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# Principal's Report

Mr. Bill Campbell - An Introduction

I have recently arrived from Tamworth where I have spent most of my life and have been enjoying my rapid induction to the beautiful world of Coomealla-Dareton, Wentworth, Buronga and Gol Gol, and venturing across to Mildura.

In recent years, I have worked across the state in a Principal School Leadership position, assisting other principals. Mostly, I worked around my substantive position, which was Principal of Peel High School in Tamworth with an enrolment of over 700 students. My journey has seen me work across a Kindergarten to Year 12 school, but mainly in the context of Year 7 to Year 12 with a combined experience of around 12 years in the Principal's role.

I have a legal background combined with teaching, so I have worked extensively with the Legal Branch of the Department of Education. Until recently, I was chairperson of the Legal Reference Group for the NSW Secondary Principal's Council. My teaching areas were originally in Legal Studies, History and English.

**Educational Interests:** - The law in education has been a long-term study, but I have also had an ongoing interest in Aboriginal Education, having worked with Aboriginal communities most of my career.

-School staffing, especially in country NSW, has been a fascinating area of growth and interest. What attracts people to country areas and what gets them to stay has captivated much of my time.

**Personal:** - I am married to Judy and we have 4 adult children. The Campbell family has been involved in farming for over 5 generations, which has translated into me being very keen in supporting the study of agriculture in schools.

### **ELEVATE EDUCATION**

Patrick from Elevate Education flew up to visit Coomealla High School on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> February, to present 3 seminars to years 10-12. Years 11 and 12 were involved in Time Management and Ace your Exams, while year 10 participated in Memory and Mnemonics. The sessions presented different ideas on how to maximise their HSC results, with skills easily implemented to save time, maintain a balanced life and how to study most effectively. From the surveys completed it was clear the students really enjoyed the sessions, and follow will ensure they are supported in the implementation of skills they believe will assist them most.

Parents and staff then enjoyed a parent seminar from 4-5pm, and although I have been to several of these sessions I still come away each time with some new ideas. Some of the concepts from this session are outlined below as I understand it was not at a convenient time for all to attend.

- The human brain has not evolved sufficiently in the last ten years for students to be able to study effectively and listen to music/check social media. Doing two things at once is ok if the work is not too demanding.
- There are two apps the students were given during the seminar which will block social media sites for certain periods of time: self control (i-phones) and focus me (android). Patrick who is studying at uni said he trialled them and uses them all the time now while studying.
- Various study spaces are effective, so students do not get tired/oppressed by their desk. The
  couch or kitchen table are great if the work does not require continuous concentration, but a
  desk in a quiet space (ie: bedroom) is important when work is high demand. Some students
  may like to visit a friend or café to discuss their work. It is important that the space assists the
  student complete their school work effectively.
- Zone of Marks work or extra work was discussed with the years 11 and 12 classes. This is
  work that is no demanded but will definitely increase the students marks in an exam. Students
  should aim for 30-45 minutes per night on extra work, and ensure each subject is included.
  Patrick suggested this work was done first, as the zone of demand work will have to be completed. Zone of marks work includes:
- notes ensure each dot point in the syllabus has sufficient notes to match
- practice exams/questions from staff or sites such as elevate education
- \* extra reading from internet sites such as HSC hub, text books such as the dot point or excel series
- Three weeks before any exams students should be preparing by
- Week I ensure all notes are completed
- Week 2 and 3 Memorising notes and practice exams (aim for 5 each subject)
- To effectively memorise notes Elevate suggest the System of review as most effective and time efficient.
- ⇒ Take notes
- $\Rightarrow$  Review immediately, reading your notes immediately after taking them, a simple task increases memory retention by 50%
- $\Rightarrow$  Review again within 24 hours (memory retention should be around 75%)
- ⇒ Review monthly
