To be eligible for the BSW Child Welfare Education Program, applicants must:

- Have taken or will be concurrently taking SWU 303 at the time they enter the program
- Be junior status (have completed 56 credits) by the time they enter the program
- Be able to be admitted to the Professional BSW Program
- Meet the DCS hiring qualifications
- Be willing and able to commit to work full-time for DCS for up to 24 months upon graduation (if you are considering going directly into MSW Advanced Standing program after the completion of your BSW degree, please see the information on our website under the tab "Continuing to the MSW Program")

Master of Social Work - Child Welfare Education Project

The ASU School of Social Work partners with the Arizona Department of Child Safety to identify, select, and train talented students who demonstrate the potential to be effective public child welfare workers.

THE STIPENED/SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM:

- Pays instate tuition and related fees for a limited number of MSW students
- Pays a stipend of \$600/month
- Provides an excellent field placement in an ASU child welfare education unit.

APPLICANT MUST:

- Be accepted as a full-time student in the MSW Program

- Meet DCS hiring qualifications
- Be committed to work at DCS full-time up to 24 months upon graduation from the MSW program.
