



INFORMATION

Immunization Records

A copy of your child's immunization records must be submitted a minimum of 10 days prior to the camp start date. This is <u>MANDATORY</u> and no child will be allowed to participate without submitting these.

Refunds

If your child is unable to attend a camp in which he/she is enrolled, you may request a refund for any amount paid over and above the non-refundable deposit. You must make your request in writing to Workforce Development and Community Education, Summer Camps, via U.S. mail, or email at the address located at the bottom of the first (1) registration page. The request must be received by the close of business 10 days prior to the Monday that your child is scheduled to begin camp. Please note that refunds for payments made by check may take six to eight weeks to process.

Transfer Policy

If your child is unable to attend a camp in which he/she is enrolled, you may request a transfer up to two camps of the amount paid against that camp to another camp week that your child is not previously enrolled in, within the same camp season. You may not combine deposits to pay a balance for another camp week in which your child is previously enrolled. You must make your request in writing to Workforce **Development and Community** Education, Summer Camps, via U.S. mail, or email at the address located at the bottom of the first (1) registration page. The request for the transfer of a deposit must be received by the close of business 10 days prior to the Monday of the camp week that your child was scheduled to attend.

Sign in/Sign Out

All parents/guardians MUST sign their child in and out each day. Identification will be checked until the staff knows you. If someone is not listed on your child's registration form as an authorized pick up person, we will NOT release your child. Only individuals 18 years and older may sign a child out. Please make sure that anyone authorized to pick up your child arrives with a photo ID!

Late Fee/Extended Care

Any camper not registered for extended care, arriving prior to 8:45 a.m. and/or not picked up by noon, for a.m. camps, or 4 p.m., for PM camps, will be assigned to our extended care program. Extended care tuition of \$35/ child will be due at the time of dropoff and/or pick-up.

Clothing

Students should dress appropriately for the class that they will attend. Class descriptions will provide the necessary requirements. Temperatures fluctuate in some of our classrooms, so please remember to bring a sweater or sweatshirt.

Electronic Devices

Campers should NOT bring electronic devices. Delaware Tech will not be responsible for any lost, broken or stolen property. Please do not bring a cell phone.

T-Shirts

Each camper will receive a summer camp T-shirt. Note: only one T-shirt per child, not per camp.

Sunscreen

Campers will be participating in many outdoor activities. To be prepared for the sun, apply sunscreen every morning before coming to camp. Campers may also bring more sunscreen with them to camp.

Emergency Procedures

Upon registration, all campers will be automatically enrolled in our summer camps alert system. More information will be emailed to parents/guardians. If there were to be a total evacuation of the building, all students will be walked to the Howard T. Ennis School, located behind Delaware Tech at 20346 Ennis Street, Georgetown, De. for parent pick-up.

Medical Procedures

Each camper is required to have personal medical coverage and accident insurance. Delaware Tech does not provide this coverage. Parents will be informed immediately in the event of an emergency. The parent will be responsible for picking up the camper and determining if further medical attention is necessary. In case of an emergency requiring immediate medical attention, camp staff is required to: make the child comfortable, call for an ambulance, and notify the parent and camp manager who will accompany the child to hospital.

Problem Management Procedures

Discipline problems will be addressed in the following manner: Behavioral problems will be handled by the camp manager. If the problem persists, the parent will be notified. If the problem continues to persist, the camper will be dismissed from camp and will not be permitted to return. Refunds will not be granted if campers are dismissed from camp. Automatic dismissal from camp may occur at the camp manager's discretion.

Please note that refunds for payments made by check may take six to eight weeks to process.

You may not combine deposits to pay a balance for another camp week previously enrolled in.
