

Vestry News

We held our parish-wide Mutual Ministry Review on Saturday morning, June 11th. It was ably facilitated by Rev. Kathy Corley, who has been helping guide us through our transition. We had a good attendance, and everyone agreed that it was an enjoyable and very worthwhile experience. In general, we concluded that our committee and ministry work is doing very well. There are a greater number of committees, new leadership in some committees, and stronger membership than there was a few years ago. The session left us energized to continue doing our fine work; it was agreed that a new rector is needed to help give us a clear direction for these ministries. The items identified for immediate action are:

- Finding a Chair for the Worship Committee; I am pleased to report the Kathy Collett has already graciously agreed to serve in this position. We know that she will do her usual superb job!
- Developing more complete and frequent acolyte training; Ken Iles and Skip Beardsell have volunteered to create a St. James' acolyte training manual. Rahel Reger and the Youth Committee have already commenced planning this training.
- Developing small group gatherings, both social (like the Foyers and other dinner groups that used to be held) and formative (book study, Bible reflection, etc); Terry Neil has offered to discuss the social functions with her Fellowship Committee; we are hopeful that someone is willing to spearhead the development of small formation groups. If you have any ideas, we would love to hear from you!

In other news, at its June meeting, the Vestry:

- Approved an expenditure of up to \$9,000 for the purchase and installation of 24 more niches in the columbarium.
- Approved an expenditure of \$1,250 for the bathroom in the Day School.
- Approved an expenditure of up to \$1,300 for a fireproof cabinet for storage of parish records. However, Bruce Evans has very generously donated such a cabinet, which will save us a lot of money! *Thank you so very much, Bruce!*

And a GIANT THANK YOU to John Crossley for his fine work as project manager!



Worship & Formation

St. James is blessed with three wonderful choirs, our adult, youth and children's choirs, and Richard, our talented organist and choir director. Sometimes we are so moved by the music that we clap. I have heard some - both lay and clergy - at other churches wonder if clapping is out of place in a worship service. Their stance is that prayers and music are expressions of worship directed for the glory of God, distinct from a performance for "the people." As such, clapping in church is "not appropriate." And yet, clapping is often our natural response to indicate that we are "all in" with what we hear. I can't image a loving God ever being offending if we, His people, instinctively clap when children praise God in song. After all, during the baptism service, when asked "Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?" we promise "WE WILL!" In that case, isn't clapping to encourage our children to praise God with heart and voice entirely appropriate? However, I do understand that tension between clapping by way of encouragement and clapping as if they are performing for us. For those of you also who feel this tension, let me suggest saying a heartfelt AMEN after being moved by a particular song or sermon. (Selected sermons may be found on our website at www.stjamesclinton.org/sermons) But in the end, remember we strive to be a flexible people. During prayers we kneel or sit as we are able. During hymns, we stand or sit. During communion some stand, some sit, some kneel. So, clap, silently praise God, or say an AMEN out loud. In all things, be your true self as move by the Holy Spirit. AMEN!
