**VERB + ON** 

INSIST ON	Simon <b>insisted on</b> paying for everything when we went out.
CONGRATULATE ON	I <b>congratulated</b> her <b>on</b> her marriage.
INSIST ON /UPON	He <b>insisted on</b> helping with all the housework. He is the perfect husband!
SPEND ON	I <b>spent</b> too much money <b>on</b> chocolates last Valentine's Day.
FOCUS ON	I'm going to <b>focus on</b> environmental issues in my next speech.
CONCENTRATE ON	I can't <b>concentrate on</b> what I'm doing with the music so loud!
TAKE REVENGE ON	He <b>took revenge on</b> her ex-boyfriend by spreading some dirty rumours about how he got his money.
RELY ON	You can <b>rely on</b> Jill. He always keeps her promises.
INFLICT ON	Iran's nuclear bombs can <b>inflict</b> more damage <b>on</b> America than the World War II.
DEPEND ON	"What time will you be home?" "I don't know. It <b>depends on</b> traffic."
LIVE ON	Michael's salary is very low. It's not enough to <b>live on</b> .

INVEST IN	My parents <b>invested</b> a lot of money <b>in</b> our new house.
SPECIALISE IN	My sister <b>specialised in</b> marketing and sales.
TRUST IN	You can <b>trust in</b> her, she will say nothing.

CONFIDE IN	You can <b>confide in</b> her, she will say nothing.
PLAY A ROLE IN	Our childhood <b>plays an important role in</b> our lives.
BELIEVE IN	Do you <b>believe in</b> God?
SUCCEED IN	I hope you <b>succeed in</b> finding the job you want.



### **VERB + INTO**

BREAK INTO	Our house was <b>broken into</b> a few days ago, but nothing was stolen.
CRASH/DRIVE/CU T/ SPLIT INTO	He lost control of the car and <b>crashed into</b> a wall.
TRANSLATE something INTO	Ken Follett's books have been <b>translated into</b> many languages.



# VERB + OF

THINK OF*	I <b>think of</b> you most of the time. I fell for you.
DREAM OF / ABOUT	I always <b>dream of</b> winning the lottery!

APPROVE OF	His parents don't <b>approve of</b> what he does, but they can't stop him.
DISAPPROVE OF	His parents <b>disapprove of</b> what he does, but they can't stop him.
ACCUSE OF	Sue <b>accused</b> me <b>of</b> being selfish.
SUSPECT OF	Some students were <b>suspected of</b> having cheated in the exam.
CONSIST OF	We had an enormous meal. It <b>consisted of</b> seven courses.
DISPOSED OF	Unwanted items in the classroom will be <b>disposed of</b> in one week.
BOAST OF / ABOUT	He is always <b>boasting of</b> his new incredible job.
DIE OF / FROM	"What did he <b>die of</b> ?" "A heart attack."

#### VERB + FOR

THANK FOR	Thanks for helping me with my English Exam.
EXCUSE FOR	<b>Excuse</b> me <b>for</b> interrupting, but can I take a picture with you?
FORGIVE FOR	I´ll never <b>forgive</b> them <b>for</b> what they did.
PAY FOR	I didn´t have enough money to <b>pay for</b> the meal.
APOLOGISE FOR / ABOUT	When I realised I was wrong, I <b>apologised</b> (to them) <b>for</b> my advice.
APPLY FOR	You have to <b>apply for</b> the job, it's your dream job!
CRITIZE FOR	He was highly <b>critized for</b> her love affair.
BLAME FOR	Everybody <b>blamed</b> me <b>for</b> the accident. Everybody said that I was to <b>blame for</b> the accident.
LOOK FOR =(SEARCH)	"What are you <b>looking for</b> ?" "My book, I haven't seen it for a while."

SEARCH FOR	I've <b>searched</b> the house <b>for</b> my keys, but I still can't find them.
ASK (somebody) FOR	"I wrote to the company <b>asking</b> them <b>for</b> more information about the job"
WAIT FOR	Don't <b>wait for</b> me. I'll join you later.



#### VERB + TO

LEAD TO	Everything we did wrong <b>led</b> us <b>to</b> that big problem.
LOOK FORWARD TO	I <b>look forward to</b> hearing from you soon.
CONFIDE something TO	You can trust her. I <b>confide</b> several secrets <b>to</b> her, she never said a word.
COMPARE TO	If you <b>compare</b> this meal <b>to</b> what we ate yesterday, I think this trip is getting better!
LEARN* TO	I <b>learned to</b> ride when I was 8 years old.
APPEAL TO	Is this image going to <b>appeal to</b> young people?
LEND TO	I <b>lent</b> some money <b>to</b> my brother last Summer.
COMPLAIN TO (someone) ABOUT (something)	I´m going to <b>complain to</b> the manager!
LISTEN TO	Please <b>listen to</b> me. I'm trying to talk to you.
TALK/SPEAK TO	She is <b>speaking to</b> her boyfriend right now.
WRITE TO	I <b>wrote</b> this letter <b>to</b> my mother, but I don't know if she will read it. She is really busy.




EXPLAIN TO	Please, <b>explain to</b> them what is happening.

### **VERB + WITH**

ASSOCIATE WITH	These pubs have been <b>associated with</b> some suspicious activities.
COINCIDE WITH	To <b>coincide with</b> the album release – they are going to visit the city.
REACT WITH / TO	My mother failed to <b>react with</b> all the problems she had.
PROVIDE somebody WITH	The school <b>provides</b> all its students <b>with</b> books.

SUPPLY somebody WITH	The government will <b>supply</b> African people <b>with</b> more than 1000000\$
FILL something WITH	Take this saucepan and <b>fill</b> it <b>with</b> water.
COLLIDE WITH	There was an accident this morning. A bus <b>collided with</b> a car.

PREVENT FROM	I want to <b>prevent</b> you <b>from</b> going. It will be pretty hard.
BENEFIT FROM	What are the <b>benefits from</b> doing exercise every day?
REFRAIN FROM	<b>Refrain from</b> saying anything. You said enough for today.
SUFFER FROM	I've been <b>suffering from</b> acne for almost 5 years.
LEARN* FROM	We all <b>learn from</b> experience.
BORROW FROM	I <b>borrowed</b> some money <b>from</b> the bank.
PROTECT FROM	We need to <b>protect</b> this area <b>from</b> deforestation.
