy to be back doing my job with the lingering effect of being tired now and then. Even though Fr. Stephen did not contract the virus, he is happy to be back at home and serving you as well. Thanks be to God and to you!

Speaking of COVID-19, we are asking you to sign up for Christmas Masses so that we can assign seats and gauge how full the Masses will be, whether we need another Mass, etc. The reason is that people who are in town for the holidays or seldom come to Mass may show up on Christmas without realizing that one needs to sign up, and we don't know how to predict the number. This could create the problem of overcrowding and lack of physical distancing which would make our celebrations unsafe. I am in the difficult position of wanting to encourage people to come and attend (it is Christmas, after all), while at the same time ensuring that our celebrations will be safe. We are looking into having overflow space, but want those who sign up to be assured of their place in the celebration. So please sign up early so that we can plan accordingly!

Fr. Daniel, one of the Directors of Formation at the seminary, is trying to find a way to help seminarians to relate to lay Catholics. Normally the seminarians come and help teach RCIA, or help with youth group or EPIC or Little Saints, or visit rest homes. However because of the pandemic and the severe social restrictions imposed on the seminarians, he wants to have them develop relationships with people like you via mail or email. So he is looking for about fifteen parishioners willing to carry on correspondence with seminarians. If you are willing to do this, please call or email Devin or me, and we will pass on your names. Fr. Daniel will then contact you over the Christmas break. It is a chance to get to know a seminarian, though he may or may not be from our diocese.

May we have a wonderful Advent in preparation for Christmas. It is a joy to be your pastor.

Religious Retirement Fund—

Elderly religious need your help. Through prayer, love and sacrifice, they established Catholic schools, hospitals and more. Yet years of serving for little or no pay has left a shortage in their retirement funding.

Next week, we will take up a collection to help furnish medications, nursing care and other necessities to our retired religious.

I have not read the 461 page McCarrick report myself. I did read a couple of articles about it and I think the report confirms what I already believed to be true. There was evil within the church. For decades there were various levels of denial, self-protection was chosen over justice for victims, and unthinkable tragedy was ignored by many. Anyone who has ever watched a dramatic TV show knows that hiding the truth, even when you are doing it to protect people you love, never works. The lies end up hurting more than the truth. We are used to seeing this kind of drama played out on stages but seeing it in the Catholic Church is astounding. Clerics having that kind of unchecked power over the people of the church should never have been tolerated. But it was.

As disappointing and painful as this whole situation is, I am choosing to see this report as a sign of hope. As Bishop Robert Barron stated in an article in the CRUX, "The remarkable transparency of this report is a bold step in the right direction." The church is finally dealing with the whole truth. Father Albert mentioned the McCarrick report in his letter in the bulletin recently. He invited anyone with concerns to reach out to him. I asked him about the report, his response was "What will differentiate us is how we deal with it. I would encourage us to raise the level of awareness in our community, to watch out for the safety of our little ones, and to be a place of healing, not abuse or manipulation." I love that he is not trying to avoid conflict or unpleasantness. He is inviting us to question. He does not use his holiness to have power over us, he uses his gifts to serve us. I am thankful for him and have great respect for the work he does. He is part of the solution.



This awareness and openness are exactly why I feel our parish is and will continue to be a safe place. This is not a problem we just deal with one time and put behind us. The problem is not limited to the church. Vulnerable people everywhere are being exploited and abused every day. Part of the solution is ongoing vigilance. If any of you are wondering how you can be part of the solution, I suggest you take the Virtus training. It is required for people who work with children in our parish, but everyone is welcome to take it. It will help you recognize signs of abuse, learn ways to limit access and opportunity for abuse, and how to report inappropriate behavior. My biggest take away from the training was that being illegal does not stop inappropriate behavior from happening; not allowing abusers to be alone with the vulnerable does. The best way for us to prevent abuse, is to show up.

My hope is that the truth revealed in the McCarrick report will inspire more awareness, reform, and outreach. I want the Church to deal with the shame and guilt appropriately. I want the church to help victims heal. I want the Catholic Church to be the world's biggest champion of eliminating abuse and exploitation by empowering each of us to take personal responsibility for the safety of the most vulnerable members of our population. The Church is dealing with the truth; we as its members must also. We are the Church, and in spite of this scandal and tragedy, we still have the power to do so much good.

December 8, 2020 - Feast of the Immaculate Conception and 150th Anniversary of St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church

St. Joseph, the most chaste spouse of the Virgin Mary and the divinely appointed guardian of the Holy Family, whose faithful love and prompt obedience in his earthly life, was a model for all to follow. He was declared a Patron of the Universal Church by Pope Pius IX 150 years ago in 1870. The Litany of St Joseph beautifully describes the many ways St Joseph's intercession has been and continues to be sought by individuals and by the universal Church for protection.

The 31 years of Pope Pius IX's papacy in the 19th century was marked by three pivotal events, all of which occurred in various years on Dec. 8. In 1854, Pope Pius IX formally declared the dogma of the Immaculate Conception, a feast celebrated annually on Dec. 8. In 1869, he commenced the First Vatican Council, again on Dec. 8. Finally, on Dec. 8, 1870, he declared St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church.

Please keep in mind, that through all world events, we have a heavenly protector, who continues today to protect the Church and her faithful. We need the spiritual fatherhood of St. Joseph to defend marriage and family, elevate morals, recover lost ground, win souls for Jesus Christ and also for re-evangelizing the world. We need to bring St. Joseph onto the battlefield. He is the Terror of Demons! History reveals countless times of upheaval; however, through it all, Christ and the Church remain and the Faith continues to spread. Please pray strongly for the gift of Faith to grow in our world.

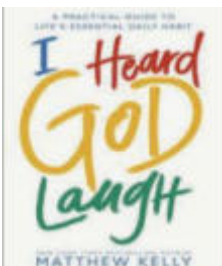

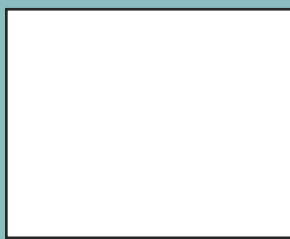
