## **Corporate Life Contribution**:

- i As General Secretary of the Zakir Husain Memorial Welfare Society, Jamia Millia Islamia (2006-2010) and as CEO of the same (since 2014) I am involved in overseeing the functioning of the Okhla Crafts Centre.
